



CHAPTER cxxxiv.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board for Ireland under the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, relating to the Union of Fermoy. A.D. 1893.

[27th July 1893.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board for Ireland have made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereto, under the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878 :

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be confirmed by Parliament :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :—

1. The Order set out in the schedule hereto is hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force.

KILCRUMPER BURIAL GROUND.

PROVISIONAL ORDER.

WHEREAS the Guardians of the Poor of the Fermoy Union (herein-after called the Burial Board) are the Burial Board of the rural sanitary district consisting of the said union, except the town of Fermoy, and have determined at a special meeting convened in pursuance of the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, that additions should be made to the existing burial ground situated at Kilcrumper (otherwise Lisnasallagh), in the parish of Kilcrumper, in the said rural sanitary district, which said existing burial ground is not attached or contiguous to any church or chapel or place of worship actually used for divine worship, and is not situated in any private demesne :

And whereas the Burial Board have presented a petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland (herein-after called the Local Government Board), praying that they may be allowed to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, with reference to the lands and premises required for the additions aforesaid :

And whereas the Burial Board have deposited at the office of the Local Government Board in Dublin plans and a book of reference (herein-after called the deposited plans and book of reference) showing the said lands and premises; and all notices and advertisements required by the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878, having been previously duly published, served, and given, the Local Government Board have caused a local inquiry to be made as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the said petition, and it appears to the Local Government Board to be proper to assent thereto :

It is ordered by the Local Government Board as follows :—

1. From and after the confirmation of this order by Parliament, the Burial Board shall be empowered to put in force the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, with reference to that part of the townland of Kilcrumper, in the parish of Kilcrumper, in the barony of Fermoy and county Cork, containing two statute acres, adjoining the existing burial ground situate at Kilcrumper, and shown and described in the deposited plans and book of reference.

2. No addition to the said burial ground shall be made within three hundred yards of any house of the annual value of fifty pounds, or of any garden or pleasure ground occupied therewith, except with the consent of the owner, lessee, and occupier thereof in writing. *Fermoy.* Provision as to dwelling-houses.
3. The powers of compulsory purchase given by this Order shall not be exercised after the expiration of three years from the confirmation of this Order. Duration of compulsory powers.
4. All costs, charges, and expenses of and incidental to the application for, obtaining and confirming this Order shall be paid by the Burial Board in the manner provided by Section 234 of the Public Health (Ireland) Act, 1878. Expenses of Order. 41 & 42 Vict. c. 52.
5. This Order may be cited and referred to for all purposes as the Kilcrumper Burial Ground Provisional Order, 1893. Short title of Order.
