# GULIELMI IV. REGIS.

#### Cap. xxxi.

An Act for improving and maintaining certain Roads in the Counties of *Montgomery*, *Merioneth*, *Salop*, and *Denbigh*. [22d May 1834.]

THEREAS an Act was passed in the Fifty-third Year of the Reign of King George the Third, intituled An Act for 53G.3.c.186. repairing and improving certain Roads in the Counties of Montgomery, Merioneth, and Salop, and other Roads therein mentioned: And whereas it is expedient that the Term and Powers of the said recited Act should be extended and enlarged: And whereas an Act was passed in the First Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act for more effectually repairing 1 G. 4. c. 45. and improving the Road from the Town of Pool in the County of Mont? gomery, through Oswestry in the County of Salop, to Wrexham in the County of Denbigh, and several other Roads therein mentioned in the said Counties and in the County of Merioneth, and for making several new Branches of Roads to communicate with the said Roads in the Counties of Salop, Montgomery, and Denbigh: And whereas by an Act passed in the Seventh Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act for building a Bridge over the 7 G. 4. c. 62. River Virniew near Llanymynech, and making Roads and Embankments and Approaches thereto, in the several Counties of Montgomery, Salop, and Denbigh, on the Road leading from Liverpool to Carmarthen, and for several other Purposes, it was enacted, that when and so soon as the several Roads and Approaches to the Bridge by such Act  $\lceil Local. \rceil$ authorized

authorized to be erected should have been formed and completed, such Roads and Approaches should be placed and should thenceforth remain under the Care and Management of the Trustees acting in the Execution of the said recited Act of the First Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, and should be repaired by them as other Roads within their Care and Management, except so much of such Roads and Approaches as the several Counties in such Act mentioned, or any of them, might by Law be liable to repair: And whereas it is expedient that certain Portions of the Roads described in the said Act of the First Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, and also the Roads and Approaches to the Bridge which by the said Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth were placed under the Care and Management of the Trustees acting in the Execution of the said Act of the First Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty, should cease to be under the Control of such Trustees, and that the same should be placed under the Control of the Trustees to be appointed for carrying into execution this Act: And whereas it is also expedient that Power should be given to make the several Improvements in the several Roads herein-after described, and that the Tolls granted by the said recited Act of the Fifty-third Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third and by the said recited Act of the First Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, so far as the same relate to the Roads proposed to be placed under the Control of the Trustees to be appointed for carrying into execution this Act, should be increased or altered: And whereas it is also expedient that the said recited Act of the Fifty-third Year of the Reign of King George the Third should be repealed, and that other Powers and Provisions should be granted and made instead thereof: And whereas the beneficial Objects herein-before mentioned cannot be effected without the Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in Parliament assembled, That from and after the Fourth Monday next after the passing of this Act the said recited Act of the Fifty-third Year of the Reign of King George the Third shall be and the same is hereby declared to be repealed.

Recited Act of 53 G. 3. c. 186. repealed.

Trustees under the Acts of 1G.4. and 7 G. 4. discharged from the Repair of the several Roads herein mentioned, and Repair thereof to be undertaken by the Trustees under this Act.

II. And be it further enacted, That from and after the Commencement of this Act the Trustees acting in the Execution of the said recited Act of the First Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, and also the Trustees acting in the Execution of the said recited Act of the Seventh Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth, shall abandon and cease to exercise a Control over and shall be fully discharged from the future Repair of the Roads herein-after mentioned; (that is to say,) the Road from Berriew to Castell Caereinion, over Pontsycarth alias Pontsycoed, to the Turnpike Road from Myfod to Llanfair at or near Henniarth; the Road leading from the present Turnpike Road from Berriew towards Castell Caereinion to the Village of Manafon, by the Village of Llanwyddelan and the Addfa, to the Turnpike Road passing by Cefncoch over the Berwydd and Rhosfawr near Rhydybiswel to near Talerddig

