## Cap. lxxv.

An Act for more effectually repairing the *Launceston* Turnpike Roads, and making certain additional Roads. [3d July 1835.]

**W**HEREAS an Act was passed in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of King George the Second, intituled *An Act for amending, widening, and keeping in repair several Roads leading to the Borough of Launceston in the County of Cornwall:* 33 G. 2. c. 59.  
And whereas another Act was passed in the Twenty-first Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Third, intituled *An Act for continuing and amending an Act made in the Thirty-third Year of His late Majesty King George the Second, for amending, widening, and keeping in repair several Roads leading to the Borough of Launceston in the County of Cornwall:* 21 G. 3. c. 86.  
And whereas another Act was passed in the Forty-first Year of the Reign of King George the Third, intituled *An Act for continuing and amending Two Acts severally passed in the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Second and in the Twenty-first Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, for repairing and improving several Roads leading to the Borough of Launceston in the County of Cornwall, and also for extending the Provisions of the said Acts to the Road leading from the West Gate under Madford in the Borough of Launceston aforesaid, by Doacre, to the North Gate in the same Borough:* 41 G. 3. (U. K.) c. 10.  
And whereas another Act was passed in the Fifty-fifth Year of the Reign of King George the Third, intituled *An Act for continuing and amending Three Acts, for repairing several Roads in the Counties of Devon and Cornwall, leading to the Borough of Launceston:* 55 G. 3. c. 52.  
And whereas considerable Sums of Money have been advanced or borrowed on Security of the Tolls authorized to be taken on the said present Roads by virtue of the

said recited Acts, or some or one of them, and which Sums of Money are still due and owing : And whereas the said Sums of Money cannot be paid off, nor can the said Roads, nor the Diversions and new Roads herein-after mentioned, be effectually made, amended, widened, diverted, altered, improved, and kept in repair, unless the Term granted by the said last-recited Act be continued, and some additional Powers and Authorities granted : And whereas it is expedient that the Parts of the said Roads next herein-after mentioned should be abandoned ; (that is to say,) so much of the said Roads as commences from at or near to *Barricadoes Gate* in the Parish of *Saint Stephen's by Launceston*, and passes over *Saint Stephen's Down* in the Parish of *Saint Stephen's* aforesaid, and ending at or near *Horrapool Gate* in the said Parish of *Saint Stephen's* ; and also so much of the said Road or Roads as commences from at or near the *South Gate* in the Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* in the said Borough of *Launceston*, and passes over *Race Hill* in the said Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* and Borough, and ends at or near *Page's Cross Turnpike Gate* in the said Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* in the said Borough ; and also so much of the said Road as commences from at or near to the *South Gate* in the said Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* in the said Borough, and passes over *Angel Hill*, and ends at or near the Bottom of the said Hill in the said Borough ; and also so much of the said Roads as commences at or near *North Gate* in the Hamlet of *Saint Thomas Street* within the said Borough, and passes over Part of *Saint Thomas Hill* in the Hamlet of *Saint Thomas Street* aforesaid, ending at or near the Point on *Saint Thomas Hill* where the new Road from *Saint Thomas* to *Launceston* branches off from *Saint Thomas Hill* in the said Hamlet of *Saint Thomas Street* in the said Borough : And whereas it is expedient that Powers should be granted for making Turnpike, making, amending, widening, diverting, altering, improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair the several Diversions and new Lines of Road, and for making Turnpike, widening, maintaining, and improving the several Highways in the Lines or Direction thereof, as herein-after mentioned ; (that is to say,) a Diversion of the present Road, to commence from at or near the One Mile Stone on the present Road in the Parish of *Lawhitton* in the County of *Cornwall*, and to terminate at or near *Polson Turnpike Gate* on the present Road, all in the said Parish of *Lawhitton* in the County of *Cornwall* ; and also a Diversion of the present Road, to commence at or near *Lifton Cross* on the present Road in the Village of *Lifton* in the said Parish of *Lifton*, through the Village of *Tinney* in the said Parish of *Lifton*, and to terminate at or near to the Five Mile Stone on the present Road in the Parish of *Stowford* in the County of *Devon* ; and a Diversion of the present Road, to commence at or near the Three Mile Stone on the present Road, and to terminate at or near *Trekelland Bridge* on the present Road, all in the Parish of *South Petherwyn* in the said County of *Cornwall* ; and a Diversion of the present Road, to commence from at or near the *South Petherwyn Water* on the present Road, and to terminate at or near the South-western End of *South Petherwyn Village* on the present Road, all in the Parish of *South Petherwyn* in the County of *Cornwall* on the present Road ; also a Diversion of the present Road, to commence from at or near *Saint Stephen's Down* in the Parish of *Saint Stephen's* aforesaid in the County of *Cornwall*



on the present Road, and to terminate at or near the Three Mile Stone on the present Road in the Parish of *Werrington* in the County of *Devon*; and also a Diversion of the present Road, to commence from at or near *Chapple Gate* in the Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* aforesaid on the present Road, and to terminate at or near *Tresmarrow Pond* on the present Road in the Parish of *Saint Thomas the Apostle* in the County of *Cornwall*; and also a Diversion of the present Road, to commence from at or near *Tresmarrow Pond* on the present Road in the last aforesaid Parish and County, to join the present Road leading to the Village of *South Petherwyn*, and to terminate at or near *Tremail Hill* in the said Parish of *South Petherwyn* in the said County of *Cornwall* on the present Road; and also a Diversion of the present Road, to commence from at or near a House, now or late occupied by *John Dew* the younger, in the Village of *Saint Stephen's* in the Parish of *Saint Stephen's* aforesaid on the present Road, and to terminate at or near *Horrupool Gate* on the present Road in the said Parish of *Saint Stephen's* in the County of *Cornwall*; and also a new Line of Road, to commence either from the One Mile Stone in the *Tavistock* Road or at or near a Place called *Page's Cross*, in the Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* in the Borough of *Launceston*, to the River or Stream dividing the said Parish of *Lawhitton* from the Parish of *Lezant* near *Trekelland Lane* in the said Parish of *Lezant*, thence through the said Parish of *Lezant* to the River *Inney*, and thence, by means of a Bridge across the said River, to and to terminate at or near *Taylor's Shop* on the Road belonging to the Trustees of the *Callington* Turnpike in the Parish of *Stokeclimsland* in the County of *Cornwall*; and also a new Line of Road, or an Extension of the said present Road or Roads, commencing from at or near *Sittacott* in the Parish of *Saint Giles-in-the-Heath*, and to terminate at or near to *Woodford Bridge* in the Parish of *Milton Damerall*; and also a new Line of Road, to commence from at or near the *Bude Canal* in the Parish of *Holdsworthy* through the Parish of *Thornbury*, and to terminate at the River *Torrige* in the Parish of *Milton Damerall* at or near *Woodford Bridge* in the said Parish of *Milton Damerall*, all in the County of *Devon*: And whereas it would be more convenient if the said several recited Acts were repealed, and other Powers and Provisions granted instead thereof, and embodied in One Act; but inasmuch as the same cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament, May it therefore please Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the King's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That from and after the passing of this Act the said recited Acts of the Thirty-third Year of the Reign of *George* the Second, and the Twenty-first, Forty-first, and the Fifty-fifth Years of the Reign of *George* the Third, shall be and the same are hereby declared to be repealed.

