CHAPTER lxxxvii.

An Act to confirm a Provisional Order made by the A.D. 1896.

Local Government Board for Ireland under the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 relating to the Town of Portrush.

[2nd July 1896.]

WHEREAS the Local Govérnment Board for Ireland have made the Provisional Order set forth in the schedule hereto under the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Order should be c. 52. confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

- 1. The Order set out in the schedule hereto is hereby confirmed Order in and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force.

Whereas the Towns Improvement (Ireland) Act 1854 has been adopted in the town of Portrush in the Coleraine poor law union and the town commissioners (herein-after called the urban sanitary authority) have presented a petition to the Local Government Board for Ireland (herein-after called the Local Government Board) in pursuance of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 praying that the town may be separated from the rural sanitary district consisting of the said union and constituted an urban sanitary district and the guardians of the poor of the said union (herein-after called the rural sanitary authority) have consented to the said application:

And whereas all notices and advertisements required by the said Act having been given and published the Local Government Board have caused a local inquiry to be made as to the propriety of assenting to the prayer of the petition and it appears to be proper to assent thereto and to provide for the payment by the urban sanitary authority to the Commissioners of Public Works in Ireland of the several mortgage debts contracted by the rural sanitary authority for sanitary purposes in the said town which are set out in the second part of the schedule hereto and to transfer to the urban sanitary authority the waterworks and premises described in the third part of the said schedule:

It is ordered by the Local Government Board as follows:—

- 1. From and after the confirmation of this Order by Parliament the town of Portrush shall be separated from the rural sanitary district consisting of the Coleraine poor law union and shall be constituted an urban sanitary district subject to the provisions of the Public Health (Ireland) Act 1878 and of all other Acts affecting urban sanitary districts.
- 2. The urban sanitary authority shall after the confirmation of this order by means of the rate applicable to sanitary purposes pay to the rural sanitary authority each sum of money which becomes payable by the rural sanitary authority in respect of the loans instalments of loans and interest set out in the second part of the schedule hereto provided that as regards each of such payments which first becomes due after the confirmation of this Order an apportioned part only shall be payable in proportion to the time which intervenes between the confirmation of this Order and the day of payment and the rural sanitary authority shall apply each sum of money so paid to them by the urban sanitary authority in discharge of the loan instalments of loan or interest in respect of which it is paid by the urban sanitary authority.

Separation of town from the rural sanitary district and constitution of the urban sanitary district. 41 & 42 Vict. c. 52. Provision for payment by the urban sanitary authority of outstanding mortgages for waterworks and sewerage.

Local Government Board [Ch. lxxxvii.] [59 & 60 Vict.] (Ireland) Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 5) Act, 1896.

3. This Order shall not in any way affect or impair the security of the A.D. 1896. Commissioners of Public Works in Ireland nor the right or power of the said Commissioners to enforce payment of any loan instalment of loan or interest by the rural sanitary authority by means of the rates mentioned in and made liable to such payment nor the power of the rural sanitary authority to make and levy rates for the purpose of such payment.

Portrush. The securities of the Commissioners of Public Works not to be affected or impaired.

4. The waterworks lands buildings other premises and property described in the third part of the schedule hereto shall on the confirmation of this Order be transferred from the rural sanitary authority to the urban authority. sanitary authority and shall vest in and become the property of the urban sanitary authority for the like estate and interest and subject to the like charges and liabilities for and subject to which the same are then held by the rural sanitary authority and shall thenceforth be used by the urban sanitary authority for providing a supply of water to the urban sanitary district.

Transfer of waterworks to urban sanitary

- 5. All costs charges and expenses of and incidental to the making of this Cost of Order. Order shall be paid by the urban sanitary authority.
- 6. This Order may be cited as the Portrush Town Provisional Order 1896.