Talerddig Turnpike Gate; thence a Diversion of the present Line of Road from Newton to Machynlleth down the Afon Yale Valley to the Turnpike Road leading from Pool to Machynlleth near Pont ar Dwymyn; the Road from the Boundary Stone on the Oswestry Side of Llanymynech to Pool; the Road from Pont Llanerchymris to Llanfyllin, and from Llangedwin Bridge to unite with the same Road on the Top of the Hill; and such Roads shall thereupon be repaired and maintained in repair by the Trustees for carrying into execution this Act, any thing in the said recited Acts of the First and Seventh Years of the Reign of King George the Fourth, or in either of them, to the contrary in anywise notwithstanding; and the said Roads shall thenceforth become charged and chargeable with the Proportion herein-after mentioned of all Monies due on the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said recited Act of the First Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth upon the Roads comprised in such Act, and of all Interest due or to become due thereon; and the Trustees acting in the Execution of the said Act of the First Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth shall from thenceforth be exonerated and discharged from the Payments of the same.

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be put into Roads to be execution, for and during the Term herein-after mentioned, for the Purpose of improving, repairing, and maintaining in repair the several Roads herein-after mentioned; (that is to say,) the Road leading from First District the Rhiew Bridge in the Parish of Berriew to Brynderwen Bridge, and of Roads. from thence, on both Sides of the River Severn, to Newtown, through Penstrowed and Llandinam, to the Town of Llanidloes, and from thence through Llangerrig to Steddfagerrig, and from Newtown through Aberhafesp by Pont-dolgoch to the Junction of the Parishes of Carno and Llanbrynmair near Talerddig Turnpike Gate, and from Newtown through Kerry to the Blue Bell; and the Road leading from the Turnpike Road from Newtown to Pool near Abermule, by Glanmule and Glanmehely, to the Confines of the County of Salop at or near Rhydyrhiew Brook; from Newtown, by Dolfor, to the Boundary of the County of Montgomery at Camnant Bridge; from the Turnpike Road leading from Montgomery to Pool, near the Ferlon, over Caehowel Bridge, to unite with the Turnpike Road from Pool to Newtown at or near Garthmill; and from the Efel-fach, by Berriew and Bettws, to join the Road leading from Newtown to the New Mills Bridge at or near Cwm Cignant; and from Newtown through Tregynnon to join the Road from Berriew, by Manafon, to Llanwyddelan at or near the New Mills Bridge; and also the Roads leading from Llanidloes, by Felindre Bridge, to the Confines of the County of Montgomery at or near Tyny-Cwn; from Llanedloes aforesaid to the Confines of the said County near Tylwch; from Nantycledwr, over Waengellyfelen, to join the Road leading from Tylwch to Llanidloes; from Llanidloes aforesaid to the Junction of the Parishes of Trefeglwys and Penegoes on the Road leading from Llanidloes to Machynlleth; from Llanidloes through Trefeglwys to Weeg Turnpike Gate, and from thence to unite with the intended Turnpike Road from the New House (between Newtown and Llanidloes) to Pont-dolgoch; and from Berriew, by the Village of Manafon and Llanwyddelan, and by the Addfa, to unite with the Turnpike Road leading from Llanfair to Talerddig Gate; and