Recited Acts repealed.

II. And be it further enacted, That so much of the Roads by the said recited Acts, or some or one of them, authorized to be made, as commences from at or near to *Barricadoes Gate* in the Parish of *Saint Stephen's* by *Launceston*, and passes over *Saint Stephen's Down* in the Parish of *Saint Stephen's* aforesaid, and ending at or near *Horrupool Gate* in the said Parish of *Saint Stephen's*, and also so much of the said Roads

Roads as commences from at or near the *South Gate* in the Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* aforesaid in the said Borough of *Launceston*, and passes over *Race Hill* in the said Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* and Borough, and ending at or near *Page's Cross* Turnpike Gate in the said Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* in the said Borough, and also so much of the said Roads as commences from at or near to the *South Gate* in the said Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* in the said Borough of *Launceston*, and passes over *Angel Hill* aforesaid, and ending at or near the Bottom of the said Hill in the said Borough, and also so much of the said Roads as commences at or near *North Gate* in the Hamlet of *Saint Thomas Street* within the Borough of *Launceston*, and passes over Part of *Saint Thomas Hill* in the Hamlet of *Saint Thomas Street* aforesaid, ending at or near the Point on *Saint Thomas Hill* where the new Road from *Saint Thomas* to *Launceston* branches off from *Saint Thomas Hill* in the said Hamlet of *Saint Thomas Street* in the said Borough, shall be abandoned, and that from and immediately after the passing of this Act the Trustees acting in the Execution of this Act shall be discharged from the Care, Management, and future Repair thereof.

Roads authorized to be made, &c. by present Act.

III. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect and be put in execution, for and during the Term hereinafter mentioned, for the Purpose of more effectually amending, altering, widening, improving, and keeping in repair the Highways or Roads leading from *Coombe Bow Bridge* in the Parish of *Thrushelton*, through the several Parishes of *Thrushelton* aforesaid, *Lewtrenchard*, *Maristowe*, *Stowford*, and *Lifton*, in the County of *Devon*, *Lawhitton*, *Saint Mary Magdalen*, the Town of *Launceston* aforesaid, *South Petherwyn*, *Saint Thomas the Apostle*, *Trewenn*, *Laneast*, *Treneglos*, and *Davidstowe*, to *Halworthy* in the said Parish of *Davidstowe* in the County of *Cornwall*, and from a certain Place called *Penny Gillam Pool*, in the Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* aforesaid, through the several Parishes of *Saint Mary Magdalen* and *South Petherwyn* aforesaid, to a certain Place called *Trekelland Bridge*, in the said Parish of *South Petherwyn* in the County of *Cornwall*, and from the Town of *Launceston* aforesaid in the Road aforesaid, through the several Parishes of *Saint Mary Magdalen* and *Lawhitton* aforesaid, and *Lezant*, to *Greystone Bridge* in the said Parish of *Lezant* and County of *Cornwall*, and from a certain Place called *Laburnick Cross*, in the Parish of *Lawhitton*, through the said Parish of *Lawhitton*, to a certain Place called *Jonas's Shop*, in the said Parish of *Lezant* and County of *Cornwall*, and from a certain Place called *Page's Cross*, in the said Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen*, to a certain Place called *Hurdon Water*, in *Saint Mary Magdalen* aforesaid, and from *Launceston* to the Village of *Bennacott* in the Parish of *Boyton*, and from *Launceston* to the Village of *Sittacott* in the Parish of *Saint Giles in the Heath*, and from *Launceston* to the Village of *Egloskerry*, in the Counties of *Cornwall* and *Devon*; and also the Road leading from the *West Gate under Madford* in the Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* aforesaid to the *South Gate* in the same Parish, and from at or near the Workhouse of the said Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen*, by *Docacre*, to the *North Gate* in the Hamlet of *Saint Thomas Street* aforesaid, and from thence to the Road leading from *Launceston* to *Saint Thomas Bridge*; and also for the Purpose of making Turnpike, making,



