## Cap. lxxiii.

An Act for more effectually repairing certain Roads from Kingsbridge to Dartmouth, and for making new Branches to and from the same, all in the County of Devon. [27th June 1834.]

THEREAS an Act was passed in the Ninth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, inti-tuled An Act for more effectually making, repairing, and 9 G. 4. c. 12. maintaining certain Roads from Kingsbridge to Dartmouth, Modbury, Salcombe, and other Places in the South Part of the County of Devon: And whereas the Trustees acting under or by virtue of the said recited Act have proceeded to put the same into execution, and a considerable Sum of Money hath been borrowed, and is still due and owing, upon the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said Act, which cannot be paid off, nor can the said Roads nor the new Roads hereinafter mentioned be effectually made, amended, widened, diverted, altered, improved, and kept in repair, unless the Term granted by the said Act be further continued, and some additional Powers and Authorities granted: And whereas it is expedient that Powers should be granted for making and maintaining the several new Lines of Road, and for widening and improving the several Highways herein-after mentioned; (that is to say,) a new Line of Road commencing at the End of the present Turnpike Road in the Village of Stokefleming, and passing through or by the Villages of Blackpool Street, Torr Cross, Stokenham, and Chillington, and terminating at the End of the present Turnpike Road in the Village of Frogmore; a new Line of Road commencing at the present Turnpike Road leading from Dartmouth [Local.]24 B

to Totnes at Collaton Cross otherwise Blackawton Cross in the Parish of Blackawton, and terminating at the present Turnpike Road leading from Dartmouth to Modbury at Morley Cross in the Parish of Morley; a new Line of Road commencing at Cox's Bridge in the Parish of Diptford, and terminating in the present Turnpike Road at or near Comber's Cross in the Parish of Modbury; a new Line of Road commencing at or near Black Down Gate in the Parish of Loddiswell, and terminating in the present Turnpike Road leading from Dartmouth to Modbury on Lee Moors in the said Parish of Modbury; a new Line of Road commencing at Mary Cross in the said Parish of Modbury, and passing along the present Highway by Shipham Mill and Crownwell Cross, to unite with the present Turnpike Road leading from Totnes to Plymouth near the Fawn Hotel in the said Parish of Modbury; to widen and improve the present Turnpike Road leading to Dodbrook Quay from the Town of Kingsbridge; to widen and improve the present Turnpike Road through the Village of Loddiswell; to make Turnpike, widen, and improve the present Highway leading from the present Turnpike Road at Week Cross in the Parish of Stokefleming, by Ven Cross and Riversbridge, to Blackpool; to make Turnpike, widen, and improve the present Highway leading from the Village of Chillington, by Coleridge Cross, Frittiscombe, Petty France, and South Ground, to Slapton Cellars; to make Turnpike, widen, and improve the present Highway leading from Penny's Cross in the Parish of Stokenham to Coleridge Cross aforesaid; and to make Turnpike, widen, and improve the Highway leading from the present Turnpike Road at Sorely Green to the present Turnpike at or near the Village of Churchstow, all in the County of Devon: And whereas it would be more convenient if the said recited Act was repealed, and further, better, and more effectual Powers and Provisions granted instead thereof, as well for repairing, amending, widening, diverting, and otherwise improving the said Roads, as also for making and maintaining the new Roads herein mentioned; but inasmuch as the same cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament; May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act the said recited Act of the Ninth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Fourth shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Recited Act repealed.

Trustees empowered to make certain new Lines of Road.

II. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect and be put in execution, for and during the Term hereinafter mentioned, for the Purpose of more effectually amending, improving, and keeping in repair the Road from the North Entrance of the Churchyard in Kingsbridge, by way of Aveton Gifford and Stoliford Bridge, through Modbury, to unite with the present Turnpike Road leading from Modbury to Plymouth; and from the said North Entrance to the Churchyard in Kingsbridge to Frogmore Bridge, and by Mill Street, Westalvington, and Marlborough, to Salcombe; and from a certain Point of the said Road to Frogmore, situate upon Highhouse Farm, to Ranscombe Bridge; and from the North

