An Act for repairing the Road from Farnborough to Riverhill in the Parish of Sevenoaks in the County of Kent, and for making several Diversions in the said Road.

[12th June 1835.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Fifty-sixth Year of the Reign of His late Maiesty King Garage An Act for more effectually repairing the Road leading from 56 G 3. c.34. Farnborough in the County of Kent to Riverhill in the Parish of Sevenoaks in the said County: And whereas the Trustees acting under or by virtue of the said recited Act have proceeded to put the same Act into execution, for which Purpose they have borrowed several considerable Sums of Money upon the Credit of the Tolls thereby authorized to be taken or collected upon the said Road, which Money still remains due and owing, and cannot be repaid, or the Interest thereof discharged, nor can the said Road be effectually amended, widened, improved, and kept in repair, unless the Term granted by the said Act be further continued; and it would be more convenient to the said Trustees and beneficial to the said Road if the said Act was repealed, and further, better, and more effectual Powers granted instead thereof: And whereas the making and maintaining a Diversion or new Line of Road from and out of the said Road, commencing at or near a certain Farm at Dunton Green in the Parish of Otford in the said County, in the Occupation of John Wreford Esquire, and terminating in the said Road at Pratt's Bottom Gate in the Parish of Chelsfield in the said County, and also a Diversion or new Line of Road commencing at the George Inn at Farnborough, and terminating in the said [Local.] present

present Road at the New Inn at Farnborough aforesaid, and from thence again to enter certain Land near to or adjoining the said New Inn at Farn. borough, and terminating in the said present Road at a certain Green called Wasted or Walsted Green, near the Well at Farnborough aforesaid, would be of great Advantage and Convenience, not only to the several Owners and Occupiers of Estates, Lands, and Grounds on the Line and in the Neighbourhood of such Diversions or new Lines of Road, but the same would also be of great public Utility; but the Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parlia. ment assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act the said recited Act of the Fifty-sixth Year of the Reign of His said late Majesty King George the Third shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

Recited Act repealed.

This Act to be put into execution.

II. And be it further enacted, That from thenceforth this Act shall commence and take effect and be put in execution, for and during the Term herein-after mentioned, for the Purpose of repairing, improving, widening, diverting, making, and keeping in repair the Road commencing at the Well at the North-west End of the Town or Village of Farnborough in the County of Kent, passing from, through, or into the several Parishes of Farnborough, Chelsfield, Halsted, Shoreham, Chevening, Otford, and Scvenoaks, and terminating at Riverbill in the said Parish of Sevenoaks in the said County of Kent.

IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Power to ap-Trustees and they are hereby authorized and empowered, at their First or Second Meeting under this Act, to elect, nominate, and appoint any tees. Number of Persons duly qualified to act as Trustees of Turnpike Roads in England, not exceeding Six in the whole, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, in addition to the Trustees hereby nominated and appointed; and such Trustees so elected and appointed shall have and they are hereby invested with the same Powers and Authorities for executing this Act as if they had been herein and hereby named and appointed.

V. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall hold their First Meeting First Meeting at the Crown Inn at Sevenoaks in the said County of Kent, or at some other convenient Place in the Neighbourhood of the said Road, under this upon the Third Mandau next after the passing of this Act. upon the Third Monday next after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, and shall and may then and from Time to Time after adjourn to and meet at such Times and at such Place or Places in the Neighbourhood of the said Road as they shall think proper.

VI. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Tolls to be Trustees to demand and take or cause to be demanded and taken upon taken. the said Road the several Tolls following; (that is to say,)

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Cattle drawing any Coach, Berlin, Landau, Chariot, Chaise, or other such like Carriage, having more than Two Wheels, where there shall be more than One such Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Cattle, then for each the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny; and where there shall be only One such Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Cattle, the Sum of Sixpence:

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or Cattle drawing any Gig, Chaise, Taxed Cart or Market Cart, or other such like Carriage with Two Wheels,

the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny:

For every Horse, Mule, Ass, or Cattle drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, Caravan, or other such like Carriage, when the Fellies of the Wheels at the Bottom or Sole thereof are of the Breadth of Six. Inches or upwards, the Sum of Three-pence; and when of less Breadth than Six Inches, but not less than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Four-pence; and when of less Breadth than Four Inches and a Half, the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny:

For every Dog drawing any Cart, Truck, or other Carriage, the Sum

of One Penny:

For every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, the Sum of One Penny Halfpenny:

For.