making, amending, widening, diverting, altering, improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair a Diversion of the present Road, to commence from at or near the One Mile Stone on the present Road in the Parish of *Lawhitton* in the County of *Cornwall*, and to terminate at or near *Polson* Turnpike Gate on the present Road, all in the said Parish of *Lawhitton* in the County of *Cornwall*; and also a Diversion of the present Road, to commence at or near *Lifton Cross* on the present Road, in the Village of *Lifton* in the said Parish of *Lifton*, through the Village of *Tinney* in the said Parish of *Lifton*, and to terminate at or near to the Five Mile Stone on the present Road in the Parish of *Stowford* in the County of *Devon*; and a Diversion of the present Road to commence at or near the Three Mile Stone on the present Road, and to terminate at or near *Trekelland Bridge* on the present Road, all in the said Parish of *South Petherwyn* in the said County of *Cornwall*; and a Diversion of the present Road, to commence near the *South Petherwyn Water* on the present Road, and to terminate at or near the South-western End of *South Petherwyn* Village on the present Road, all in the Parish of *South Petherwyn* in the County of *Cornwall* on the present Road; also a Diversion of the present Road from at or near *Saint Stephen's Down* in the Parish of *Saint Stephen's* aforesaid in the said County of *Cornwall* on the present Road, and to terminate at or near the Three Mile Stone on the present Road in the Parish of *Werrington* in the County of *Devon*; and also a Diversion of the present Road, to commence from at or near *Chapple Gate* on the present Road in the Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* aforesaid, and to terminate at or near *Tresmarrow Pond* on the present Road in the Parish of *Saint Thomas the Apostle* in the County of *Cornwall*; and also a Diversion of the present Road to commence from at or near *Tresmarrow Pond* on the present Road in the last aforesaid Parish and County, to join the present Road leading to the Village of *South Petherwyn*, and to terminate at or near *Tremail Hill* in the said Parish of *South Petherwyn* in the said County of *Cornwall* on the present Road; and also a Diversion of the present Road, to commence from at or near a House occupied by *John Dew* the younger in the Village of *Saint Stephen's* in the Parish of *Saint Stephen's* aforesaid on the present Road, and to terminate at or near *Horrapool Gate* on the present Road in the said Parish of *Saint Stephen's* in the County of *Cornwall*; and also a new Line of Road to commence either from the One Mile Stone in the *Tavistock* Road, or at or near a Place called *Page's Cross*, in the Parish of *Saint Mary Magdalen* in the Borough of *Launceston*, to the River or Stream dividing the said Parish of *Lawhitton* from the said Parish of *Lezant* near *Trekelland Lane* in the Parish of *Lezant*, thence through the said Parish of *Lezant* to the River *Inney*, and thence, by means of a Bridge (which the Trustees herein-after named are hereby authorized to make, with all necessary Works and Conveniences,) across the said River to and to terminate at or near *Taylor's Shop* on the Road belonging to the Trustees of the *Callington* Turnpike in the Parish of *Stokeclimland* in the County of *Cornwall* (all which before-mentioned Roads shall be called "The *Launceston* District of Roads"); and also a new Line of Road, or Extension of the said present Road or Roads, commencing from at or near *Sittacott* in the Parish of *Saint Giles-in-the-Heath*, and to terminate at or near to



*Woodford Bridge* in the Parish of *Milton Damerall*; and also a new Line of Road, to commence from at or near the *Bude Canal* in the Parish of *Holdsworthy*, through the Parish of *Thornbury*, and to terminate at the River *Torrige* in the Parish of *Milton Damerall* at or near *Woodford Bridge* in the said Parish of *Milton Damerall*, all in the County of *Devon* (which Two last-mentioned new Lines of Road shall be called "The *Holdsworthy District of Roads*"); all which said Diversions and new Lines of Road so intended to be made Turnpike, made, amended, widened, diverted, altered, improved, maintained, and kept in repair, are intended to pass from, in, through, and into the several Parishes and Townships of *Lawhitton*, *Lifton*, *Stowford*, *Saint Mary Magdalen*, *South Petherwyn*, *Werrington*, *Saint Stephen's by Launceston*, *Saint Thomas the Apostle*, *Maristow*, *Lew-trenchard*, *Thrushelton*, *Stokeclimsland*, *Lezant*, *Saint Giles in the Heath*, *Northcott Hamlet*, *Ashwater*, *Tetcott*, *Luffincot*, *Clawton*, *Holdsworthy*, *Thornbury*, and *Milton Damerall*, in the Counties of *Cornwall* and *Devon*; and further, that it shall be lawful for the Trustees herein-after named for the Purposes aforesaid to take and appropriate all or any of the Road or Roads, Highway or Highways now running through the said several Parishes and Townships, or any or either of them, in the Line or Direction of the said several herein-before mentioned Diversions or new Lines of Road, or any or either of them; and further, that it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to make Causeways or Footpaths for the Space of One Mile from every Market Town through or to which any of the said Roads lead, by the Side of the said Roads, or such of them as shall be thought, at a General Meeting of the said Trustees to be held for the Purpose, necessary and proper; and the same Causeways and Footpaths shall be kept in repair out of the Tolls hereby directed to be taken or received on the said several Roads respectively.

Power to set out and make Diversions of Roads.

IV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees and they are hereby authorized and empowered to set out, make, and complete the said Diversions and new Lines of Road herein-before mentioned and described of such Width as they may think proper, not exceeding the Width of Forty-five Feet, together with such Causeways and Footpaths as aforesaid, and such Arches, Bridges, Ditches, Drains, Fences, and other necessary Works adjoining thereto as they may think requisite, and for the Purposes aforesaid to take, pull down, or remove all or any of the Dwelling Houses, Outhouses, Edifices, Buildings, Yards, Gardens, Orchards, or other Hereditaments which are mentioned and set forth in the Schedule to this Act annexed, tendering or making Satisfaction for the same to the Owners of the said Hereditaments and Premises and other Persons interested therein, or for the Damage which such Owners or other Persons may respectively sustain thereby; and it shall be lawful for such Trustees, and for their Surveyor or Surveyors and Workmen, from Time to Time to enter upon the said several Lands and Premises, and to stake out the same for the Purposes of this Act, at such Time or Times and in such Manner as the said Trustees, or their Surveyor or Surveyors under their Direction, shall think necessary or expedient, without such Trustees, Surveyor or Surveyors or Workmen, being deemed Trespassers or a Trespasser,



or being subject or liable to any Fine, Penalty, or Punishment for or by reason of such Entry; and if any Person shall displace, remove, take away, or destroy any Stake or Stakes used in such staking as aforesaid, or any Works used for that Purpose, every Person so offending shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Five Pounds.

V. And whereas Maps or Plans describing the said Diversions and new Lines of Road herein-before described, and the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments through or over which the same are respectively intended to be made or carried, together with a Book of Reference containing the Names of the Owners and Occupiers or reputed Owners and Occupiers of such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, have been deposited with the respective Clerks of the Peace for the Counties of *Devon* and *Cornwall*; be it therefore further enacted, That the said Maps or Plans and Books of Reference shall remain in the Custody of the said respective Clerks of the Peace, to the end that all Persons may at all seasonable Times have Liberty to inspect and peruse the same, and take Copies thereof or Extracts therefrom at their Will and Pleasure, paying such Clerks of the Peace respectively the Sum of One Shilling for every such Inspection, and at the Rate of Sixpence for every One hundred Words of such Copies or Extracts; and the said Maps or Plans and Book of Reference, or either of them, or any Copy thereof respectively, or of any Part thereof respectively, certified by the Clerk of the Peace for the Time being to be a true Copy thereof, shall be good Evidence in all Courts of Law and Equity: Provided always, that the Trustees acting in the Execution of this Act, in making the said several Diversions and new Lines of Road, or any Part or Parts thereof, shall not deviate more than One hundred Yards on either Side from the Lines described in the said Maps or Plans without the Consent in Writing of the Person or Persons, Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, through whose Lands or Grounds such Deviation shall be made.

