



CHAPTER cxxvii.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Urban Sanitary Districts of Bradford (Yorks), Buckingham (two), Clitheroe, Dewsbury, Hastings, Lancaster, and Mountain Ash, and to the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Hunslet and Ludlow Unions. A.D. 1893.
[27th July 1893.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875 :

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provisions herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force. Orders in schedule confirmed.

2. The sanitary authorities mentioned in the Orders for the compulsory purchase of lands relating to the Urban Sanitary Districts of Bradford (Yorks), Buckingham, Clitheroe, Hastings, and Mountain Ash, and to the Rural Sanitary Districts of the Hunslet and Ludlow Unions hereby confirmed, shall not purchase or acquire, either compulsorily or by agreement, in any city, borough, or other urban sanitary district, or in any parish or part of a parish not being within an urban sanitary district, ten or more houses included in the schedules to those Orders which on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or

Restriction of power to take houses of labouring class.

A.D. 1893. lodgers, or except with the consent of the Local Government Board ten or more houses which were not so occupied on the said fifteenth day of December, but have been or shall be subsequently so occupied.

Special provisions as to Dewsbury and Lancaster.

3. The following provisions shall apply to the urban sanitary authority for each of the urban sanitary districts of Dewsbury and Lancaster:—

(1.) The urban sanitary authority shall not purchase or acquire, either compulsorily or by agreement, in their district ten or more houses included in the schedule to the Order relating to the district hereby confirmed, which after the passing of this Act have been, or on the fifteenth day of December last were, occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers, unless and until—

(a.) They shall have obtained the approval of the Local Government Board to a scheme for providing new dwellings for such number of persons as were residing in such houses on the fifteenth day of December last, or for such number of persons as the Local Government Board shall, after inquiry, deem necessary, having regard to the number of persons on or after that date residing in such houses and working within one mile therefrom, and to the amount of vacant suitable accommodation in the immediate neighbourhood of such houses, or to the place of employment of such persons, and to all the circumstances of the case; and

(b.) They shall have given security to the satisfaction of the Local Government Board for the carrying out of the scheme.

(2.) The approval of the Local Government Board to any scheme under this section may be given either absolutely or conditionally, and after the Local Government Board have approved of any such scheme they may from time to time approve either absolutely or conditionally of any modifications in the scheme.

(3.) Every scheme under this section shall contain provisions prescribing the time within which it shall be carried out, and shall require the new dwellings proposed to be provided under the scheme to be completed fit for occupation before the persons residing in the houses in respect of which the scheme is made are displaced:

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Provided that the Local Government Board may dispense with the last-mentioned requirement, subject to such conditions, if any, as they may see fit.

(4.) Any provisions of any scheme under this section, or any conditions subject to which the Local Government Board may have approved of any scheme, or of any modifications of any scheme under this section, or subject to which they may have dispensed with the above-mentioned requirement, shall be enforceable by writ of mandamus to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of the High Court.

(5.) If the sanitary authority acquire or appropriate any house or houses for the purposes of this Act or of the Order hereby confirmed in contravention of the foregoing provisions, or displace or cause to be displaced the persons residing in any house or houses in contravention of the requirements of the scheme, they shall be liable to a penalty of five hundred pounds in respect of every such house, which penalty shall be recoverable by the Local Government Board by action in the High Court, and shall be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom :

Provided that the Court may, if it think fit, reduce such penalty.

(6.) Subject to the provisions of this section, the sanitary authority and the Local Government Board and their inspectors shall have and may exercise for any purpose in connexion with any scheme under this section all or any of the powers vested in them under the Public Health Act, 1875, in the same manner in every respect as if the preparation and carrying into effect of such scheme were one of the general purposes of that Act :

Provided that all lands on which any buildings have been erected or provided by the sanitary authority in pursuance of any scheme under this section shall, for a period of twenty-five years from the date of the scheme, be appropriated for the purpose of dwellings, and every conveyance, demise, or lease of such lands and buildings shall be endorsed with notice of this enactment :

Provided also that the Local Government Board may at any time dispense with all or any of the requirements of this subsection, subject to such conditions, if any, as they may see fit.

(7.) The sanitary authority shall pay to the Local Government Board a sum to be fixed by that Board in respect of the preparation and issue of any Provisional Order in pursuance of this

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section, and any expenses incurred by that Board in relation to any inquiries under this section, including the expenses of any witnesses summoned by the inspector holding the inquiry, and a sum to be fixed by that Board, not exceeding three guineas a day, for the services of such inspector.

Definition
of labouring
class.

4. For the purposes of sections two and three of this Act the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics, artizans, labourers, and others working for wages, hawkers, costermongers, persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family, and persons, other than domestic servants, whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week, and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

Short title.

5. This Act may be cited as the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 6) Act, 1893.

after referred to as "the Corporation"), require to purchase and take the lands
described in the Schedule hereto for the following purposes ; viz.,—

1. The lands mentioned in Part I. of the said Schedule for the construction
of a new street from Bolton Road to Otley Road, in the Borough ;
2. The lands mentioned in Part II. of the said Schedule for the purpose of
widening and improving Thornton Road, in the Borough ;
3. The lands mentioned in Part III. of the said Schedule for the purpose of
widening and improving Bradford Lane, in the Borough ;
4. The land mentioned in Part IV. of the said Schedule for the purpose of
widening and improving Cottingley Road, in the Borough ;
5. The lands mentioned in Part V. of the said Schedule for the construction
of works for the purification of the sewage of the Borough :

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers
given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other
Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the Corporation, from and after the
date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with
reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the con-
tinuance of any existing public rights of highway until the same are otherwise
dealt with in pursuance of the Highway Acts, and for the purposes aforesaid,
the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of
lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them :

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Provided that if the Corporation shall acquire any portion of the land
numbered 32 on the deposited plans and described in Part IV. of the Schedule
hereto, nothing herein contained shall authorise the Corporation to remove any
body, or the remains of any body, interred therein, without such license as is
required by law in that behalf.