For every Carriage, of any Description whatever, propelled by Steam, Gas, Machinery, or any other like Means, the Sum of One Shilling: For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or other Neat Cattle, the Sum of One Shilling and Three-pence per Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number:

For every Drove of Calves, Swine, Sheep, or Lambs, the Sum of Sevenpence Halfpenny per Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less

Number:

And notwithstanding any thing contained to the contrary in any Act or Acts for regulating Turnpike Roads in England in this Behalf there shall be demanded and taken:

For every Horse or Mule, Ass or Cattle, drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage loaded with Chalk or Lime to be used in the Cultivation of Land, when the Fellies of the Wheels at the Bottom or Sole thereof are of less Breadth than Four and a Half Inches, the Sum of Four-pence Halfpenny; and when of the Breadth of Four and a Half Inches or upwards, if between the First Day of April and the First Day of October, the Sum of Two-pence; and if during any other Period of the Year, the Sum of Three-pence.

VII. And be it further enacted, That in all Cases where there shall be a fractional Part of a Halfpenny in the Calculation of the Amount of any of the Tolls hereby granted the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be demanded and taken in lieu of such fractional Part.

Tolls to be taken but once for passing and repassing.

VIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That when the Tolls authorized to be taken by virtue of this Act shall have been paid for or in respect of any Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Cattle passing through any of the Toll Gates erected or to be erected on the said Road or on the Sides thereof, no further Toll shall be demanded or taken for or in respect of the same Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Cattle (except in the Cases hereinafter mentioned) during the same Day, but, on a Note or Ticket being produced denoting such Payment, such Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Cattle shall be permitted to pass Toll-free through the same Toll Gate and also through all other Toll Gates erected on the said Road or by the Sides thereof.

IX. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be payable and paid for or in respect of all Horses, Mules, Asses, or other Cattle drawing any Stage Coach, Van, Caravan, or any other Carriage whatever conveying Passengers or Goods for Hire or Reward, for each and every Time of passing or repassing through all or any of the said Toll Gates or Side Gates upon the said Road: Provided always, that no further or additional Toll shall be payable in respect of the Horses, Mules, Asses, or other Cattle drawing any Stage Coach, Van, Caravan, or other such Carriage, on account only of the Horses drawing the same having been changed.

Post Chaises to pay on every fresh Hiring. X. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for or in respect of all Horses, Mules, Asses, or other Cattle drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage travelling for Hire for every Time of passing and repassing through all or any the said

said Toll Gates or Side Gates on the same Day as often as a new or fresh Hiring shall take place.

XI. And be it further enacted, That no Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Horses, &c. Cattle drawing any Waggon, Wain, Dray, or other Carriage, (not being a Stage Coach, Van, Caravan, or any other Carriage conveying Passengers or Goods for Hire or Reward, or not being a Post Chaise or other different Car-Carriage travelling for Hire,) and in respect of which Toll shall have been paid under this Act, shall be exempted or be entitled to Exemption from the Payment of further Toll on repassing on the same Day from Payment of Toll. through any of the said Toll Gates or Side Gates, and drawing at the Time any Waggon, Wain, Dray, or Carriage which shall be different from that which was drawn by such Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Cattle when such Toll was previously paid; but in every such Case, and so often as such Circumstance as last aforesaid shall occur, Toll shall be demanded and payable in respect of every Horse, Mule, Ass, or other Cattle so circumstanced as last aforesaid, in like Manner as if no Toll had been previously paid on that Day in respect of such Horse, Mule, Ass, or Cattle.