The Maps deposited with the respective Clerks of the Peace to remain there and be open to Inspection

Limiting Deviations from Plan.

VI. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees to make the said several Diversions and new Lines of Road through, across, or over the Lands of any Person or Persons who is or are or may be Owner or Owners of the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments through or over which the same are respectively set out and described in the said Maps or Plans and Book of Reference, or intended so to be, although such Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments, or the Name or Names of such Person or Persons, may be erroneously described, omitted, or mis-stated in the said Maps or Plans and Book of Reference, in case it shall appear to any Two or more Justices of the Peace for the County in which the Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments shall be situate, and be certified in Writing under their Hands, that such Omission or Mis-statement happened by Mistake.

Lands marked in the Plan may be used, although erroneously described in Book of Reference.

VII. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Powers and Authorities hereby given for making the said Diversions and new Lines of Roads herein-before described shall not extend or be construed to extend to authorize the said Trustees to take or pull down

Trustees not to pull down Dwelling Houses, &c. without Consent of the

Owner, except those specified in the Schedule.

down any Dwelling House or other Building, or to take in or make use of any Curtilage, Garden, Yard, Park, Paddock, Lawn, Shrubbery, planted Walk or Avenue to a House, or any inclosed Grounds planted and set apart as a Nursery for Trees, or any Part thereof respectively, without the Consent in Writing of the Owner or Proprietor thereof, or other Person interested therein, first had and obtained, save and except those specified in the Schedule hereunto annexed.

Lands to be purchased in Three Years.

VIII. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That if the said Trustees shall not within the Space of Three Years, to be computed from the passing of this Act, agree for and cause to be valued the Buildings, Grounds, and Hereditaments to be purchased for the Purposes of this Act, it shall not thereafter be lawful for the said Trustees to take or use any such Buildings, Grounds, or Hereditaments without the Consent in Writing of the Owners thereof first had and obtained.

The Freehold of Lands purchased by Trustees, to remain in the Owner of the Lands.

IX. And be it further enacted, That in case any Lands or Hereditaments shall be purchased by the said Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, the Freehold and Inheritance of and in the Lands and Hereditaments so purchased shall not (notwithstanding any Provisions in any of the Acts in force for regulating Turnpike Roads in *England*), by means of any such Purchase, or any Conveyance made in pursuance thereof, be vested in the said Trustees, but that the Freehold and Inheritance of and in the Lands and Hereditaments so purchased shall, notwithstanding such Purchase and Conveyance, remain and be vested in the Person or Persons in whom the same were vested immediately prior to such Purchase by the said Trustees; and the said Trustees shall, by means of such Purchase and Conveyance, or either of them, be entitled to a perpetual Right of Way in, over, or upon the Lands so purchased by them.

Trustees to have the same Power of cutting and digging as if they had purchased the Fee Simple of the Lands.

X. Provided also, and it is hereby further enacted, That the said Trustees shall have such and the same Power and Authority of cutting and digging and otherwise using the Lands and Hereditaments taken by them for the Purposes of this Act, and also of erecting any Toll House or other Building, or of building any Bridge thereon, as fully and effectually to all Intents and Purposes as the said Trustees would have had in case they had purchased the Fee Simple of the said Lands and Hereditaments.

If Land of Road is not wanted, the Freehold thereof to be in the former Owner.

XI. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That if at any Time any Land or Hereditaments purchased by the said Trustees for the Purposes of the Roads mentioned in this Act, or any of them, shall not be wanted for the same, then and in such Case the Right of Way in, over, or upon the said Lands or Hereditaments vested in the said Trustees shall cease, determine, and be extinguished, and the Freehold and Inheritance of the said Lands and Hereditaments shall be and remain in the Person or Persons then entitled to the same, freed and discharged of and from such Right of Way.

XII. And

And be it further enacted, That from and after the said Diversions intended to be made as herein-before mentioned, or any Part or Parts thereof, shall respectively be completed and open for the Passage of the Public, it shall be lawful for the said Trustees and they are hereby empowered, at any Special Meeting from Time to Time to be holden for that Purpose, (of which Meeting public Notice specifying the Time for holding the same and the Purpose thereof shall have been given in some Newspaper or Newspapers published or circulated in the said County of *Devon* or *Cornwall*, and also by affixing a Copy of such Notice on all the Turnpikes, Toll Gates, and Side Bars which shall be then standing on any of the Roads now made or which at the Time of giving such Notice shall have been made and completed by virtue of this Act, at least Fourteen Days before such Meeting,) to order that all or any such Part or Parts of the Roads included in this Act as shall lie between the Commencement and Termination of the said Diversions or any of them by this Act authorized or intended to be made, or of any Part or Parts thereof, and so completed as aforesaid, shall be no longer repaired out of the Monies received by virtue of the said recited Acts, or any or either of them, or to be received by virtue of this Act; and from and immediately after the making of any such Order the Trustees shall be discharged from the Care, Management, and future Repair of all or any such Part or Parts of the said Roads, and such Diversions shall be adopted and be deemed to be in lieu of such last-mentioned Part or Parts of the said Roads respectively: Provided also, that from and after the said new Line of Road intended to be made as herein-before mentioned, commencing either from the One Mile Stone in the *Tavistock* Road or at or near a Place called *Page's Cross*, herein-before mentioned, and terminating at or near *Taylor's Shop* aforesaid, shall be completed and open for the Passage of the Public, it shall be lawful for the said Trustees and they are hereby empowered, at any Special Meeting from Time to Time to be holden for that Purpose, (of which Meeting public Notice shall be given in manner last herein-before mentioned,) to order that the Whole or any Part of such Part of the present Road as commences at *Laburnick Cross* in the Parish of *Laxhitton*, and terminates at *Jonas's Shop* otherwise *Stag's Head* in the Parish of *Lezant* aforesaid, shall be no longer repaired out of the Monies received by virtue of the said recited Acts or any or either of them, or to be received by virtue of this Act; and immediately after the making of any such Order the Trustees shall be discharged from the Care, Management, and future Repair of the Whole or any such Part of the said present Road as last herein-before mentioned.

