# GULIELMI IV. REGIS.

## Cap. lxxvi.

An Act for continuing certain Acts for regulating the Police of the City of Edinburgh and the adjoining Districts, and for other Purposes relating thereto.

[25th July 1834.]

THEREAS an Act was passed in the Eleventh Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled An 11G.3.c.36.

Act for cleansing, lighting, and watching the several Streets and other Passages on the South Side of the City of Edinburgh, and for removing Nuisances and Annoyances therefrom, and preventing the same for the future: And whereas another Act was passed in the Twelfth Year of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled An Act for lighting, cleansing, 12G.3. c.15. and watching the Streets, Lanes, and other Passages of the Burgh of Canongate, and the Liberties of Pleasance and Leith Wynd, adjoining to the Royalty of the City of Edinburgh: And whereas another Act was passed in the Twenty-fifth Year of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled 25G.3. c.28. An Act for opening an easy and commodious Communication from the High Street of Edinburgh to the Country Southward, and also from the Lawn Market to the new extended Royalty on the North, and for enabling Trustees to purchase Lands, Houses, and Areas for that Purpose; for widening and enlarging the Streets of the said City, and certain Avenues leading to the : same; for rebuilding or improving the University; for enlarging the Public [Local.] 24 N Markets

Markets and Communications thereto; for regulating certain Taxes; for lighting the said City; for providing an additional Supply of Water; for extending the Royalty of the said City; and for levying an additional Sum of Money for Statute Labour in the Middle District of the County of Edinburgh: And whereas another Act was passed in the Forty-fifth Year 45G.3. c.21. of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled An Act for regulating the Police of the City of Edinburgh and the adjoining Districts, and for other Purposes relating thereto: And whereas another Act was passed in the Fifty-second Year of the Reign of His said Majesty, intituled An Act 52 G. 3. c. 172. for altering and amending an Act of the Forty-fifth Year of His present Majesty, for regulating the Police of the City of Edinburgh and the adjoining Districts, and for other Purposes relating thereto: And whereas another Act was passed in the Fifty-sixth Year of the Reign of His said 56 G.3. c.74. Majesty, intituled An Act for amending an Act of the Fifty-second Tear of His present Majesty, for regulating the Police of the City of Edinburgh and the adjoining Districts, and for other Purposes relating thereto: And whereas another Act was passed in the Fifty-seventh Year of the Reign 57 G. 3. c.33. of His said Majesty, intituled An Act for altering and amending an Act of the Fifty-second Year of His present Majesty, for regulating the Police of the City of Edinburgh and the adjoining Districts, and for other Purposes relating thereto: And whereas another Act was passed in the Third Year 3 G.4. c.78. of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act for watching, cleansing, and lighting the Streets of the City of Edinburgh and adjoining Districts, for regulating the Police thereof, and for other Purposes relating thereto: And whereas another Act was passed in the Seventh 7G.4. c. 115. Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled An Act to explain and amend an Act of the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, intituled 'An Act for watching, cleansing, and lighting 'the Streets of the City of Edinburgh and adjoining Districts, for regulating 'the Police thereof, and for other Purposes relating thereto:' And whereas another Act was passed in the Second Year of the Reign 2 & 3. W.4. of His Majesty King William the Fourth, intituled An Act for altering c. 87. and amending certain Acts for regulating the Police of the City of Edinburgh and the adjoining Districts, and for other Purposes relating thereto: And whereas the said last-recited Act has now nearly expired, and it is of great Importance, and will promote the Security, Comfort, and Convenience of the Inhabitants of the said City and Districts adjoining, that the said last-recited Act be continued to the Fourth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and to the End of the then next Session of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That the before-recited Act, passed in the Second Year of His present Majesty, intituled An Act for altering and Recited Act amending tertain Acts for regulating the Police of the City of Edinburgh and the adjoining Districts, and for other Purposes relating thereto, be continued continued. from the Date of the Expiry of the said Act to the Fourth Day of July One thousand eight hundred and thirty-six, and to the End of the then

next Session of Parliament.

II. And be it enacted, That the Expences incurred or to be incurred in preparing, applying for, and obtaining this Act, or Expences incident thereto,

thereto, shall be defrayed from the Funds assessed, levied, or leviable under the before-recited Acts and this Act by the said Commissioners; and in order to discharge such Expences the said Commissioners shall and they are hereby authorized and empowered to assess all and every Person and Persons authorized by the said recited Acts or this Act to be assessed in any further Sum or Sums that may be necessary, such Assessment not exceeding in any One Year One Penny in the Pound of the Yearly Rent of the different Subjects specified in the said Acts, and to be ascertained as therein directed, and recovered and made effectual along with and in the same Manner as is provided with regard to the levying the Rates and Assessments thereby authorized to be assessed and levied.

III. And be it enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be Public Act. a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.