and for making and maintaining the several Branches and Diversions

of Road herein-after mentioned; (that is to say,) a Branch from and out of the Turnpike Road leading from Newton, on the North Side of the River Severn, to commence at or near Llanllwchaiarn Church, by or near the Pant Mill, to unite with the Highway herein after described, leading from Highgate to Aberbechan; another Branch Road to commence at the Junction of the Roads leading from Newtown to Kerry and from Newtown to Pool at or near the Queen's Head Public House in Newtown, and to terminate at the Junction of the Llanidloes and Dolfor Roads at or near Dixon's Nursery; a Branch Road from or near the River Ceryst, by the Two Hirieths, Bronygeifr, and Tanyrallt, to or near the Direction Post by Pantyrongel; a Diversion of the present Turnpike Road from Newtown to Llanidloes, at or near Berthlwyd and Penryllon; also a Diversion of the present Turn-, pike Road from Trefeglwys to Newton at or near Park; and also for the Purpose of improving and making turnpike the present Highway leading out of the Turnpike Road from Newtown to Llanidloes at or near New House in the Parish of Llandinam, over Caersws Bridge, to unite with the Turnpike Road leading from Newton to Machynlleth, at or near Pontdolgoch; also the Highway (branching out of the last-mentioned Highway at or near Caersws) to unite with the Turnpike Road at or near Weeg Turnpike Gate; also the Highway from or near Felindre Gate in the Parish of Llanidloes, by Mount Severn and Geifron, to Blaenhafren and Maesnant; also the Highway branching out of the Turnpike Road from Pool to Newtown, at or near Abermule Bridge, to join the Road from Llandyssil to Goitre; also the Highway branching out of the Turnpike Road at or near Highgate to Aberbechan Wharf; also so much of the Highway leading from Rhaiadr to Aberystwith, by Cwm Ystwith, as lies in the County of Montgomery; and which said Roads herein-before mentioned and described shall henceforth be called "The First District of the Mont-Second Dis- gomeryshire Roads;" also for the Purposes of improving and maintrictof Roads. taining in repair the several Roads herein-after mentioned, (that is to say,) the Road leading from the Tenth Mile Stone from the Welsh Gate in the Town of Shrewsbury, on the Road from Shrewsbury to Pool, to the Town of Pool, and from the Town of Pool over Pontsycoed alias Pontsychcoed, by Heniarth, through Llanfair and Llanerfyl, by Cann Office, over Bwlchyfedwen, through Mallwyd and Cemmaes, to the Junction of the Road leading from Newtown to Machynlleth at or near to Pontardwymyn; also the Road from the Town of Pool to the Rhiew Bridge; also the Road from the last-mentioned Road, between the Fourth and Fifth Mile Stones, to Berriew; also the Road from Buttington Turnpike Gate, over the Virniew Bridge, to the Boundary Stone on the North Side of Llanyymynech Gate on the Road leading from Pool to Oswestry; also the Road from Pool by the Ceunant, to unite with the last-mentioned Road at or near to the Arddlin; also the Road from *Pool* Church to unite with the last-mentioned Road from Pool by the Ceunant at or near Coedoerle Common; also the Road from the Turnpike Road at Buttington Cross, through Leighton, to join the Road from Pool to Montgomery at or near the Cock Inn in Forden; also the Road from the Town of Pool by the River Severn to join the last-mentioned Turnpike Road at or near to Leighton Turnpike Gate; also the Road from Buttington Cross to Guilsfield; also

also the Road from Guilsfield, by or near to Cefndu, to join the Turnpike Road from Pool to Llanfair; also the Road branching out of the Road from Pool to Berriew at or near the Whitehouse Bridge, by Trefnant, to unite with the Road from Berriew to Castell Caereinion; also the Road branching out of the Turnpike Road leading from Berriew to Manason, through Castell Caereinion, by Dolarddyn and Pontpren Johnson, to Llanfair; also the Road from the last-mentioned Road at Dolarddyn to join the Road from Pool to Llanfair; also the Road from the Turnpike Road leading by Dolardyn to Llanfair, at or near Gibbet Hill by Cefncoch, to unite with the Turnpike Road from Newtown to Machynlleth at or near to Talerddig Turnpike Gate; also the Road branching out of the Turnpike Road from Manafon to Llanwyddelan, at or near the New Mills, to Llanfair; also the Road from the last-mentioned Turnpike Road at or near Llanfair Water Gates, to unite with the said Turnpike Road leading to Talerddig Turnpike Gate at or near Cefncoch; and also for the Purpose of making and maintaining the several Branches and Diversions of Road herein-after mentioned; (that is to say,) a Branch Road to commence at or near to the Wynnstay Arms Inn in the Parish of Llanbrynmair, by or near to Rhiwsaeson and Blaentafolog, to unite with the Turnpike Road from Llanerfil to Machynlleth at or near Mallwyd; also another Branch Road out of the last-mentioned Road, by Talyglanau, to or near to Bwlchyfedwen; also another Branch Road to commence by the Shade Oak near Garth, by Groeslwyd and Pentre'rbeirdd, to unite with the herein-after mentioned Road from Mardu Bridge to Myfod; also another Branch Road to lead from Sarnycrynwyr Bridge by the Garva, and to unite with the lastmentioned Road at or near to Tresnanney; also another Branch Road out of the present Turnpike Road leading from Pool to Llanerfil, to commence at or near to Dolarddyn, and from thence by or near to Brynelen and Yraethnog, and to terminate in the said Turnpike Road at or near to Llanfair Bridge; also another Branch Road out of the said Turnpike Road leading from Pool to Llanerfil, to commence at or near Llanfair Bridge aforesaid, and from thence on the North Side of the River *Einion*, by or near to *Lllanllothian*, and through the said River, to the present Turnpike Road at or near to Melinyddôl; also another Branch Road leading out of the last-mentioned Branch Road, to unite with the Turnpike Road from Llanfair to Llanerfil at or near the Niodd Bridge; also another Branch Road leading out of the present Turnpike Road from Pool to Shrewsbury, near  $But_{\overline{z}}$ . tington, to the Confines of the County of Montgomery, at or near the Welsh Harp; also Diversions of the present Turnpike Road leading from Pool to Machynlleth, at or near Hydan, Ty Breeth, Tynywern, Henniarth, Moelfeliarth, Dolymaen, Nantyrhedydd, Nantybitel, Mallwyd, Blaenyplwy, Dolyscaithlog, Drim Llwydiarth, Cwmllwynay, Maesmachreth, and Pontardwymyn; and also for the Purpose of improving and making turnpike the present Highway branching out of the Turnpike Road between Pool and Oswestry at or near Domgay, Chapel, and ending at the Junction with the Highway, herein-after mentioned, leading from the Four Crosses to Llandrinio; also the Highway leading from Mytog by Bronniarth Pool, to join the Turnpike Road near Crosswood; and which said Roads last herein-before mentioned and described shall henceforth be called "The Second [Local.] District

