

CHAPTER lxxvi.

An Act to enable the Secretary of State for the War Department to purchase certain Lands in or near Dublin for the Improvement of the Wellington and Beggars Bush Barracks at Dublin respectively.

20th June 1892.]

Wellington and Page 11 in the purpose of enlarging the Wellington and Beggars Bush Barracks at Dublin and of making better precautions for the health and efficiency of Her Majesty's military forces that the Secretary of State for the War Department (hereinafter called the Secretary of State) should be empowered to purchase the lands hereinafter described under the provisions contained in that behalf in the Barracks Act, 1890:

And whereas plans of the lands to be purchased have been signed in duplicate by the Honourable William St. John Fremantle Brodrick, the Chairman of the Committee of the House of Commons, to whom the Bill for this Act was referred, and one copy of such plans has been deposited in the Private Bill Office of the House of Commons and the other copy with the Town Clerk of the City of Dublin:

And whereas the Secretary of State has, with reference to the purchase of the said lands, caused such notices to be served and such local inquiries to be held as are required by the provisions of the Barracks Act, 1890, and after those inquiries he is satisfied that the lands should be taken:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—-

1. The Secretary of State may purchase under the provisions contained in the Barracks Act, 1890, and the Acts incorporated therewith, the following lands, namely:—

- (a.) For the improvement of the Wellington Barracks at Dublin, the lands situate in Wellington Place, West, in the parish of St. Catherine and the City of Dublin, which are delineated on the plan marked A., signed by the Chairman of the Committee as aforesaid, and thereon coloured red and numbered 1, 2, and 3 respectively, containing on the whole one acre, one rood, and thirty-four perches or thereabouts; and
- (b.) For the improvement of the Beggars Bush Barracks at Dublin, all or any of the lands situate in the parish of St. Peter, in the county of Dublin (being part of the lands of Baggotrath East); which are delineated on the plan marked B., signed by the Chairman of the Committee as aforesaid, and thereon coloured red, containing on the whole three acres and twenty-eight and one quarter perches or thereabouts.

Short title.

2. This Act may be cited as the Dublin Barracks Improvement Act, 1892.