XIV. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, at their First or Second Meeting to be holden in pursuance of this Act, to elect and appoint any Number of Persons not exceeding Three in the whole, being duly qualified, to be Trustees for the Purposes of this Act, and such Persons, when so elected and appointed, shall have the same Powers and Authorities as if they had been nominated and appointed Trustees in and by this Act.

First Meeting of the Trustees.

XV. And be it further enacted, That the said Trustees shall hold their First Meeting at the Guildhall in the Town of *Launceston*, or at some other convenient House or Place on the Line of the said Roads, on the Fourth *Tuesday* next after the passing of this Act, or as soon after as conveniently may be, between the Hours of Ten of the Clock in the Forenoon and Four of the Clock in the Afternoon, and shall then and there proceed to put this Act and the General Turnpike Acts in execution, and shall then and there afterwards adjourn to and meet at such Time or Times, and such Place or Places on or near to the said Roads, as the said Trustees or the major Part of them present at any such Meetings shall think proper and appoint, so that Two General Meetings at the least shall be held during each Year within the Town or Borough of *Launceston*.



XVI. And be it further enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the said Trustees to continue all or any of the Toll Gates or Turnpikes, Toll Bars, Toll Houses, Side Bars, Chains, and Weighing Machines now erected upon the said Roads or upon the Sides thereof, and also to erect or build others in lieu thereof or in addition thereto upon any of the Roads comprised in this Act, or upon any Part or Parts thereof respectively, or upon the Sides thereof, when and where and as they shall judge proper, and from Time to Time to alter or to take down and re-erect or re-construct, or to discontinue and remove the same or any of them, as they the said Trustees shall think proper.

XVII. And be it further enacted, That it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or any Person or Persons appointed or continued or to be from Time to Time appointed by them a Collector or Collectors, Lessee or Lessees of Tolls, or otherwise authorized by them for that Purpose, to demand and take at each Toll Gate or Turnpike, Toll Bar, Toll House, Side Bar, and Chain, which now is or hereafter shall be erected or standing across or at the Sides of the said Roads by this Act authorized or directed to be made Turnpike, made, amended, widened, diverted, altered, improved, maintained, and kept in repair, on each and every Day, (such Day to be computed from Twelve of the Clock on one Night to Twelve of the Clock on the next succeeding Night,) before any Horse or other Beast or Cattle or Carriage shall be permitted to pass through any such Toll Gate, Toll Bar, Turnpike, Side Bar, or Chain, Tolls not exceeding the following; (that is to say,)

For every Horse or other Beast of Draught drawing any Coach, Chariot, Stage Coach, Barouche, Sociable, Phaeton, Break, Diligence, Omnibus, Berlin, Landau, Chaise, Curricule, Calash, Chair, Caravan, Van, Hearse, Litter, Car, Gig, or other such like Carriage, any Sum not exceeding Sixpence:

Tolls.

For every Horse or other Beast drawing any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, any Sum not exceeding Sixpence, except when employed in carrying or conveying Fuel or Lime as hereinafter mentioned:

For every Coach, Barouche, Chaise, or other Carriage with Four Wheels affixed to any Waggon or Cart, any Sum not exceeding One Shilling:

For every Carriage with Two Wheels affixed to any Waggon or Cart, any Sum not exceeding Sixpence:

For every Horse or other Beast, if more than One, drawing any Timber Carriage upon Three or Four Wheels of a less Breadth than Six Inches at the Bottom or Soles thereof, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Nine-pence:

For every Horse, Mule, or Ass, laden or unladen, and not drawing, any Sum not exceeding Three Halfpence:

For every Drove of Oxen, Cows, or Neat Cattle, any Sum not exceeding One Shilling and Three-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number:

And for every Drove of Calves, Goats, Swine, Sheep, or Lambs, any Sum not exceeding Ten-pence *per* Score, and so in proportion for any greater or less Number:

For



For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast drawing any Carriage, laden or unladen, when solely employed in carrying or conveying Coals, Wood for Fuel, or Fuel of any other Kind, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Three-pence :

For every Yoke of Oxen drawing any Waggon, Cart, or other Carriage, when solely employed as last aforesaid, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Four-pence :

For every Horse, Mule, or other Beast drawing any Carriage, laden or unladen, when solely employed in carrying or conveying Lime to be used for Manure, if the Fellies of the Wheels of such Carriage shall be of less Breadth than Four and a Half Inches, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of One Penny :

For every Carriage moved or propelled by Steam or Machinery, or by any other Power than Animal Power, any Sum not exceeding One Shilling :

For every Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such like Carriage, having the Nails of the Tire of the Wheels thereof projecting more than One Quarter of an Inch above such Tire, any Sum not exceeding the Sum of Ten Shillings :

Such last-mentioned Toll to be in lieu of any Penalty to which by virtue of an Act passed in the Fourth Year of the Reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth, intituled *An Act to explain and amend an Act passed in the Third Year of the Reign of His present Majesty, to amend the General Laws now in being for regulating Turnpike Roads in that Part of Great Britain called England*, the Owner or Driver of any such Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage would be subject or liable by reason or on account of the Nails of the Tire of the Wheels thereof projecting more than One Quarter of an Inch above such Tire :

And in all Cases when there shall be a fractional Part of One Half-penny in the Calculation or Amount of the Tolls hereby granted, or any of them, the Sum of One Halfpenny shall be demanded and taken in lieu of such fractional Part :

Which said Tolls shall be and they are hereby vested in the said Trustees, and the same shall be recovered, paid, and applied in manner by this Act directed.

Tolls to be paid but once a Day.

XVIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That after the respective Tolls shall have been paid for the passing of any Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage through any Turnpike or Gate to be continued or erected by virtue of this Act, such Horse, Cattle, Beast, or Carriage shall, upon producing a Ticket denoting such Payment on that Day, be permitted to pass Toll-free through the same Toll Gate, Turnpike, or Side Gate, and also through such other Gate or Gates (if any) as the Ticket for such Payment shall free, at any Time or Times during the same Day, such Day to be computed from Twelve of the Clock in one Night to Twelve of the Clock in the next succeeding Night, except as herein-after mentioned, any thing in this Act contained to the contrary thereof in anywise notwithstanding.

