

CHAPTER cv.

An Act to confirm an Order made by the Secretary for Scotland under the Sea Fisheries Act, 1868, relating to a several Oyster and Mussel Fishery at Loch Creran, [29th June 1893.] Argyllshire.

TATHEREAS an Order made by the Secretary for Scotland under the Sea Fisheries Act, 1868, is not of any validity or force 31 & 32 Vict. whatever until the confirmation thereof by Act of Parliament:

And whereas it is expedient that the Order made by the Secretary for Scotland under the said Act, and set out in the schedule to this Act, be confirmed by Act of Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

- 1. The Order set out in the schedule to this Act shall be and the of Order in same is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof in manner and form as they are set out in the said schedule shall, from and after the passing of this Act, have full validity and force.
- 2. This Act may be cited as the Oyster and Mussel Fishery Short title. (Loch Creran) Order Confirmation Act, 1893.

SCHEDULE.

ORDER for Establishment and Maintenance by Mrs. Margaret Ogilvie, of Barcaldine, of a several Oyster and Mussel FISHERY at LOCH CRERAN, in the County of Argyll.

Undertakers.

1. Mrs. Margaret Martin or Ogilvie, widow of Mr. Alexander Ogilvie, proprietrix of Barcaldine, in the county of Argyll, her heirs and assignees, shall be the Undertakers of the fishery mentioned in this Order, and are hereinafter referred to as the Undertakers.

Entry upon ands described in plans.

2. For the purposes of the fishery and works authorised by this Order, the Undertakers may from time to time enter on, take, and use all or any part of the lands described in the plans deposited for the purposes of this Order.

Incorporation of Lands Clauses Acts.

Limits of fishery.

- 3. The Lands Clauses Acts are hereby incorporated with this Order.
- 4. The following are the fishery grounds of the Undertakers under this Order (as shown in plans deposited at the Fishery Board for Scotland), namely:—All those parts of the shore and bed of the sea between low-water mark and the middle of Loch Creran ex adverso of the lands of Barcaldine and Dallachulish, belonging or reputed to belong to the said Mrs. Margaret Martin or Ogilvie, situated within the parish of Ardchattan and Muckairn, in the county of Argyll, and bounded as follows: on the west, by the stream known as Ferlochan Burn, and on the east, by the stream known as the River Buie or Buidh.

Right to fishery.

5. This Order confers on the Undertakers a right of a several oyster and mussel fishery within the limits above mentioned.

Marking of limits.

6. The limits of the said several fishery shall be marked out or buoyed as the Board of Trade may from time to time prescribe.

Replacement of marks.

7. In the event of the marks by the last foregoing article prescribed being obliterated by storm or otherwise, they shall be replaced by the Undertakers.

Works not to be commenced without assent of Fishery Board and of Board of Trade.

8. No buildings, erections, embankments, or works, other than the marks mentioned in Article 6 of this Order, shall at any time be commenced or executed within the limits above described without the previous sanction and approval in writing of the Fishery Board for Scotland and of the Board of Trade.

Undertakers to render accounts.

9. The Undertakers shall render to the Fishery Board for Scotland such accounts of expenditure and income in connexion with said several fishery, and of all oysters and mussels sold by them, in such form and at such times as the Board may require, and shall allow the Board or any person

appointed by them to inspect the fishery, and all books and documents in their possession relating thereto, and shall give to such Board or person all such information relating thereto as they or he may require.

10. This Order shall continue in operation for sixty years from its confirmation and no longer.

Duration of Order.

11. This Order shall not be taken as a consent to the surrender of any rights, interests, powers, authorities, or privileges transferred to the management of the Board of Trade by the Crown Lands Act, 1866.

Saving of rights under Crown Lands Act, 1866.

12. This Order may be cited as the Loch Creran Fishery Order, 1891.
