An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the A.D. 1898. Local Government Board relating to Blaby (Rural) Bristol Eastbourne Epsom (Rural) Gelligaer-and-Rhigos (Rural) Malling (Rural) Newport (Mon.) Penmaenmawr Richmond (Surrey) and Rugeley. [25th July 1898.]

Now therefore We the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 176 of the Public Health Act 1875 and by any other 38 & 39 Vict. Statutes in that behalf do hereby order that from and after the date of the c. 55. Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following provisions shall have effect viz.,—

Art. I. The Urban District Council shall be empowered to put in force with reference to the lands described in the schedule hereto and for the purposes aforesaid the powers of the Lands Clauses Acts with respect to the purchase and taking of lands otherwise than by agreement or any of them.

Art, II. This Order may be cited as the Rugeley Order 1898.