North Entrance to the Churchyard in Kingsbridge aforesaid, by way of Knowle and Sorely Green, and by way of Sugar Lane and Bell Cross, to unite with the Turnpike Road to Totnes at or near Farmston, and to unite with the Turnpike Road from Dartmouth to Modbury at or near Morley Cross; and from the South End of Batt's Lane, by Well Cross and a new Line or Cut of Road, to unite with the present Road to Totnes and Dartmouth; and also from the East Side of the Millpond adjoining the Town of Dartmouth; and from the Ship in Dock, by way of Townstal Farmhouse and Halwell Cross, to unite with the Turnpike Roads to Kingsbridge and Totnes at or near Farmston aforesaid; and a certain new Cut or Line of Road leading from and out of the said Road, at or near Collaton Cross, to or near Ritson Lane End; and from a certain Spot in the Parish of Saint Petrox near a House called Stoke Cliff, adjoining the South End of the Town of Dartmouth, by Warfleet and Week Cross, to Deadman's Cross, and thence to unite with the Turnpike Road from Dartmouth to Kingsbridge at or near Long Cross and Townstal Farm aforesaid; and also from the Village of Stokefleming to Week Cross and Swannaton Cross, and from Soreley Green aforesaid to Ven Cross, and from a certain Point in the said Road to Ven Cross at or near the new County Bridge across the River Avon to Aveton Gifford aforesaid; and also from Halwell Cross, by Halwell and Morley, to Morley Post, and thence, by way of Yeo and Topsham Bridge, to Mary Cross, and thence to unite with the Turnpike Road from Kingsbridge to Plymouth at or near the Cross in Modbury; and from Morley Post aforesaid, by way of Gara Bridge, to Mary Cross aforesaid; and which said Roads will run to, into, or through the several Parishes following; (that is to say,) Southpool, Townstall, Stokefleming, Saint Petrox, Halwell, Blackawton, Modbury, Stokenham, Diptford, North Huish, South Brent, Loddiswell, Dodbrooke, Kingsbridge, Westalvington, Churstow, Malborough, Buckland-Tout-Saints, Charlton, Sherford, South Milton, South Huish, East Allington, Woodleigh, Morley, Cornworthy, Dittisham, Saint Saviour's, Aveton Gifford, and Ugborough, or some of them, all in the County of Devon: Provided always, that if the said Road from Morley Post by way of Gara Bridge to Mary Cross aforesaid shall be first made, then the Powers and Authorities given by this Act for making the said Road from Morley Post, by way of Yeo and Topsham Bridge, to Mary Cross aforesaid, shall cease and determine; and if the said Line of Road from Morley Post, by way of Yeo and Topsham Bridge, to Mary Cross, shall be first made, then the Powers and Authorities given by this Act for making the said Road from Morley Post by Way of Gara Bridge to Mary Cross aforesaid shall cease and determine, except as to a certain Portion of Road contained in the Line between Gara Bridge and Mary Cross aforesaid, and leading from or near a certain Spot called Churchland Green, to unite with the Turnpike Road to Ven Cross at or near Comer's Cross; and also a certain Parish Road or Highway from Stoliford Bridge by the Poorhouse to its Junction with a certain Road leading from Galpin Street to Elston Cross, and Two hundred Yards from the said Junction towards Elston Cross; also Fifty Yards of a certain other Road leading from or near Mary Cross towards Shipham, and a certain Diversion or new Line of Road leading from and out of the said Turnpike Road

