

**CHAPTER xxxiv.**

An Act to confirm a Scheme of the Charity Commissioners for the Application or Management of the Charity of Samuel Sunderland, in the Parish of Bingley, in the West Riding of the County of York. A.D. 1892.
[20th May 1892.]

WHEREAS the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales, in their Report to Her Majesty of their proceedings during the year one thousand eight hundred and ninety-one, have reported that they have provisionally approved and certified a scheme for the charity known as Samuel Sunderland, in Bingley, in the west riding of the county of York:

And whereas it is expedient that the scheme, as the same is fully set out and defined in the schedule to this Act, should be confirmed:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. The said scheme is hereby confirmed: Provided always, that nothing in this Act or in the said scheme shall be held to interfere with the ordinary jurisdiction over endowed charities now exerciseable or hereafter to become exerciseable by the High Court of Justice and the Charity Commissioners. Confirmation of scheme.

2. This Act may be cited as the Samuel Sunderland Charity Scheme Confirmation Act, 1892. Short title.

SCHEME FOR THE APPLICATION OR MANAGEMENT OF THE CHARITY OF
SAMUEL SUNDERLAND, IN THE PARISH OF BINGLEY, IN THE WEST
RIDING OF THE COUNTY OF YORK.

Cottage
Hospital.

1. A sum of 3,000*l.* New Consols belonging to the Poor's Share of the Charity, shall be transferred in the books of "The Official Trustees of Charitable Funds" to the credit of the Cottage Hospital, founded by indenture dated 15th August 1889, and made between George Lane Fox of the first part, John Bairstow Sharp of the second part, and Charles Walter Dunlop and six others of the third part.

Allotments
Extension Act,
1882.

2. Such of the lands belonging to the Charity as are subject to the provisions of the fourth section of the Allotments Extension Act, 1882, shall be let and otherwise managed by the Trustees in conformity with the provisions of that Act. The Trustees may set apart and let in allotments in the manner prescribed by and subject to the provisions of the said Act, any other portions of the land belonging to the Charity, other than buildings and the appurtenances of buildings.

Power of

3. Notwithstanding the provisions of the Bingley School and Charity Estate Act, 1853, the Charity Commissioners may from time to time, in the exercise of their ordinary jurisdiction, establish Schemes for the application and management of the Charity.

Questions
under Scheme.

4. Any question as to the construction of this Scheme, or as to the regularity or the validity of any acts done or about to be done under this Scheme, shall be determined conclusively by the Charity Commissioners, upon such application made to them for the purpose, as they think sufficient.
