



CHAPTER ci.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the A.D. 1896.
Local Government Board relating to Axbridge Basford
Bath Cambridge Carlisle Hanwell Richmond (Surrey)
Southall-Norwood Stocksbridge Waltham-Holy-Cross
and Woking. [20th July 1896.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the
Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under
the provisions of the Public Health Act 1875 :

c. 55.

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be
confirmed by Parliament and that the provisions herein contained
should be enacted with reference thereto :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty
by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and
Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled
and by the authority of the same as follows :—

1. The Orders as altered and set out in the schedule hereto shall
be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions
thereof shall subject to the provisions of this Act have full validity
and force. Orders

2. Whereas the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (herein-after re-
ferred to as "the Commissioners") are or claim to be the owners
of all the mines beds and seams of coal and other minerals and
mineral substances lying in and under about one thousand two
hundred and thirteen acres of land in the parish of Kirkby-ir-
Ashfield in the county of Nottingham (forming glebe lands of the
rectory of the said parish and herein-after referred to as "the
glebe") with the exception of all mines minerals mineral and
other substances whatsoever upon or within a depth of twenty feet

A.D. 1896. under the surface of part of the glebe and also have or claim certain rights of user over and upon the said surface :

And whereas the Basford Rural District Council (herein-after referred to as "the council") have sunk a well or shaft upon the glebe down through the said property of or claimed to belong to the Commissioners to a depth of about ninety feet from the surface and have erected an engine house and certain buildings and constructed certain works on the surface and have driven certain headings in the property of the Commissioners for the purpose of obtaining a supply of water :

The following provisions for the protection of the Commissioners notwithstanding anything in this Act or the Basford (Selston) Order 1896 confirmed thereby shall apply :—

(1.) The Commissioners shall sell and grant and the council shall buy an easement or right to sink construct and maintain one or more shafts or wells in and through the property of the Commissioners upon and under that portion of the glebe described in the schedule to the Basford (Selston) Order 1896 and numbered one on the deposited plans for that Order in the said parish of Kirkby-in-Ashfield and to construct and maintain headings in connexion with the said shaft or shafts well or wells and to lay pipes in and through the property of the Commissioners upon and under the said portion of the glebe such shaft or shafts well or wells and such headings or any works not in any case to exceed the depth of ninety feet below the level of the floor of the said engine house herein-before mentioned and to pump and take water there through and therefrom And the council shall not otherwise than by agreement acquire any other or greater rights powers or privileges in or through the said property of the Commissioners than such easement or right as aforesaid.

(2.) The council shall within three months after the date of the passing of this Act pay to the Commissioners the sum of one hundred pounds as the price of the said easement or right but such sum or price shall include the price for confirming all easements to be granted by the Reverend Thomas Woodman the rector of the said parish of Kirkby-in-Ashfield under an agreement dated the nineteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six and made between the said rector and the council.

- (3.) The council shall supply water to the Commissioners from the said well and other works constructed or to be constructed on or in the said portion of the glebe and numbered one as aforesaid at all times and in such quantities as the Commissioners may require for any purpose or purposes in connexion with the working or winning of their minerals in and under the glebe or for the manufacturing or in any way dealing with the same either by themselves or their lessees and for any purposes of their workmen or tenants or other persons employed in the winning working or manufacturing or otherwise dealing with the said minerals and dwelling or residing on the glebe.
- (4.) For the purpose of obtaining such supply of water as aforesaid the Commissioners shall be entitled at any time and from time to time at their own expense to lay down a main not to exceed three inches in diameter and to connect the same with the mains and pipes of the council at any place which shall in the opinion of the Commissioners be the most suitable where the said mains and pipes of the council are laid over through or under the glebe Any connexion as aforesaid to be made and maintained to the reasonable satisfaction of the engineer of the council.
- (5.) The council shall at all times unless prevented by frost necessary repairs unusual drought accident or any unavoidable cause keep their mains and pipes where the main or pipe of the Commissioners connects therewith fully charged or filled with water and shall maintain the same in good order so as to ensure a constant and ample flow of water to the Commissioners main or pipe but nevertheless the Commissioners shall have no priority of supply over the inhabitants in the parish of Selston or over the persons having the benefit of the provisions contained in the following instruments that is to say an agreement dated the eighteenth day of October one thousand eight hundred and ninety-four made between the guardians of the poor of the Basford Union in the counties of Nottingham and Derby acting as the rural sanitary authority (now the council) of the one part and the Newstead Colliery Company Limited of the other part an indenture dated the twenty-fifth day of November one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five made between the most noble William John Arthur Charles James Duke of Portland of the first part Arthur John Greville and Edward Horsman

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Bailey of the second part and the council of the third part and an agreement dated the nineteenth day of May one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six made between the Reverend Thomas Woodman of the one part and the council of the other part The council may nevertheless supply water by agreement to any person if and so long as such supply do not prevent the council from giving a full and efficient supply for domestic purposes within their limits of supply and do not interfere with the fulfilment by the council of the engagements entered into by them under this section and the agreements herein-before referred to respectively.