Third District of Roads.

District of the Montgomeryshire Roads;" and for the Purpose of improving, repairing, and maintaining in repair the several Roads herein-after mentioned; (that is to say,) the Road leading from the Town of Llanfyllin, over Coedoerle Common by Tycoch, over Llansaintsfraid Bridge and the New Bridge, to Llanymynech; also the Road leading from Llansaintsfraid Turnpike Gate over Rhyd-meredith Bridge, to unite with the Turnpike Road from Knockin to Llanrhaiadr, at or near Porthywain; also the Road from New Bridge aforesaid, by the Four Crosses and Domgay Schoolhouse, over Llandrinio Bridge, to unite with the Turnpike Road from Shrewsbury to Pool at or near the Cross Gates; also the Road from or near Trefnaney, over Pontyscowrhyd Bridge, by Bwlchycibe, to unite with the Road from Llangyllin to Llansaintsfraid at or near the Cann Office; also the Road from Llanfyllin, by Penygarnedd, through Llangynnog, to Milltirgerig; also the Road leading from the Turnpike Road from Llanfyllin to Llandrinio, at or near the Rhos, to Mardu Bridge aforesaid; also the Road from Henniarth, through Llangyniew, by Myfod, to the Junction with the Turnpike Road leading from Llangyllin to Llanymynech at or near Llansaintsfraid; also the Road from Llansaintsfraid to unite with the Turnpike Road from Knockin to Llanrhaiadr at or near Penybont; also the Road from Llanfyllin, by Archgell Gate, to Penybont alias Pont Llanerchymris; also the Road from the last-mentioned Road to unite with the Road from Knockin' to Llanrhaiadr at or near Llangedwin Hall; also the Road from Tycoch in Llanfechan to Penybont; also the Road from Llanymynech to join the Road from Llansaintsfraid to Porthywaen at the Gro; also the Road from the Turnpike Road at or near Crew Green to Westbury; also the Road from the said Road on Crew Green to unite with the Road from Shrewsbury to Pool at or near Trewern Gate; also the Road from the Turnpike Road leading from Llanfyllin to Penygarnedd, at or near Felinnewydd, by Pont-llogel, to unite with the Turnpike Road leading from Welsh Pool to Mallwyd; also the Road from Bwchycibe to join the Road from Llanfair to Porthywaen near Myfod; also the Road from Llanrhaiadr to Illanwyddyn; also the Road from Bryncoch to unite with the Road from Knockin to Llanrhaiadr; also the Road from Llanrhaiadr to Pistillrhaiadr; also the Road from the Junction with the Knockin and Llanrhaiadr Road near Caedelyn, over Aberrhaidr Bridge and Castellmoch Bridge, to Park; also the Road from Llanrhaiadr, by Garthgelynnen-fawr, to Penybontfawr; also the Road from Morton Bridge, by West Felton, to Ellesmere; and also for the Purpose of making and maintaining the several Branches and Diversions of Road herein-after mentioned; (that is to say,) a Branch Road out of the Turnpike Road to commence at or near Mardu Bridge, by or near Trefnancy, over Bronniarth Bridge, to Myfod; with a Branch Road out of the last-mentioned Branch Road at or near Trefnaney, over Pontyscowrhyd, to Bwlch y Cibe; another Branch Road from Castellmoch Turnpike Gate to Penybontfawr; another Branch Road from and out of the Turnpike Road leading from Myfod to Llanfair, at or near Mathrafal, by Graigwen and Pontygochel, to unite with the Turnpike Road from Llanfair to \*Llanerfyl at or near the Niodd; another Branch Road from Mathrafal aforesaid, through the River Mechan, by Dolobran and Pont Robert ap Oliver and Efel Llwydiarth, to Bwlch Glâs; a Diversion of the present