Road between Stoliford Bridge and Modbury, and uniting with the said Road from Modbury to Bigbury at or near the Top of Prigdon Hill, and continuing therein Two hundred Yards towards Bigbury; also from Scoldon's Lane One hundred and twenty Yards in a certain Lane called Back Lane, and One hundred and Twenty Yards from the Entrance to Modbury up Galpin Street; and also, from or near Berry Gate, Two hundred Yards of a certain Highway towards Salcombe; and from or near the Turnpike Gate called the Quay Gate to Tacket Wood Bridge, and a certain Lane leading thereout to Square's Quay, called Sand Lane; and from or near Greenhill to Foxhole Bridge, and to unite with the Road to Salcombe at or near the Pump in Kingsbridge, and with the Road to Frogmore at or near Salt Mill, Quay; also Two hundred Yards in each of the Roads leading from Bell Cross to Addlehole and Washbrook Mill; and a certain Lane leading from Bell Cross to unite with the Turnpike Road to Ven Cross, called Wallingford Lane; and also a certain Road leading from Stanborough Cross to or near Ritson Lane End, and Two hundred Yards in a certain Lane called Blackawton Lane, leading out of the Turnpike Road near Stanborough Heights towards Blackawton; and Two hundred Yards in each of the Roads leading from Swannaton Cross to Swannaton and Cousins's Barn, and Two hundred Yards in a certain Road leading from Deadman's Cross to Waterpool; and also for making, improving, and maintaining a new Line of Road commencing at the End of the present Turnpike Road in the Village of Stokefleming, and passing through or by the Villages of Blackpool Street, Torr Cross, Stokenham, and Chillington, and terminating at the End of the present Turnpike Road in the Village of Frogmore; a new Line of Road commencing at the present Turnpike Road leading from Dartmouth to Totnes at Collaton Cross otherwise Blackawton Cross in the Parish of Blackawton, and terminating at the present Turnpike Road leading from Dartmouth to Modbury at Morley Cross in the Parish of Morley; a new Line of Road commencing at Cox's Bridge in the Parish of Diptford, and terminating in the present Turnpike Road at or near Comber's Cross in the Parish of Modbury; a new Line of Road commencing at or near Blackdown Gate in the Parish of Loddiswell, and terminating in the present Turnpike Road leading from Dartmouth to Modbury on Lee Moors in the said Parish of Modbury; a new Line or Branch of Road commencing at Mary Cross in the said Parish of Modbury, and passing along the present Highway, by Shipham Mill and Crownwell Cross, to unite with the present Turnpike Road leading from Totnes to Plymouth near the Fawn Hotel in the said Parish of Modbury; to widen and improve the present Turnpike Road leading to Dodbrooke Quay from the Town of Kingsbridge; to widen and improve the present Turnpike Road through the Village of Loddiswell; to make Turnpike, widen, and improve the present Highway leading from the present Turnpike Road at Week Cross in the Parish of Stokesteming, by Ven Cross and Riversbridge, to Blackpool; to make Turnpike, widen, and improve the present Highway leading from the Village of Chillington, by Coleridge Cross, Frittiscombe, and Petty France and South Ground, to Slapton Cellars; to make Turnpike, widen, and improve the present Highway leading from Penny's Cross in the Parish of Stokenham to Coleridge Cross aforesaid; and to make Turnpike widen, and improve the

the present Highway leading from the present Turnpike Road at Sorely Green to the present Turnpike at Churchstow Cross near the Village of Churchstow, all in the said County of Devon.

III. And whereas a Map or Plan describing the said new Lines of Roads to be Roads herein-before described, and the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments through or over which the same are respectively intended to be made or carried, together with a Book of Reference containing sited with the Names of the Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, Tenements, the Clerk of and Hereditaments, hath been deposited with the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of Devon; be it therefore further enacted. That the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference shall remain in the to Inspection. Custody of the said Clerk of the Peace, to the end that all Persons may at all seasonable Times have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and take Copies thereof or Extracts therefrom, at their Will and Pleasure, paying to the Clerk of the Peace the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts: Provided Limiting always, that the said Trustees, in making the said several new Lines Deviations of Road, or any Part or Parts thereof, shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards from the Line described in the said Map or Plan without the Consent in Writing of the Person or Persons, Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Lands or Grounds such Deviation shall be made.

IV. And be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act or any Trustees not other Act contained shall authorize the said Trustees to make any to deviate in Diversion or Deviation of or in the Line of Road by this Act directed to be made Turnpike between Shipham Bridge and Four hundred Yards on the Road leading from Shipham Bridge towards Mary Cross, except so far as may be necessary for widening and embanking and Mary the said Road.

V. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall be Lands lawful for the said Trustees to make the said several new Lines of Road through, across, or over the Lands of any Person or Persons who is or are or may be Owner or Owners of the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments through or over which the same are respectively set out and described in the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference, although such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, or the Name Reference. or Names of such Person or Persons, may be erroneously described, omitted, or mis-stated in the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference, in case it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the County in which the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments shall be situate, and be certified in Writing under their Hands, that such Omission or Mis-statement happened by Mistake.

Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Powers and Trustees re-Authorities hereby given for making the said new Lines of Roads herein-before described shall not extend or be construed to extend to authorize the said Trustees to take or pull down any Dwelling House Houses, &c. or other Building, or to take in or make use of any Curtilage, without Garden, Consent. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That if the said Trustees shall not, within the Space of Three Years (to be computed) from the passing of this Act) agree for and cause to be valued the Buildings, Grounds, and Hereditaments to be purchased for the Purposes of this Act, it shall not thereafter be lawful for the said Trustees to take or use any such Buildings, Grounds, or Hereditaments without the Consent in Writing of the Owners thereof first had and obtained.

Trustees dis- VIII. And be it further enacted, That from and after the said new Lines of Roads intended to be made as herein-before mentioned. or any Part or Parts thereof, shall respectively be completed and open for the Passage of the Public, it shall be lawful for the said of new Lines. Trustees and they are hereby empowered, at any Special Meeting from Time to Time to be holden for that Purpose, (of which Meeting public Notice, specifying the Time for holding the same and the Purpose thereof, shall have been given in some Newspaper or Newspapers published or circulated in the said County of Devon, and also by affixing a Copy of such Notice on all the Turnpikes, Toll Gates, and Side Bars which shall be then standing on any of the Roads now made, or by the said recited Act or this Act authorized to be made and completed, at least Fourteen Days before such Meeting,) to order that all or any Part of the Road included in this Act as shall lie between the Commencement and Termination of the said new Lines of Road by this Act intended to be made, or of any Part or Parts thereof, and so completed as aforesaid, shall be no longer repaired out of the Monies received by virtue of the said recited Act, or to be received by virtue of this Act; and from and immediately after the making of any such Order the Trustees shall be discharged from the Care, Management, and future Repair of the Road, or of all or any such Part or Parts thereof.

And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Power to ap-Trustees, at their First or Second Meeting to be holden in pursuance of this Act, to elect and appoint any Number of Persons not exceeding Three in the whole, being duly qualified to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, and such Persons when so elected and appointed shall have the same Powers and Authorities as if they had been nominated or appointed Trustees in or by this Act.

XI. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall hold First Meettheir First Meeting at the King's Arms Inn in the Town of Kings. ing of bridge, or at some other convenient House or Place on the Line of the said Roads, on the Third Wednesday next after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, between the Hours of Ten of the Clock in the Forenoon and Four of the Clock in the Afternoon, and shall then and there proceed to put this Act and the General Turnpike Acts in execution, and shall then and there afterwards adjourn to and meet at such Time or Times, and such Place or Places on or near to the said Roads, as the said Trustees or the major Part of them present at any such Meetings shall think proper and appoint, so that Two General Meetings at the least shall be held during each Year within the Town of Dartmouth.

Power to take Tolls.

XII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Person or Persons appointed or continued or to be from Time to Time appointed by them a Collector or Collectors, Lessee or Lessees of Tolls, or otherwise authorized by them for that Purpose, to demand and take at each Toll Gate, Toll Bar, Turnpike, Side Bar, and Chain which now is or hereafter shall be erected or standing across or at the Sides of the said Roads by this Act authorized or directed to be amended, widened, diverted, improved, and kept in repair, on each and every Day (such Day to be computed from Twelve of the Clock on one Night to Twelve of the Clock on the next succeeding Night) the several Tolls following; (that is to say,)

Tolls.

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Coach, Berlin, Landau, Chaise, Curricle, Calash, Chair, Caravan, Van, Hearse, Litter, Car,

Gig, or other such like Carriage, the Sum of Nine-pence: For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart,

or other such like Carriage, the Sum of Nine-pence:

For every Coach, Barouche, Chaise, or other Carriage with Four Wheels affixed to any Waggon or Cart, the Sum of One Shilling: For every Carriage with Two Wheels affixed to any Waggon or Cart, the Sum of Nine-pence:

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, Tumbril, Dray, or other such like Carriage laden with Timber, the

Sum of One Shilling and Three-pence:

For every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing,

the Sum of Two-pence:

For every Drove of Oxen or Neat Cattle, the Sum of One Shilling and Eight-pence per Score, and so in proportion for any less Number: And for every Drove of Calves, Swine, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Ten-pence per Score, and so in proportion for any less Number:

Which said Tolls shall be and they are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and the same shall be recovered, paid, and applied in manner by this directed.

