# CHAPTER ccxxix.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local A.D. 1893. Government Board relating to the Urban Sanitary Districts of Carshalton, Festiniog, Macclesfield, Northampton, Ossett, and Richmond (Surrey), and to the Rural Sanitary District of the Wakefield Union.

[12th September 1893.]

HEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Public Health Act, 1875:

38 & 39 Viet.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament, and that the provision herein contained should be enacted with reference thereto:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:—

1. The Orders as altered and set out in the schedule hereto shall Orders in schedule be and the same are hereby confirmed, and all the provisions thereof confirmed. shall have full validity and force.

2. The Sanitary Authorities mentioned in the said Orders respectively shall not purchase or acquire, either compulsorily or by agreement, in any city, borough, or other urban sanitary district, or in any parish or part of a parish not being within an urban sanitary district, ten or more houses included in the schedules to those Orders which on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers, or, except with the consent of the Local Government Board, ten or more houses which were not so occupied on the said fifteenth day of December, but have been or shall be subsequently so occupied.

Provisional Order to enable the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Carshalton to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Acts.

To the Carshalton Local Board, being the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Carshalton, in the County of Surrey; -

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Carshalton Local Board, as the Sanitary Authority for the Urban Sanitary District of Carshalton, in the County of Surrey, require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto for the disposal of the sewage of their District, and for providing access to such lands:

Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other 38 & 39 Vict. Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the Carshalton Local Board, from c. 55. and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, subject to the continuance of any existing public rights of highway, and for the purposes aforesaid, the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them:

Provided that in making use of the said lands (herein referred to as "the sewage lands") the Carshalton Local Board shall be subject to the following conditions:—

- 1. Sewage brought to the sewage lands shall be discharged into and passed through a tank or tanks, and shall be treated by subsidence and filtration through coke or other suitable material, so that fæcal suspended matter shall be removed before such sewage is permitted to pass from such tank or tanks over the sewage lands.
- 2. The owners of any lands adjoining the sewage lands, or their agents, duly authorised in writing, shall have access at all reasonable times to the tank or tanks provided as aforesaid for the purpose of inspecting the process of subsidence and filtration carried on therein.
- 3. Any main sewer to be constructed for conveying the sewage from the said district to the sewage lands shall be so constructed as that no part thereof shall have a less rate of inclination than 1 in 800:

Provided also that the Carshalton Local Board will use their best endeavours to obtain all authorities and powers necessary to enable them to discharge the

effluent from the sewage lands into the main stream of the River Wandle at the bridge carrying the Sutton Road over the same, or at some point between that bridge and the mill known as Ashby's Flour Mill, situate immediately above that bridge; and if such authorities and powers are obtained will construct the necessary sewer or pipe and works, and will at all times so discharge the said effluent. If the Local Board obtain the necessary authorities and powers and provide for the effluent in the manner above specified, no compensation shall be payable to the owner for the time being of the Ravensbury Park Estate in respect of any injurious affection by reason of anything lawfully done in carrying out the purposes of this Order.

Provisional Order to enable the Urban Sanitary Authority for the Borough of Macclesfield to put in force the Compulsory Clauses of the Lands Clauses Acts.

To the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Macclesfield, being the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough; —

And to all others whom it may concern.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Macclesfield, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough (herein-after referred to as "the Urban Authority"), require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto for the disposal of the sewage of the said Borough:

38 & 39 Vict. c. 55. Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the Urban Authority, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto (herein-after referred to as "the said lands"), subject to the continuance of any existing public rights of highway, and for the purpose aforesaid, the powers of the Lands Clauses. Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them, subject as follows:

54 & 55 Viet. c. elsxxix. Article I.—Until the expiration of the period for compulsory purchase fixed by the Lancashire, Derbyshire, and East Coast Railway Act, 1891, nothing in this Order contained shall extend, except with the consent of the Lancashire, Derbyshire, and East Coast Railway Company, to enable the Urban Authority to purchase otherwise than by agreement any part of the said lands which that Company may have powers to purchase under the provisions of that Act.

- (2.) The owners of any land adjoining the said lands, or their agents, duly authorised in writing, shall have access at all reasonable times to the tank or tanks provided as aforesaid, for the purpose of inspecting the process of subsidence and filtration carried on therein.

Article IV.—Before any buildings are erected on the said lands, plans and elevations of such buildings shall be deposited in the office of the town clerk of Macclesfield, and notice in writing shall be given by the Urban Authority to the owners and occupiers of Adlington Hall, and Mottram Hall, and Bonis Hall, of such plans being ready for their inspection, and if any of such owners or occupiers shall, within thirty days after receipt of such notice, give the Urban Authority notice that such buildings are in their opinion objectionable, then such buildings shall not be erected, unless with the approval of the Local Government Board, after a local inquiry at which the objecting owner or occupier shall have the right to be heard.

Article V.—All rights of sporting, fishing, and other like rights over, upon, or in any lands or waters to be acquired under this Order shall be reserved to and vest in the owner or owners for the time being of Adlington Hall, in as full a manner as they are now entitled thereto, including free right of access, egress, and regress to, from, and over such lands and waters at all times for the exercise of such respective rights. Such rights shall not be exercised except by the owner or occupier for the time being of Adlington Hall, or his or her friends and servants, and such rights shall be so exercised as not to injure or interfere with any works of the Urban Authority, or the use or management of the said lands.