present Turnpike Road leading from Llansaintsfraid to Llansair, commencing at or near Henfelin, and terminating at or near the Junction of the Townships of Ystymcolwyn and Main; and also for the Purpose of improving and making turnpike the Highway branching out of the Turnpike Road leading from Pool to Oswestry at the Four Crosses, and ending at the Junction with the Turnpike Road from Mardu Bridge to Llandrinio at or near the  $Rh\hat{o}s$ ; and also the present Highway from Rednall, through Sutton and Wooton, to the Queen's Head Turnpike Gate on the Road leading from Shrewsbury to Oswestry; and which said Roads lastly herein-before mentioned and described shall henceforth be called "The Third District of the Montgomeryshire Roads;" and also for the Purpose of improving, Fourth Disrepairing, and maintaining in repair the several Roads herein-after trict of mentioned; (that is to say,) the Road commencing at the Junction of the Parishes of Carno and Llanbrynmair on the Road from Newtown to Machynlleth, near Talerddig Gate, down the Afon Yale Valley, by the Wynnstay Arms Inn and Tynyrhôs, through Machynlleth, to the Confines of the County of Montgomery at Lyfnant Bridge; also the Road leading from Talerddig Gate aforesaid, by or near the Village of Llanbrynmair, to unite with the last-mentioned Turnpike Road at or near Abergwydol; also the Road leading from the Turnpike Road from Machynlleth to Llyfnant Bridge, at or near Bryntyrnol, to the Confines of the County of Montgomery at or near Glaspwll; also the Road leading from Mallwyd, by Aberangell and Llanwrin, over Dovey Bridge, to Machynlleth; also the Road from the last-mentioned Turnpike Road, at or near Glangwynedd, to the Extent of the County of Montgomery at Corys Bridge; also the Road from the Turnpike Gate at the West End of Dovey Bridge to Towyn; and also the Road from Maengwyn Turnpike Gate in Machynlleth to the Junction of the - Parishes of Penegoes and Trefeglwys, near Rhydyporthmyn, on the Road to Llanidloes; and also for the Purpose of making and maintaining a Diversion of the present Turnpike Road leading from Machynlleth to Lyfnant Bridge, to commence at or near Lledfair Turnpike Gate, by Ogofach and Gellygoch, to terminate in the said Turnpike Road at *Derwenlâs*; and which said Roads lastly hereinbefore mentioned shall henceforth be called "The Fourth District of the Montgomeryshire Roads."

. IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Trustees of the said respective Districts of Roads to make the several sions of Road Branches, Diversions, and Improvements of Road herein-before menmay be made. tioned, within their respective Districts, of such Width as they may think proper not exceeding Fifty Feet, together with such Footpaths, Causeways, Embankments, Bridges, Arches, Culverts, Ditches, Drains, and Fences on the Line of such Branches, Diversions, and Improvements as they may think expedient, and for the Purposes aforesaid (subject nevertheless to the several Provisions and Restrictions contained in this Act and in the various Acts for regulating Turnpike Roads in England,) to take or use any Lands, making or tendering Satisfaction

Satisfaction to the Owners thereof and Persons interested therein for the Value thereof, or for the Damage sustained by them in the Execution of this Act; and it shall also be lawful for the said Trustees, and for their Surveyors and Workmen, from Time to Time to enter upon any Lands upon, in, over, or through which such Branches, Diversions, or Improvements of Road, or such Footpaths, Causeways, Embankments, Bridges, Arches, Culverts, Ditches, Drains, or Fences are intended to be made or pass, and also upon, in, over, or through. any adjoining Lands, and to stake out the same in such Manner as the said Trustees shall think expedient, without being deemed Trespassers, and without being subject to any Penalty or Punishment for entering or continuing upon such Lands for any of the Purposes of this Act; and if any Person shall remove, destroy, or injure any of the Stakes or other Marks used for any of the Purposes aforesaid, he shall forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds for every such Offence.

VIII. And whereas Maps or Plans describing the said Branches, Plans and Diversions, and Improvements of Road by this Act authorized to be Books of made, and the Lands upon, in, over, or through which the same Reference to respectively are intended to be carried, together with Books of the Clerks of Reference thereto, containing the Names of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, have been deposited in the Offices of the Clerks of the Peace for the several Counties of Montgomery and Merioneth; be it therefore enacted, That the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the said Clerks of the Peace respectively, to the end that all Persons may at all seasonable Times have Liberty to inspect the same, and to take Copies thereof or Extracts therefrom, paying to the Clerk of the Peace in whose Custody the Map or Plan or Book of Reference so inspected or referred to shall be the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts; and the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference, or either of them, or any Copy thereof respectively, or of any Part thereof respectively, certified by the Clerk of the Peace for the Time being in whose Custody the same shall be, or by his Deputy, to be a true Copy, shall be and is hereby declared to be good Evidence in all Courts of Law and elsewhere.

Dwelling Houses, &c. not to be to out Consent.

Unintentional Errors in Act or Plans or Books of Reference not to prevent Execution of Act.

XI. Provided nevertheless, and be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the Trustees of the said respective Districts of Road to make such Branches, Diversions, and Improvements of Road in the Line or Course, and upon, in, over, or through the Lands delineated on the said Maps or Plans, although such Line or Course, or such Lands or any of them, or the Situation of such Lands respectively, or the Names of the Owners or of the Occupiers thereof respectively, may happen to be omitted, mis stated, or erroneously described in this Act, or in the Schedule thereto, or in the said Plans or Books of Reference, if it shall be made to appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the County, Division, or Place within which such Lands shall be situate, or the Cause of Dispute shall arise, and be certified by Writing under their Hands, that such Omission, Misstatement, or erroneous Description apparently proceeded from Mistake; and the Certificate of the said Justices shall be deposited with and shall remain in the Custody of the Clerk of the Peace for the Time being of such County, Division, or Place.

Limiting Period for purchasing Property.

XII. And be it further enacted, That if the Trustees of the said respective Districts of Roads shall not within the Space of Three Years next after the Commencement of this Act agree for or cause to be valued and shall pay for the Lands which they are by this Act authorized to take, the Powers by this Act or by any other Act granted in relation to the taking of Lands for the Purposes of Turnpike Roads shall, so far as relates to the Lands herein-before authorized to be taken for the Purposes of this Act, cease and be utterly void, unless with the Consent of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, any thing in this Act or in any such Act as aforesaid contained to the contrary thereof notwithstanding.