- (6.) The council shall at the expense of the Commissioners provide and erect and at all times properly maintain in a good state of repair a suitable meter for the purpose of measuring the quantity of water supplied to the Commissioners and such meter shall be erected at or near the point where the main or pipe of the Commissioners connects with the mains or pipes of the council but the Commissioners shall not be required to pay to the council more than the actual cost incurred by the council in providing erecting and maintaining the said meter or any substituted one The Commissioners shall be entitled to have a key to the said meter and to have at all reasonable times access thereto And the council shall give them written notice of the days and hours when the register of the said meter is from time to time to be taken.
- (7.) The Commissioners shall pay to the council after the rate of sixpence for every one thousand gallons of water supplied as aforesaid as indicated by the meter register the quantity so supplied to be ascertained quarterly.
- (8.) The Commissioners shall be entitled at all reasonable times after giving three days written notice of their intention so to do under their seal or under the hand of their agent to enter upon and examine and inspect the pumping station and the well or wells shaft or shafts and the works connected therewith situate within the boundary of the said property numbered one on the said deposited plans for the purposes of ascertaining that the council are not extending or have not at any time extended those works or otherwise encroached upon the property of the Commissioners further than they are authorised to do by this section.
- (9.) The Commissioners shall at their own expense be entitled from time to time to the reasonable satisfaction of the council

to shift or alter the position of the mains and pipes of the council where the same are laid over under or through the glebe. A.D. 1896.

3. The district councils mentioned in the Orders relating to the districts of Axbridge Basford Cambridge Hanwell Richmond (Surrey) Southall-Norwood Stocksbridge and Woking hereby confirmed shall not purchase or acquire either compulsorily or by agreement ten or more houses which on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers or except with the consent of the Local Government Board ten or more houses which were not so occupied on the said fifteenth day of December but have been or shall be subsequently so occupied. Restriction of power to take houses of labouring class.

4. The following provisions shall apply to the urban sanitary authority for the city of Bath and the urban district councils of Carlisle and Waltham-Holy-Cross (each of which authorities is herein-after referred to as "the authority") :— Special provisions as to Bath Carlisle Waltham-Holy-Cross.

(1.) The authority shall not under the powers of the Order relating to the authority hereby confirmed purchase or acquire either compulsorily or by agreement ten or more houses which after the passing of this Act have been or on the fifteenth day of December last were occupied either wholly or partially by persons belonging to the labouring class as tenants or lodgers unless and until—

(a.) They shall have obtained the approval of the Local Government Board to a scheme for providing new dwellings for such number of persons as were residing in such houses on the fifteenth day of December last or for such number of persons as the Local Government Board shall after inquiry deem necessary having regard to the number of persons on or after that date residing in such houses and working within one mile therefrom and to the amount of vacant suitable accommodation in the immediate neighbourhood of such houses or to the place of employment of such persons and to all the circumstances of the case; and

(b.) They shall have given security to the satisfaction of the Local Government Board for the carrying out of the scheme.

(2.) The approval of the Local Government Board to any scheme under this section may be given either absolutely or conditionally and after the Local Government Board have approved

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of any such scheme they may from time to time approve either absolutely or conditionally of any modifications in the scheme.

- (3.) Every scheme under this section shall contain provisions prescribing the time within which it shall be carried out and shall require the new dwellings proposed to be provided under the scheme to be completed fit for occupation before the persons residing in the houses in respect of which the scheme is made are displaced :

Provided that the Local Government Board may dispense with the last-mentioned requirement subject to such conditions if any as they may see fit.

- (4.) Any provisions of any scheme under this section or any conditions subject to which the Local Government Board may have approved of any scheme or of any modifications of any scheme under this section or subject to which they may have dispensed with the above-mentioned requirement shall be enforceable by writ of mandamus to be obtained by the Local Government Board out of the High Court.

- (5.) If the authority acquire or appropriate any house or houses for the purposes of this Act or of the Order relating to the authority hereby confirmed in contravention of the foregoing provisions or displace or cause to be displaced the persons residing in any house or houses in contravention of the requirements of the scheme they shall be liable to a penalty of five hundred pounds in respect of every such house which penalty shall be recoverable by the Local Government Board by action in the High Court and shall be carried to and form part of the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom :

Provided that the Court may if it think fit reduce such penalty.

- (6.) Subject to the provisions of this section the authority and the Local Government Board and their inspectors shall have and may exercise for any purpose in connexion with any scheme under this section all or any of the powers vested in them under the Public Health Act 1875 in the same manner in every respect as if the preparation and carrying into effect of such scheme were one of the general purposes of that Act :

Provided that all lands on which any buildings have been erected or provided by the authority in pursuance of any scheme under this section shall for a period of twenty-five

years from the date of the scheme be appropriated for the purpose of dwellings and every conveyance demise or lease of such lands and buildings shall be endorsed with notice of this enactment:

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—

Provided also that the Local Government Board may at any time dispense with all or any of the requirements of this subsection subject to such conditions if any as they may see fit.

(7.) The authority shall pay to the Local Government Board a sum to be fixed by that Board in respect of the preparation and issue of any Provisional Order in pursuance of this section and any expenses incurred by that Board in relation to any inquiries under this section including the expenses of any witnesses summoned by the inspector holding the inquiry and a sum to be fixed by that Board not exceeding three guineas a day for the services of such inspector.

5. For the purposes of sections three and four of this Act the expression "labouring class" includes mechanics artizans labourers and others working for wages hawkers costermongers persons not working for wages but working at some trade or handicraft without employing others except members of their own family and persons other than domestic servants whose income does not exceed an average of thirty shillings a week and the families of any of such persons who may be residing with them.

The Rural District Council shall be empowered to put in force with reference to the lands described in the Schedule hereto subject to the continuance of any existing public rights of highway and for the purposes aforesaid the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement or any of them.

Art. II. This Order may be cited as the Axbridge (Rural) Order 1896.