WHEREAS the Mayor, Aldermen, and Burgesses of the Borough of Northampton, as the Urban Sanitary Authority for that Borough, require to purchase and take the lands described in the Schedule hereto for the disposal of the sewage of the said Borough:

38 & 39 Vict. c. 55. Now therefore, We, the Local Government Board, in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act, 1875, and by any other Statutes in that behalf, do hereby empower the said Urban Sanitary Authority, from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order, to put in force, with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto, and for the purpose aforesaid, the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement, or any of them, subject to the following conditions:—

- (1.) The said Urban Sanitary Authority shall not enter upon or take otherwise than by agreement the lands coloured red on the plan signed by the Honourable Alan de Tatton Egerton, the Chairman of the Committee of the House of Commons to whom the Bill for the Act confirming this Order was referred;
- (2.) If the said Urban Sanitary Authority shall in pursuance of this Order give notice to the owner or owners for the time being of Ecton House to take any part of the lands coloured green on the said plan, they shall be bound, if so required by the said owner or owners by notice in writing within twenty-one days after the receipt of the said first-mentioned notice, to take also the whole of the lands coloured purple on the said plan;
- (3.) No sewage shall be permitted to pass over the lands coloured brown on the said plan or over the lands to be acquired under this Order until the fæcal suspended matter shall have been removed by passing the sewage through a tank or tanks and treating the same by subsidence and filtration through coke or other suitable material;
- (4.) The owners of any lands adjoining the said lands, or their agents duly authorised in writing, shall have access at all reasonable times to the tank or tanks provided as aforesaid for the purpose of inspecting the process of subsidence and filtration carried on therein, and of taking samples;
- (5.) The rights of sporting over the lands to be acquired under this Order and over the lands coloured brown on the said plan shall, subject to tenancies existing at the date of this Order, be reserved to and vest in the owner or owners, occupier or occupiers, for the time being of Ecton House, together with free right of access and egress to, from, and over such lands at all reasonable times for the exercise of such sporting rights. Such rights shall not be assigned, demised, or otherwise disposed of or parted

with wholly or partially to any person except the occupier for the time being of Ecton House: Provided that such rights shall be so exercised as not to injure or interfere with the works of the Urban Sanitary Authority or the use and management of the said lands. A.D. 1893.

For protection of the Great Northern and London and North Western Railway Companies.

Article I.—(a.) Any mains or pipes to be laid down by the Rural Authority in the execution of the purposes of this Order on or in any way affecting any bridges, railway, lands, or works, mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, belonging to the Great Northern Railway Company, or to the London and North Western Railway Company, shall be laid down under the superintendence and to the reasonable satisfaction of the principal engineer for the time being of the company affected, and according to plans to be reasonably approved by him, but in all things at the expense of the Rural Authority, and so as to cause no injury to any such bridges, railway, lands, or works, or interruption to the passage or conduct of traffic over any such railway, and if in consequence of the laying of such mains or pipes any injury be caused to any such bridges, railway, lands, or works, or any interruption be caused to such traffic, the Rural Authority shall make full compensation to the company affected thereby in respect of such injury or interruption.

(b.) If any difference arises between the Rural Authority and the Great Northern Railway Company, or the London and North Western Railway Company, as to the mode of laying down, repairing, altering, or enlarging their

mains, pipes, or other works in, over, or upon, such bridges, railway, lands, or works, or the facilities to be afforded for the same, such difference shall be settled by an engineer or other fit person to be appointed by the Board of Trade at the request of either party.

- (c.) In case it shall be necessary in the construction of the works of the Rural Authority to temporarily enter upon or break up any portion of the said lands coloured red they shall be at liberty to do so under the superintendence and to the reasonable satisfaction of the said Henry Rofe or other the principal engineer for the time being of the Corporation (in this article called the "principal engineer");
- (D.) In case it shall be necessary for the Rural Authority to carry any water main or pipe across any aqueduct line of pipes or other works of the Corporation within the said lands coloured red, the Rural Authority shall in every such case be at liberty to carry such main or pipe under or over the aqueduct line of pipes or other works of the Corporation subject and according to the provisions of paragraphs (E) and (G) of this article;

(E) Any mains or pipes to be laid down by the Rural Authority under the provisions of paragraph (D) of this Article shall be laid down under the superintendence and to the reasonable satisfaction of the principal engineer and according to plans and sections to be reasonably approved by him;

- (F.) The Rural Authority shall not cause any injury to the said aqueduct line of pipes or other works of the Corporation, and should any such injury be caused or should any interruption be caused to the flow of water through the said aqueduct or line of pipes (without the previous consent of the Corporation or the principal engineer), the Rural Authority shall make full compensation to the Corporation in respect of such injury or interruption. The Rural Authority shall make compensation for the use by them of any of the lands coloured red on the said plan, and shall also repay to the Corporation the costs which they may reasonably be put to under the provisions of this article.
- (c.) If any difference arise between the Rural Authority and the Corporation under this article such difference shall be settled by an engineer to be appointed (unless otherwise agreed on) by the Board of Trade on the application of either of the parties in difference.
