



CHAPTER lxxx.

An Act to confirm certain Provisional Orders of the Local Government Board relating to the Counties of Brecon Monmouth and Radnor.      A.D. 1898.  
[25th July 1898.]

WHEREAS the Local Government Board have made the Provisional Orders set forth in the schedule hereto under the provisions of the Local Government Act 1888:

And whereas it is requisite that the said Orders should be confirmed by Parliament:

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal and Commons in this present Parliament assembled and by the authority of the same as follows:—

1. The Orders set out in the schedule hereto shall be and the same are hereby confirmed and all the provisions thereof shall have full validity and force.      Orders in schedule confirmed.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 69 of the Local Government Act 1888 (herein-after referred to as "the Act") the County Council of any Administrative County are empowered to borrow on the security and for the purposes in that sub-section mentioned and by sub-section (2) of that section it is provided that where the total debt of the County Council after deducting the amount of any sinking fund exceeds or if the proposed loan is borrowed will exceed the amount of one-tenth of the annual rateable value of the rateable property in the County ascertained according to the standard or basis for the county rate the amount shall not be borrowed except in pursuance of a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board and confirmed by Parliament ;

And whereas the County Council of Brecon (which Council and County are herein-after respectively referred to as "the County Council" and "the County") propose to borrow with the consent of the Local Government Board and subject to the provisions of the Act for the purpose of paying their proportion of the cost of providing a joint lunatic asylum for the Counties of Brecon and Radnor a sum of money which together with the total present debt of the County after deducting the amount of any sinking fund will exceed the amount which they are authorised to borrow under the Act without a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board and confirmed by Parliament and it is expedient that a Provisional Order be made to extend the amount to be borrowed as herein-after mentioned :

Now therefore We the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 69 of the Act and by any other Statutes in that behalf do hereby order that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following provisions shall have effect :—

Art. I. Subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the Act the County Council may from time to time borrow such sums as will not together exceed by

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of Section 69 of the Local Government Act 1888 (herein-after referred to as "the Act") the County Council of any Administrative County are empowered to borrow on the security and for the purposes in that sub-section mentioned and by sub-section (2) of that section it is provided that where the total debt of the County Council after deducting the amount of any sinking fund exceeds or if the proposed loan is borrowed will exceed the amount of one-tenth of the annual rateable value of the rateable property in the County ascertained according to the standard or basis for the county rate the amount shall not be borrowed except in pursuance of a Provisional Order made by the Local Government Board and confirmed by Parliament ;

Now therefore We the Local Government Board in pursuance of the powers given to Us by Section 69 of the Act and by any other Statutes in that behalf do hereby order that from and after the date of the Act of Parliament confirming this Order the following provisions shall have effect viz.,—