XIX. And be it further enacted, That no Toll shall be demanded or taken by virtue of this Act for any Horse or other Beast drawing any Carriage, laden or unladen, when solely employed in carrying or conveying Lime to be used as Manure, provided the Fellies of the Wheels of such Carriage shall be of a Breadth not less than Four and a Half Inches, nor shall any Toll be demanded or taken by virtue of this Act for any Horse or other Beast drawing any Carriage, laden or unladen, when solely employed in carrying or conveying any Furze, Peats, Turves, or Heaths for Fuel, not sold or for Sale, nor when solely employed in carrying or conveying any Sea Sand to be used as Manure.

XX. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for every Horse or other Beast drawing any Stage Coach, Omnibus, Car, Caravan, Stage Waggon, or any other Stage Carriage conveying Passengers or Goods for Hire or Reward, for each Time of passing or repassing along the said Roads: Provided nevertheless, that no further or additional Toll shall be payable in respect of the Horses or other Beasts drawing any such Stage Coach, Caravan, Stage Waggon, or other Stage Carriage, on account only of the Horses drawing the same having been changed.

Stage Carriages travelling for Hire, &c. to pay each Time of passing.

XXI. Provided also, and be it further enacted, That the Tolls hereby made payable shall be paid for every Horse or other Beast let out to Hire, and drawing any Post Chaise or other Carriage, for each Time of passing or repassing along the said Roads whenever any fresh Hiring thereof shall take place.

Post Chaises to pay on each fresh Hiring.

XXII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no more than Two full Tolls shall be demanded or taken from any Person or Persons for passing and repassing during the same Day, to be computed in manner aforesaid, with the same Horses, Cattle, or Carriages respectively, through all the Toll Gates or Toll Bars to be continued or erected by virtue of this Act upon the whole Extent of the said Roads, except upon the said *Holdsworthy* District of Roads; and no more than Two full Tolls shall be demanded or taken from any Person or Persons for passing and repassing during the same Day, to be computed in manner aforesaid, with the same Horses, Cattle, or Carriages respectively, through all the Toll Gates or Toll Bars to be erected by virtue of this Act upon the whole Extent of the said *Holdsworthy* District of Roads.

Limitation of Number of Tolls.

XXIII. Provided nevertheless, and be it further enacted, That if any Horse, Beast, or Cattle for which Toll shall have been paid at any of the said Toll Gates or Toll Bars shall return drawing another or a different Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other such Carriage, such Horse, Beast, or Cattle shall not be permitted to return through the same or any other Toll Gate or Toll Bar on the same Day without Toll being again paid for such Horse, Beast, or Cattle, if in so returning such Horse, Beast, or Cattle shall pass or travel upon any of the said Roads for the Distance of One hundred Yards or more.

No more Money to be laid out on Roads than is collected thereon.

XXIV. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Money arising from any of the Tolls mentioned in this Act shall be applied in or towards the Repair of any of the Roads authorized to be made by this Act, except in or towards the Repair of the said new Line of Road commencing either from the One Mile Stone on the *Tavistock* Road, or at or near a Place called *Page's Cross* aforesaid, and terminating at or near *Taylor's Shop* aforesaid, unless some Toll Gate, Toll Bar, or Turnpike shall be erected and continued upon each of such Roads, except as last herein-before excepted, or on the Side thereof, nor unless the said Tolls shall be demanded and taken thereat pursuant to the Powers and Provisions of this Act: Provided also, that no more Money shall be expended by the said Trustees in or towards the Repair of each of the said Roads (except in or towards the Repair of the said Road last herein-before excepted) than shall be collected thereat respectively, or borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls collected thereon.

Application of Tolls on Launceston District of Roads.

XXV. And be it further enacted, That the Monies already received and now in the Treasurer's Hands, or which shall be received under the Powers or Authorities of the said recited Acts hereby repealed, or any or either of them, and which shall be remaining and undisposed of on the Day of the Commencement of this Act, and also the Monies which shall arise and be produced within the *Launceston* District of Roads by and from the Tolls by this Act granted, and all other Monies which shall arise and be produced under or by virtue of this Act within the same District, shall be applied, in the first place, in defraying one Moiety of the Costs, Charges, and Expences incident to or attending the preparing, applying for, and obtaining this Act, together with one Moiety of the Interest for any Money paid and advanced for such Purposes; in the next place, in paying and discharging the Interest of all Sums of Money now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said recited Acts hereby repealed, or any or either of them, together with the Interest of all Sums of Money which shall hereafter be borrowed or taken at Interest on the Security of the Tolls arising within the said *Launceston* District of Roads hereby granted, and in defraying the Expence of continuing, providing, erecting, and keeping in repair the Turnpikes, Toll Houses, and other Buildings, and in making Turnpike, making, amending, widening, diverting, altering, improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair the said Roads within the same District by this Act authorized to be made or kept in repair as aforesaid, and all Works and Conveniences thereunto belonging or appertaining; and the Residue of the Money so already received, or to be collected and received, shall be applied in paying all Principal Monies now due and owing on the Credit of the Tolls granted by the said recited Acts hereby repealed, or any or either of them, and which shall be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls arising within the same District hereby granted, and in defraying all other Costs, Charges, and Expences attending the same, in such Manner as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time appoint.

Application of Tolls on the Holds

XXVI. And be it further enacted, That all Monies which shall arise and be produced by and from the Tolls by this Act granted, and



all other Monies which shall arise and be produced under or by virtue of this Act within the *Holdsworthy* District of Roads, shall be applied, in the first place, in defraying one Moiety of the Costs, Charges, and Expences incident to or attending the preparing, applying for, and obtaining this Act, together with one Moiety of the Interest for any Money paid and advanced for such Purposes; in the next place, in paying and discharging the Interest of all Sums of Money which shall hereafter be borrowed or taken at Interest on the Security of the Tolls of the said *Holdsworthy* District of Roads hereby granted; and in defraying the Expence of providing, erecting, and keeping in repair the Turnpikes, Toll Houses, and other Buildings, and in making Turnpike, making, amending, widening, diverting, altering, improving, maintaining, and keeping in repair the Roads within the same District by this Act authorized to be made or kept in repair as aforesaid, and all Works and Conveniences thereunto belonging or appertaining; and the Residue of the Money so to be collected and received shall be applied in paying all Principal Monies which shall be borrowed on the Credit of the Tolls of the same District hereby granted, and in defraying all other Costs, Charges, and Expences relating solely to the same District, in such Manner as the said Trustees shall from Time to Time appoint.