Part of old Road may be discontinued after Diversions are made. XIII. XIV. For every Horse, Beast, or Cattle drawing any Carriage used for the Purpose of conveying Timber or Planks, and laden with Timber or Planks, having the Fellies of the Wheels thereof of the Breadth of Six Inches at the Bottom or Soles thereof, the Sum of Sixpence; and in case the Fellies of the Wheels thereof shall be of less Breadth than Six Inches and not of less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Nine-pence; and in case the Fellies of the Wheels thereof shall be of less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of One Shilling:

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast or Cattle, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of Two-pence:

For every Ass drawing any Kind of Carriage whatsoever, the Sum of Two-pence:

For every Score of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle (Calves excepted), the Sum of Ten-pence, and so in proportion for any less Number than a Score:

For every Carriage moved or propelled or set or kept in Motion by Steam or Machinery, or by any other Power or Agency than Animal Power, the Sum of Two Shillings and Sixpence per Wheel for each Wheel thereof:

And for every Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, having the Nails of the Tire of the Wheels thereof projecting more than One Quarter of an Inch above such Tire, the Sum of Ten Shillings:

XXVI. And whereas by the said Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act

Act to amend the General Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England, it is enacted, that the Trustees and Commissioners of Turnpike Roads may sue and be sued in the Name or Names of any of such Trustees or Commissioners, or of their Clerk or Clerks for the Time being: And whereas Doubts have arisen whether such Trustees, Commissioners, or Clerks are competent to give Evidence in Actions or Suits in which they may be Plaintiffs or Defendants; be it therefore enacted, That no Trustee or Clerk acting under the Authority of this Act shall be deemed incompetent to give Evidence, or shall be disqualified from giving Evidence, in any Action or Suit by reason of his being Plaintiff or Defendant in such Action or Suit.

XXVII. Machynlleth, near Pont or Dwymyn; the Sum of One thousand one hundred and eighty-two Pounds and Ten Shillings shall be charged exclusively on the Road leading from the present Turnpike Road from Berriew towards Castell Caereinion to the Village of Manafon, by the Village of Llanwyddelan and the Addfa, to the Turnpike Road passing by Cefencoch over the Berwydd and Rhosfawr, near Rhydybisweld, to near Talerddig Turnpike Gate; and the Sum of Nine hundred and seventy-two Pounds exclusively on the Road from Berriew, by Castell Caereinion, over Pontsycarth alias Pontsycoed, to the Turnpike Road from My fod to Llanfair at or near Heniarth; and the Sum of One hundred and twenty Pounds shall be charged exclusively upon the Road from Llangedwyn Bridge, to unite with the Road from Pont Llanerchymris to Llanfyllin; and the Remainder thereof on such Part of the said Roads as shall continue under the Control of the Trustees acting in the Execution of the said recited Act of the First Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth; and such last-mentioned Trustees shall for ever thereafter be discharged from the Payment of any Part of the said several Principal Sums of Four thousand one hundred and forty-eight Pounds and Three Shillings, Eight hundred Pounds, One thousand one hundred and eighty-two Pounds and Ten Shillings, and One hundred and twenty Pounds, and of all Interest to become due thereon, any thing in this Act or in the said recited Act of the First Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth to the contrary notwithstanding.

XXIX. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for Trustees emthe said Trustees, within their respective Districts, to borrow of the Commissioners for carrying into execution an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, Exchequer intituled An Act to amend Two. Acts of the Fifty-seventh Year of His late Majesty and the First Year of His present Majesty, for authorizing the Issue of Exchequer Bills and the Advance of Money for carrying on Public Works and Fisheries, and Employment of the Poor, 3 G. 4. c. 86. and to authorize a further Issue of Exchequer Bills for the Purposes of the said Acts, such Sums of Money as such Trustees respectively may deem expedient for the Purposes of this Act, within such respective Districts, on Mortgage or Assignment of the Tolls granted by, and of the Toll Gates, Toll Bars, and Toll Houses (with their Appurtenances) erected under the Authority of this Act within such Districts.