XII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable for or in respect of any Carriage propelled or moved by Steam, Gas, Machinery, or any other like Means, shall be paid every Time of the passing and repassing of such Carriage along the said Road.

Steam Carriages to pay every Time of passing and repassing.

XIII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Power to set Trustees, and they are hereby authorized and empowered, to set out, out and make Diversions of make, and complete the said Diversions or new Lines of Road herein- Road. before mentioned and described of such Width as they may think proper, not exceeding the Width of Forty-five Feet, together with such Footpaths, Arches, Bridges, Ditches, Drains, Fences, and other necessary Works adjoining thereto, as they may think requisite, and for the Purposes aforesaid to take, pull down, or remove all or any of the Dwelling Houses, Outhouses, Edifices, Buildings, Yards, Gardens, Orchards, or other Hereditaments which are mentioned and set forth in the Schedule to this Act annexed, tendering or making Satisfaction for the same to the Owners of the said Hereditaments and Premises and other Persons interested therein, or for the Damage which such Owners or other Persons may respectively sustain thereby; and it shall be lawful for such Trustees, and for their Surveyor or Surveyors and Workmen, from Time to Time to enter upon the said several Lands and Premises, and to stake out the same for the Purposes of this Act, at such Time or Times and in such Manner as the said Trustees, or their Surveyor or Surveyors under their Direction, shall think necessary or expedient, without such Trustees, Surveyor or Surveyors, or Workmen, being deemed Trespassers or a Trespasser, or be subject or liable to any Fine, Penalty, or Punishment, for or by reason of such Entry; and if any Person shall displace, remove, take away, or destroy any Stake or Stakes used in such staking as aforesaid, or any Works used for that Purpose, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds.

Maps, &c. deposited with the Clerk of the Peace to remain there, and to be open to Inspection.

· XIV. And whereas a Map or Plan describing the Diversions or new Lines of Road herein-before mentioned, and the Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises through or over which the same are intended to be carried or made, together with a Book of Reference containing a List of the Names of the Owners or reputed Owners and the Occupiers of such Lands, Hereditaments, and Premises, have been deposited at the Office of the Clerk of the Peace for the said County of Kent; be it therefore enacted, That the said Map or Plan and Book of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the said Clerk of the Peace, to the end that all Persons may at any reasonable Time have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and to take Copies or Extracts thereof, at their Will and Pleasure, paying to the said Clerk of the Peace the Sum of One Shilling for every Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts; and the said Trustees, in making the said Diversions or new Lines of Road, shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards on either Side from the Lines described in such Map or Plan, without the Consent in Writing of the Person or Persons, Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, entitled to the Lands or Premises to be affected by such Deviation.

In case of Lands purchased by Trustees, Freehold to Lands. 🕚

XV. And be it further enacted, That in case any Lands shall be purchased by the said Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, the Freehold and Inheritance of and in the Lands so purchased shall not, by means of any such Purchase, or any Conveyance made in pursuance thereof, be remain in the vested in the said Trustees, but that the Freehold and Inheritance of and Owner of the in the Lands so purchased shall, notwithstanding such Purchase and Conveyance, remain and be vested in the Person or Persons in whom the same were vested immediately prior to such Purchase by the said Trustees; but the said Trustees shall, by means of such Purchase and Conveyance, or either of them, be entitled to a perpetual Right of Way in or upon the Lands so purchased by them.

Trustees may nevertheless cut into same.

XVI. Provided always, and it is hereby further enacted, That, notwithstanding any Provisions herein contained, the said Trustees shall have the same Power of cutting and digging the Lands and Hereditaments taken by them for the Purposes of this Act as the said Trustees would have had in case they had purchased the Fee Simple of the said Lands and Hereditaments.

If any Land taken for the Road is not wanted, the Freehold thereof to be in former Owner.