XXVII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That none of the Tolls authorized by this Act to be taken upon the said Roads, nor any of the Monies raised by virtue of the said recited Acts or to be raised by virtue of this Act, shall be laid out or expended in the Repair or Improvement of the Streets of any Town through which the said Roads shall pass, nor shall any Tolls be collected therein by virtue of this Act: Provided always, that nothing herein contained shall extend or be construed to extend to prohibit the Trustees from taking Toll at any such Turnpike or Toll Gate as has been erected therein previous to the First Day of *January* One thousand eight hundred and thirty-five, nor to prevent the Trustees from setting up new Gates or Bars, or erecting any Toll House or Houses, as may be required, in the Place and Stead of those which are now standing, for the Purpose of taking and receiving Tolls.

XXVIII. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall authorize or empower the levying, taking, or demanding of any Toll at or upon any Line of Road hereby made Turnpike or authorized to be made, until the whole of the same Line of Road shall be properly made and completed and opened to the Public, and shall be certified by Two or more Justices of the Peace for the Counties of *Devon* or *Cornwall* to have been so made and completed, and a Certificate thereof under their Hands shall be filed with the respective Clerks of the Peace for the said Counties of *Devon* and *Cornwall*.

XXXI. And be it further enacted, That the Weights to be allowed to Carts or other such Carriages drawn by One Horse or Beast shall never exceed the following; (that is to say,) from the First Day of *May* to the Thirty-first Day of *October*, both Days inclusive, One Ton and Ten Hundred Weight for each such Carriage and the Lading thereof, and from the First Day of *November* to the Thirtieth Day of *April*, both Days inclusive, One Ton and Five Hundred Weight for each such Carriage and the Lading thereof.

Weight for Single-horse Carts limited.

XXXII. And be it further enacted, That all Carts or other such Carriages passing along the said Roads, drawn by only One Horse or Beast, may be weighed at any Weighing Machine on the said Roads, and the like additional Tolls may be demanded and recovered for the Overweight thereof as are by Law payable in respect of the Overweight of Carts or other Carriages drawn by Two or more Horses; and all the Powers, Regulations, and Penalties now in force relating to the weighing of Carts or other Carriages drawn by Two or more Horses shall be applicable to Carts or other such Carriages passing on the said Roads drawn by only One Horse or Beast, and to the Owners and Drivers thereof respectively, and all Waggons, Wains, Carts, or other such Carriages not drawn by any Horse or Beast, but impelled or drawn by Steam or Machinery, shall and may also be weighed at any such Weighing Machine; and all and every the Clauses, and all the Provisions, Powers, and Regulations, now in force for regulating the Weights of Waggons, Wains, Carts, or other Carriages in *England*, and imposing additional Tolls for Overweights, shall be and be deemed to apply to Waggons, Wains, Carts, and other such Carriages not drawn by any Horse or Beast, but impelled and drawn by Steam or Machinery, and to the Driver, Masters and Drivers and Owners thereof respectively.

One-horse Carts, &c. may be weighed.

XXXIII. And whereas great Injury may be done to the said Roads by the Farmers or Renters of the Tolls accepting an inadequate Composition for the Tolls of Carriages by Law liable to be weighed and to be charged in respect of Overweight; be it therefore enacted, That if any Lessee, Farmer, or Renter shall make any Composition by the Year or otherwise with any Person or Persons whomsoever for or in lieu of the Tolls of any Waggon, Wain, Cart, or other Carriage by Law liable to be weighed and charged for or in respect of the Overweight thereof, every such Lessee, Farmer, or

Penalties on Renters of Tolls compounding for Overweight.



Renter, Deputy or Agent, shall, on Conviction thereof by Confession or upon the Oath of any Witness before any of His Majesty's Justices of the Peace for either of the Counties through which the said Roads may pass, forfeit and pay, besides the Costs and Charges attending the Conviction, a Sum of Money not exceeding Ten Pounds, and shall also forfeit his or her Contract or Lease for renting the Tolls, if the said Trustees shall think proper to order that the same shall be thereupon made void, and every such Composition shall be and the same is hereby declared to be null and void; and One Moiety of every such Penalty shall be paid to the Informer, and the Remainder thereof to the Surveyor or Treasurer of the said Roads, to be employed towards the Repair thereof.

No Inclosures to be made, or Materials for Buildings to be laid on Roads, without Consent of Trustees.

XXXIV. And whereas Persons, without sufficient Leave for that Purpose, inclose or otherwise occupy Part of the said Roads for the making of Mortar, and for depositing Bricks, Lime, Timber, and other Materials, and Filth and other offensive Matter, to the great Annoyance of Passengers and Carriages, and to the Detriment of the said Roads; be it therefore enacted, That if any Person shall erect, build, or set up any Inclosure, Post, Bar, or Rail, or shall deposit any Stone, Bricks, Lime, Timber, Gravel, Sand, Dung, or other Matter, Materials or Thing, in or upon any Part of the said Roads or Footpaths, without the Consent of the said Trustees in Writing first obtained, or beyond such Bounds or Limits as shall be expressed in such Consent, or shall continue the same beyond the Time allowed by the said Trustees, the Owner or Offender shall forfeit and pay a Sum of Money not exceeding Forty Shillings; and it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, or their Surveyor or Agent, to cause the same to be removed and deposited in such Place or Places as the said Trustees shall direct, there to be detained until the Owner or Offender shall have paid and discharged all Costs, Charges, and Expences attending the removing, depositing, and detaining the same as aforesaid, such Costs, Charges, and Expences being first ascertained by some Justice of the Peace of the Counties of *Devon*, or *Cornwall* or Borough of *Launceston*, within which the said Offence shall be committed; and in case the said Owner or Offender shall neglect or omit to pay such Costs, Charges, and Expences within Five Days after the same shall be so ascertained it shall be lawful for the said Trustees or their Surveyor to sell all such Materials, Matters, and Things, and to reimburse themselves and himself such Costs, Charges, and Expences as aforesaid, and all Expences attending such Sale or Sales, rendering the Overplus (if any) to such Owner or Offender, on Demand.

For preventing Drains, &c. being allowed to run across the Roads.