Power to take Toll from Foot **Passengers** upon the Embankment.

XIII. And whereas the Trustees for executing the said recited Act hereby repealed have, under the Authority of the said Act, made an Embankment and built a Bridge at a great Expence for carrying the said Road across the Estuary at Bowcombe, and the same are of great Benefit and Convenience to Foot Passengers; be it therefore further enacted, That the said Trustees, or any Person or Persons to be appointed Collector or Collectors by virtue of this Act, shall demand and take of and from every Foot Passenger who shall cross the said Embankment the Toll or Sum of One Halfpenny, which said Toll shall be and is hereby vested in the said Trustees, and the same shall be recovered by such Means, and subject to such Penalties for Evasion, as any other Tolls by this Act granted can or may be recovered, and shall be paid and applied by the said Trustees in such Manner as is by this Act directed concerning any other Tolls hereby granted.

Limiting the Number of Tolls.

XIV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing herein contained shall extend or be deemed or construed to extend

to

to empower the said Trustees, or any Collector or Collectors to be by them appointed for that Purpose, to demand or take more than Six full Tolls for passing over the whole Line of Road; and One full Toll only shall be payable for passing over the Road from Kingsbridge to Modbury, including the double Line from Stoliford Bridge by the Poorhouse into the Road towards Elston Cross, and the Extensions in Back Lane and Galpin Street; and One full Toll only shall be payable for passing over the Road from Kingsbridge to Salcombe; and One full Toll only shall be payable for passing over the Road from Kingsbridge to Ven Cross; and One full Toll only shall be payable for passing over the Road from Kingsbridge to Frogmore or Ranscombe Bridge; and Two full Tolls only shall be payable for passing over the Road from Kingsbridge to Dartmouth by way of Stanborough; and Two full Tolls only shall be payable for passing over the Road from Dartmouth, by way of Topsham Bridge or Gara Bridge, to Modbury, or to the Fawn Hotel; and Two full Tolls only shall be payable for passing over the Road hereby authorized to be completed from Dartmouth to Kingsbridge, by way of Stokefleming, Blackpool Street, Tor Cross, Stokenham, and Frogmore, or by way of Frittiscombe and Petty France.

Provided also, and be it further enacted, That after the re- Tolls to be spective Tolls shall have been paid for the passing of any Horse, paid but once Cattle, Beast, or Carriage through any Turnpike or Gate to be con- a Day. tinued or erected by virtue of this Act, or by any Foot Passenger for passing over the said Embankment, such Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage, and such Foot Passenger, shall, upon producing a Ticket denoting such Payment on that Day, be permitted to pass Toll-free through the same Toll Gate, Turnpike, or Side Gate, and over the said Embankment, and also through such other Gate or Gates (if any) as the Ticket for such Payment shall free, at any Time or Times during the same Day, such Day to be computed from Twelve of the Clock in one Night to Twelve of the Clock in the next succeeding Night (except as herein-after mentioned), any thing in this Act contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XVI. And be it further enacted, That no Toll shall be demanded or taken by virtue of this Act for or in respect of any Horse, Beast, Manure exor other Cattle carrying or conveying, or going for or returning after empt from having been only employed in carrying or conveying, on the same Toll. Day, any Lime or Sea Sand to be used only for the Purposes of Manure, on passing through any of the Turnpikes or Toll Bars on the said Road, provided that the Fellies of the Wheels of every Cart, Waggon, or other Carriage used for that Purpose, and drawn by Two Horses, are of the Breadth of Four and a Half Inches, and if by Three or more Horses, of the Breadth of Six Inches.

Lime and Sea Sand for

XVII. And be it further enacted, That for the Purpose of defray- Expences of ing the Costs, Charges, and Expences of obtaining and passing this Act how to Act, and of every Matter and Thing in anywise relating thereto, it be defrayed. shall be lawful for the said Trustees to borrow and take up at Interest, upon the Credit of the Tolls by this Act authorized to be taken or [Local.] 24 D levied,

levied, such Sum or Sums of Money as may be required for that Purpose, and to charge and make chargeable therewith the said Tolls.