XVII. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That if at any Time any Land purchased by the said Trustees for the Purpose of the Roads mentioned in this Act or any of them shall not be wanted for the same, then and in such Case the Right of Way in or upon the said Land vested in the said Trustees shall cease, determine, and be extinguished, and the Freehold and Inheritance of the said Land shall be and remain in the Person or Persons who were entitled to the same before such Purchase, freed and discharged of and from such Right of Way.

Misnomers not to prevent the Execution of the Act.

XVIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if any of the Lands and other Hereditaments and Premises to be taken or used for the Purposes of this Act, or any Part or Parts thereof, shall happen to be omitted, misnamed, or inaccurately described in the said Map or Plan

or

or Book of Reference, and it shall be made appear to any Two or more of the Justices of the Peace of the said County of Kent, and be certified in Writing under their Hands, that such Omission, Misnomer, or inaccurate Description proceeded from Mistake only, then and in that Case such Omission, Misnomer, or inaccurate Description shall in nowise affect the Execution of this Act; but the several Lands and other Hereditaments and Premises, and every Part thereof, included in such Omission, Misnomer, or inaccurate Description as aforesaid, and mentioned in such Certificate, shall and may be taken and used for the Purposes of this Act as fully and effectually, to all Intents and Purposes, as if the same had been originally included and accurately described in such Map or Plan and Book of Reference, or any or either of them, or any Part thereof.

XIX. XX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That if the said If Property Trustees shall not, within the Space of Five Years from the passing of this Act, purchase the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments wanted for in Five Years, the Purposes of this Act, then and from thenceforth the Powers and the compul-Authorities hereby granted for enabling them to purchase and take sory Power or use the same shall, so far as relates to the Premises not purchased, to take it to cease, determine, and be utterly void, (save and except or unless the said several Powers be exercised or carried into effect with the Consent also of the then respective Owners and Occupiers of such last-mentioned Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments,) any thing herein contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XXI. And be it further enacted, That when the said Diversions or new Lines of Road hereby authorized to be made shall respectively be fit for the Passage of Cattle, Carts, and Carriages, and shall be certified so to be in repair cerby any Two of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace acting for the said tain Parts of County of Kent, the said Trustees shall be discharged from the Care and old Road. Management of such Part of the present Turnpike Road as lies between the New Inn in Farnborough aforesaid and a certain Green called Wasted or Walsted Green, near the Well at Farnborough, and also from the Care and Management of such Part of the said present Turnpike Road as lies between Pratt's Bottom Gate in the Parish of Chelsfield in the said County of Kent and the Rose and Crown near Dunton Green in the said Parish of Otford.

XXII. And be it further enacted, That all Monies which, on the Day of the Commencement of this Act, shall be in the Hands of the said Trustees, and remaining undisposed of, and also all the Monies which shall arise and be produced by and from the Tolls of this Act granted

and made payable, together with the Monies which shall be borrowed upon the Credit thereof, and all other Monies which shall arise and be produced by virtue thereof, and not otherwise appropriated or directed to be applied, shall be applied to and for the several Uses, Intents, and Purposes, and in the Order and Manner following; (that is to say,) in the first place, in the Payment of all the Costs, Charges, and Expences which shall have been incurred in applying for, preparing, obtaining, and passing this Act, and otherwise relating thereto respectively; secondly, in defraying the Expences of widening, diverting, making, improving, repairing, and preserving the Roads by this Act directed to be widened, diverted, made, improved, and kept in repair, and of erecting, altering, and repairing Turnpikes, Toll Gates, and Toll Houses, with suitable Outbuildings, upon, across, and by the Side of the same Road, and otherwise in executing the Purposes of this Act; thirdly, in respectively paying and discharging all the Interest which shall from Time to Time be owing to any Mortgagee or Mortgagees for the Time being of any of the Tolls or Duties payable under this Act; and lastly, in reducing, paying off, and discharging, pari passu, and without Priority, among the respective Mortgagees, the several Principal Sums of Money which shall be due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls hereby granted.

Public Act.

XXIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.

Term and Continuance of this Act.

XXIV. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence from and immediately after the passing hereof, and shall continue and be in force for and during the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