XXXI. And be it further enacted, That no Preference (except as herein-before provided with respect to Loans granted by the Commissioners for the Issue of Exchequer Bills, and also except such Preference as any Person may now have and enjoy by virtue of the Mortgage or Assignment which may have been granted to him for securing the Repayment of any Money which he may have advanced on the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said recited Acts of the Fifty-third Year of the Reign of King George the Third and the First and Seventh Years of the Reign of King George the Fourth,) shall be given to any Person, or to any Assignee of any Person, who has heretofore advanced any Money on the Credit of the Tolls granted by the. said recited Acts, over any of the other Persons who may have advanced any Money upon the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said recited Acts or any of them, and no Preference shall be given to any Person, or to any Assignee of any Person, who shall hereafter advance any Money on the Credit of the Tolls granted by this Act, over any of the other Persons who may advance any Money on the Credit of the Tolls granted by this Act, by reason of the Priority of Date of the Mortgage or Assignment or other Security for the same, but such Persons respectively, and their respective Assignees, shall (in proportion to the Sums in such Mortgages or Assignments mentioned) be Creditors under this Act, within the respective Districts upon which such Sums shall be charged, in equal Degree one with another, and without any Preference.

Sinking Fund.

XXXII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees within their respective Districts, and they are hereby empowered, from Time to Time, from and after the First Day of May One thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, to direct the Sum of Five Pounds per Centum upon the net Income received upon the said Roads, after Payment of the Interest accruing upon the several Principal Monies now due, and of every further Sum to be borrowed upon the Credit of the Tolls, within the said several Districts, to be paid out of the said Tolls, in order to form a Sinking Fund for the gradual Payment of the said Monies; and the said Monies so received shall from Time to Time be laid out and invested, in the Names of any Three or more of the Trustees of the respective Districts, in Government or Parliamentary Securities, and from Time to Time be applied in Payment of an equal Amount of the Principal Monies remaining due upon the Credit of the Tolls within such District.

Application of Monies arising within the several Districts.

XXXIII. And be it further enacted, That all the Money which shall be received under or by virtue of this Act, within the several Districts of the said Roads, shall be applied by the respective Trustees of such Districts in manner following; (that is to say,) in the first place, and in preference to all other Disbursements whatever, in paying and discharging the proportionate Parts herein-after mentioned of the Costs, Charges, and Expences incurred in preparing, applying for, and obtaining this Act, or otherwise incident thereto, with lawful Interest for any Money which may have been or which shall be advanced within such Districts respectively for the Payment of such Costs,

Costs, Charges, and Expences, from the Time the same shall have been advanced to the Time of the same being repaid; in the next place, in paying and discharging the Interest which is now due or which may from Time to Time become due on the Credit of the said Acts of the Fifty-third Year of the Reign of King George the Third and of the First Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, upon the several Roads within such respective Districts; in the next place, in paying and discharging the Interest of any Money which may hereafter be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls by this Act granted within such Districts respectively; in the next place, in paying the said Amount of Five Pounds per Centum upon the Income of the Roads within such respective Districts, for the Formation of the Sinking Fund herein-before mentioned; in the next place, in defraying the Expences of maintaining in repair the Roads within such respective Districts, and in making and maintaining in repair the several Improvements of Road by this Act authorized to be made within the same; in the next place, in repaying the Principal Sums secured on the Credit of the said Acts of the Fifty-third Year of the Reign of King George the Third and of the First Year of the Reign of King George the Fourth, upon the several Roads within such Districts; and lastly, in repaying any Principal Sums which may be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls by this Act granted within such Districts.

XXXIV. And be it further enacted, That no Money received No Money to by virtue of this Act shall be laid out in paving, repairing, or cleansing any Town or Street through which any of the said Roads may pass.

XXXV. And be it further enacted, That the Trustees of the said Expences several Districts shall pay the Costs, Charges, and Expences in of Act. preparing, applying for, and obtaining this Act, or otherwise incident thereto, out of the first Money which shall come to their Hands respectively, in such Proportions as the whole Amount of Tolls received upon each of such Districts shall bear to the gross Amount of Tolls received upon the whole of the Roads comprised in this Act.

XXXVI. And be it further enacted, That where in this Act any Word shall be used importing the Singular Number or the Masculine Gender only, such Word shall be construed to include several Matters Expressions as well as one Matter, several Persons as well as one Person, and in Act. Females as well as Males, and a Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Corporation or Corporations Aggregate or Sole, as well as Individuals; and where the Word "Lands" shall be used the same shall be construed to include Tenements and Hereditaments; unless in any of the Cases aforesaid it be otherwise specially provided, or there be something in the Subject or Context repugnant to such Construction.

XXXVIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.