Stage Coaches, &c. to pay each Time of passing;

XVIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for every Horse or other Beast drawing any Stage Coach, Caravan, Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage conveying Passengers or Goods for Hire or Reward for each Time of passing or repassing along the said Roads: Provided nevertheless, that no further or additional Toll shall be payable in respect of the Horses or other Beasts drawing any such Stage Coach, Caravan, Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage, on account only of the Horses drawing the same having been changed.

Post Chaises on every new Hiring. XIX. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for every Horse or other Beast let out to Hire, and drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage, for each Time of passing or repassing along the said Roads, whenever any fresh Hiring thereof shall take place.

Road to be divided into Districts.

XX. And whereas the said recited Act provided that the Roads thereby intended to be made should be divided into the following Districts; (that is to say,) that the Roads from or near Dartmouth and Stokefleming to or near Farmston, at the Junction of the Totnes Road in the Parish of Halwell, should be formed into one District of Roads to be called the First District; the Road from or near the Junction of the Totnes Turnpike aforesaid to Kingsbridge and Addlehole into one other District of Road to be called the Second District; the Road from Kingsbridge, through Aveton Gifford and Modbury, to unite with the Plymouth Turnpike and to Mary Cross aforesaid, into one other District to be called the Third District; the Road from Soreley Green to Ven Cross into one other District to be called the Fourth District; the Road from Kingsbridge to Salcombe into one other District to be called the Fifth District; the Road from Kingsbridge to Frogmore into one other District to be called the Sixth District; the Road from High-house Farm to Ranscombe Bridge into one other District to be called the Seventh District; the Road from Halwell Cross by Morley to the Junction of the Fourth District into one other District to be called the Eighth District; the Road from the Fourth District to Mary Cross into one other District to be called the Ninth District: And whereas the several Roads included in the above Districts have been completed, and it is desirable that the several new Lines and Branches of Road authorized by this Act to be made should be in like Manner divided into Districts; (that is to say,) the new Line of Road commencing at the present Turnpike Road in the Village of Stokefleming, and passing through or by the Villages of Blackpool Street, Tor Cross, Stokenham, and Chillington, and terminating at the End of the present Turnpike Road in the Village of Frogmore, shall be the First District; that the new Line of Road commencing at Collaton Cross in the Parish of Halwell, and terminating at the present Turnpike Road leading from Kingsbridge to Totnes near the Village of Halwell, shall be the Second District; that the intended new Cut from, at, or near the Termination of the Second

Second District to Morley Cross in the Parish of Morley shall be the Third District; that the new Line of Road commencing at or near Cox's Bridge in the Parish of Diptford, and terminating in the present Turnpike Road at or near Comber's Cross in the Parish of Modbury, shall be the Fourth District; that the new Line of Road commencing at or near Black Down Gate in the Parish of Loddiswell, and terminating in the present Turnpike Road on Lee Moors in the Parish of Modbury shall be the Fifth District; that the Road from Mary Cross in the Parish of Modbury, by Shipham Mill and Crownwell Cross, to unite with the Totnes and Plymouth Road near the Fawn Hotel in the Parish of *Modbury*, shall be the Sixth District; that the Road from Week Cross in the Parish of Stokefleming, by Ven Cross and Riversbridge, to Blackpool, shall be the Seventh District; that the Road from the Village of Chillington, by Coleridge Cross, Frittiscombe, Petty France, and South Ground, to Slapton Cellars, and the present Road from *Penny's Cross* in the Parish of Stokenham to Coleridge Cross aforesaid, shall be the Eighth District; be it therefore enacted, That the said Trustees shall and may divide the said new Roads into such additional Districts as aforesaid, and they are hereby required, previous to commencing the making or altering any of the Roads described in the said Districts, to have the estimated Cost of completing the Roads included in such respective District subscribed.

XXI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Money arising from any of the Tolls mentioned in this Act shall be applied in or towards the Repair of any Branch Road authorized to be made by this Act, unless some Toll Gate, Toll Bar, or Turnpike shall be than collect-, erected and continued upon such Branch Road or on the Side ed thereon. thereof, nor unless the said Toll shall be demanded and taken thereat pursuant to the Powers and Provisions of this Act: Provided also, that no more Money shall be expended by the said Trustees in or towards the Repair of any of the Branch Roads authorized to be made by this Act than shall be collected thereat or borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls collected thereon.

