CHAPTER cxxi.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board for Ireland under the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, relating to the Town of Granard.

A.D. 1893.

[29th June 1893.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland have made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—-

1. The Order set out in the schedule hereto is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force.

2. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board Short title. (Ireland) Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1893.

PROVISIONAL ORDER.

c. 103,

WHEREAS there are in the town of Granard, in the county of Longford, 17 & 18 Vict. Town Commissioners under the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act, 1854:

> And whereas the population of the said town, according to the last parliamentary census, is less than six thousand, and the said town is situate within and forms part of the rural sanitary district consisting of the Granard poor law union:

41 & 42 Vict. c. 52.

And whereas the said Town Commissioners have presented a petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland (herein-after called the Local Government Board) in pursuance of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, section seven, praying that the said town may be separated from the said rural sanitary district and constituted an urban sanitary district:

And whereas all advertisements and notices required by the said Act having been previously duly published, served, and given, the Local Government Board have caused a local inquiry to be made as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said petition, and it appears to the Local Government Board to be proper to assent thereto; and it also appears to the said Board that provision should be made for the discharge by the Town Commissioners of the balance remaining due of the mortgage debt herein-after mentioned contracted by the guardians of the poor of the Granard union for the construction of sewers within and for the use of the said town:

And whereas by a deed of mortgage, dated the twenty-ninth April one thousand eight hundred and eighty, from the said guardians to the Commissioners of Public Works in Ireland, the guardians mortgaged the rates of the district described in the said mortgage to secure repayment of a sum of eight hundred and sixty pounds, lent by the said Commissioners to the said guardians for the purposes of the construction of the said sewers, which said sum of eight hundred and sixty pounds, with interest thereon at the rate of one pound per centum per annum, was, by the said mortgage, made repayable in sixty halfyearly instalments, to be calculated in the manner thereby provided, and payable on each first day of May and first day of November until the said principal sum and the interest thereon should be discharged.

It is ordered by the Local Government Board as follows:—

1. From and after the confirmation of this Order by Parliament, the town of Granard shall be separated from the rural sanitary district consisting of the Granard poor law union, and shall be constituted an urban sanitary district, subject to the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, and of all other Acts affecting urban sanitary districts.

Constitution of urban sanitary district... 41 & 42 Vict. c, 52,

2. The Town Commissioners of Granard, acting as the urban sanitary authority of the said district, shall, on the first day of May and first day of November in each year after this Order is confirmed, out of and by means of the rates leviable by them, pay to the guardians of the poor of the Granard union the amount of the half-yearly instalment of the said the Board of mortgage debt of eight hundred and sixty pounds and interest, which on such day shall be payable by the guardians to the said Commissioners of Public Works, and the guardians shall apply the sum so paid to them in discharge and satisfaction of such instalments and interest accordingly, and in relief of the rates leviable on the district mentioned and described in the said mortgage of the twenty-ninth April one thousand eight hundred and eighty; provided that the amount to be paid by the Town Commissioners to the guardians on whichever of the said days shall occur first after the date of the confirmation of this Order, shall be an apportioned part only of the whole amount of the half-yearly instalment payable on such day, calculated in proportion to the time which shall intervene between the confirmation of this Order and such day of payment.

A.D. 1893. Granard. Provision for payment of mortgage to Works.

3. This Order shall not in any way affect or impair the security of the said Commissioners of Public Works under the said mortgage of the twentyninth April one thousand eight hundred and eighty, nor the right or power of the said Commissioners to enforce payment of the said mortgage debt and any instalment thereof, and interest that may at any time hereafter be due and owing, out of and by means of the rates mentioned in and secured by the said mortgage, nor the power of the said guardians to make or levy rates on the district mentioned in the said mortgage, for the purpose of raising the amount of such instalment and interest, and paying the same to the said Commissioners of Public Works.

The charge of the Board of Works not to be affected or impaired.

4. All costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the application for, preparing, obtaining, and confirming this Order, and otherwise in relation Order. thereto, shall be paid by the Town Commissioners as the urban sanitary authority of the urban sanitary district constituted by this Order.

5. This Order may be cited and referred to for all purposes as the Granard Town Provisional Order, 1893.