No more Money to be laid out on **BranchRoads** 

XXII. And be it further enacted, That all Monies which shall or Application may be collected or received under the Powers or Authorities of this of Tolls. Act shall be applied, in the first place, in defraying the Costs, Charges, and Expences attending the applying for and obtaining this Act, with lawful Interest for the same; in the next place, in paying and discharging the Interest of all Sums of Money now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said recited Act hereby repealed, together with the Interest of all Sums of Money which shall hereafter be borrowed or taken at Interest on the Security of the Tolls hereby granted, and in defraying the Expence of continuing, providing, erecting, and keeping in repair the Turnpikes, Toll Houses, and other Buildings, and in making, repairing, supporting, widening, and altering the said Roads and Embankments by this Act directed to be made or kept in repair as aforesaid; and the Residue of the Monies so to be collected and received shall be applied in paying all Principal Monies due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls hereby granted, or borrowed for the Purposes of this Act,

Act, and in defraying all other Costs, Charges, and Expences attend ing the same, in such Manner as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time appoint.

Tolls not to repairing Ctreets.

XXIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That none of be laid out in the Tolls authorized by this Act to be taken upon the said Roads, nor any of the Monies raised by virtue of the said recited Act or to be raised by virtue of this Act, shall be laid out or expended in the Repair or Improvement of any of the Streets of any Town through which the said Roads shall pass, nor shall any Turnpike or Toll Gate be erected or Tolls taken thereon by virtue of this Act: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to prohibit the Trustees from taking Toll at any such Turnpike or Toll Gate as has been erected previous to the First Day of May One thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, nor to prevent the Trustees from setting up new Gates or Bars or erecting any Toll House or Houses as may be required in the Place and Stead of those which are now standing, for the Purpose of taking and receiving Tolls.

No Toll to be Lines of Road until the same are certified to be completed by Two Justices of the Peace.

XXIV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing taken on new in this Act contained shall authorize or empower the levying, taking, or demanding of any Toll at or upon any Line of Road hereby made Turnpike or authorized to be made, until the whole of the same Line of Road shall be properly made and completed and opened to the Public, and shall be certified by Two or more Justices of the Peace for the County of Devon to have been so made and completed, and a Certificate thereof under their Hands shall have been filed with the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of Devon.

Certain unnecessary Roads may be stopped up.

XXV. And whereas since the Completion of the Turnpike Road leading from Stanborough Cross to or near Ritson Lane End in the Parish of Halwell aforesaid, a certain Highway or Parish Road leading from Stanborough Cross to or near Ritson Lane End aforesaid has become useless; be it therefore further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to stop up and discontinue the said Highway or Parish Road, leaving open a certain Highway or Parish Road which crosses the same called Blackawton Lane, leading from Blackawton towards Morley: Provided always, that the said Highway or Parish Road shall not be stopped up unless the Concurrence and Approbation in Writing of Two of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for the said County shall be first had and obtained; and their Determination in the Premises shall be subject to Appeal in the Manner and Form directed and prescribed by an Act passed in the Fifty-fifth Year of the Reign of 55G.3.c.68. His Majesty King George the Third, intituled An Act to amend an Act of the Thirteenth Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for the Amendment and Preservation of the public Highways, in so far as the same relates to Notice of Appeal against turning or diverting a public Highway, and to extend the Provisions of the same Act to the stopping up of unnecessary Roads.

XXVI. And be it further enacted, That if any Person or Persons For preventshall with any Boat or Vessel, or in any other Way whatever, wilfully ing Damage or carelessly injure, pull down, or damage any Part of the Embank- bankment at ment across the Estuary at or near Bowcombe aforesaid, or the Bridges, Bowcombe. Arches, Walls, Posts, Rails, or Fences thereof, or the Drawbridge, or any Erection or Building made thereon by the said Trustees, or repaired or repairable by them, any Person or Persons so offending shall for each and every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Ten Pounds, over and above the Damages occasioned thereby.

XXVII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed Public Act. and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.

XXVIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect upon the passing thereof, and shall thenceforth continue and be in force and be executed for and during the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