XXXV. And whereas the Occupiers of adjacent Houses, Buildings, and Lands sometimes, to the great Damage of the Roads, suffer Water, Filth, and other offensive Matter to run or flow from the said Houses, Buildings, and Lands into or upon the said Roads; be it therefore enacted, That if any Water, Filth, Dirt, or other offensive Matter or Thing whatsoever, shall be suffered to run or flow into or upon the said Roads or Footpaths from any House, Building, Erection, Lands or Premises adjacent thereto, the Owner or Occupier of such House, Building, Erection, Lands, and Premises shall for every such



Offence forfeit and pay a Sum of Money not exceeding Forty Shillings; and in case such Owner or Occupier shall not, within Three Days after receiving Notice thereof from the said Trustees, their Surveyor or Agent, stop such Water, Filth, Dirt, or other offensive Matter or Thing, from running or flowing into or upon the said Roads or Footpaths, then and in such Case each Day of the Continuance of such Nuisance after the Expiration of the said Three Days shall be deemed and construed to be a separate Offence.

XXXVI. And be it further enacted, That where any Pit or Shaft shall have been sunk or made for the Purpose of working any Mines, Quarries, or other Works within the Distance of Two hundred Yards of any Part of the said Roads, it shall be lawful for the said Trustees, and for such other Person or Persons as they shall appoint, and they are hereby respectively empowered, when and as often as they shall think necessary, to enter upon the Land or Ground where such Pits or Shafts shall be so sunk or made as aforesaid, and to descend into the Mines, Quarries, and Works within or under the same, and for that Purpose to have the free Use of all or any of the Shafts, Windlasses, Ropes, Engines, Gins, Machinery, and other Things then in use within, about, or belonging to the said Mines, Quarries, and Works, both in descending into the said Mines, Quarries, and Works respectively, and in ascending from the same or any of them, for the Purpose of inspecting the said Mines, Quarries, and Works, as such Trustees or other Person or Persons as aforesaid shall think necessary; and if any Person or Persons as aforesaid shall wilfully obstruct or molest any such Trustee or other Person as aforesaid in the Inspection of any such Mine, Quarry, or Work, such Person shall for every such Offence forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Ten Pounds.

Power to enter Mines within 200 Yards of Road.

XXXVII. And be it further enacted, That if any Person shall water any of the said Roads or Footpaths without the Consent and under the Direction of the said Trustees or their Surveyor, such Person shall forfeit and pay any Sum not exceeding Twenty Shillings for every such Offence.

To prevent watering Roads without Consent of Trustees.

XXXVIII. And be it further enacted, That all and every Leases and Lease or Letting of the Tolls arising on the said Roads granted and made or agreed upon by the Trustees for executing the said recited Acts and the several Covenants thereof shall, notwithstanding the Repeal of the said recited Acts, remain and continue in full Force and Effect until the Expiration of the Term thereby respectively granted or agreed for, or until any other legal Determination of any such Lease or Letting, and the same and the respective Grantees shall be subject to the Powers and Provisions of this Act, in the same Manner as if such Leases or Lease or Letting had been granted or made or agreed upon by the Trustees for executing this Act, and as if the Trustees granting, making, or agreeing upon the same had been Trustees for executing this Act; and the Tolls payable and received immediately before the passing of this Act at the Gates erected on or by the Sides of the said Roads, and none others, shall continue to be paid and received until the Expiration of the said Leases at the

Present Leases to continue in force.

End



End of the current Year of their Term, when the same will expire by Effluxion of Time.

Empowering Surveyor General of the Duchy of Cornwall to contract for the Sale of a Right of Way over Lands belonging to the said Duchy.

XXXIX. And whereas Part of the Lands and Hereditaments required for the Purposes of this Act belong to and form Part of the Duchy of *Cornwall*; be it therefore enacted, That it shall and may be lawful for the Surveyor General for the Time being of the said Duchy, together with the respective Owners of all Land called and being Assessionable Duchy, to contract and agree with the said Trustees for the absolute Sale to them, at the best Prices that can be procured for the same, of the Right to make the said several Diversions and new Lines of Road, or any Part of them, over all Lands and Hereditaments required for the Purposes of this Act, belonging to and forming Parcel of the said Duchy, and for Compensation for Damages (if any) done thereto by reason of such Sale.

Contracts for Duchy Lands not to be made but under special Warrant from the Commissioners.

XL. Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no such Contract by the said Surveyor General with the said Trustees shall be good, unless the Terms thereof shall be sanctioned by a special Warrant to be issued for that Purpose by the special Commissioners for managing the Affairs of the said Duchy of *Cornwall*, or any Three or more of them, for the Time being.

Monies payable to the Duchy shall be paid into the Bank of England.

XLI. And be it further enacted, That the Monies which shall be contracted and agreed to be paid to the said Duchy for and in respect of such Sale and Compensation shall from Time to Time be paid by the said Trustees into the Bank of *England*, to be there received by the Cashiers of the Bank, and accounted for and invested in the Manner herein-after directed.

Monies received by the Duchy to be carried to their Account at the Bank of England.

XLII. And be it further enacted, That the Governor and Directors of the Bank of *England* shall and they are hereby required to carry to the Credit of the Account now open in their Books under the Title of "The Account of the Duchy of *Cornwall*," the several Monies directed as aforesaid to be paid to the Cashiers of the Bank of *England*; and whensoever it shall be agreed or ascertained in manner aforesaid that any Sum of Money is to be paid to the said Duchy by the said Trustees for such Sale as aforesaid, or for such Compensation and Satisfaction as herein-before mentioned, such Surveyor General shall grant unto the said Trustees a Certificate under his Hand, specifying the Amount of the Monies contracted or agreed to be paid to the said Duchy of *Cornwall*, and specifying also the Lands in respect of which such Monies are to be paid; and the said Cashiers of the Bank of *England* or One of them shall, upon the Production of such Certificate, accept and receive from the said Trustees the Monies therein specified, and at the Foot or on the Back of such Certificate acknowledge the Receipt of the said Monies without Fee or Reward; and the said Certificate and Receipt shall be afterwards brought to the Office of the Auditor of the Duchy of *Cornwall*, and be there forthwith enrolled in proper Books to be provided and kept for that Purpose; separate and apart from the other Business and Proceedings of the said Office; and the said Auditor or his lawful Deputy, having enrolled the Certificate and Receipt, shall attest the same under his Hand,



Hand, and return the said Certificate and Receipt to the said Trustees; and from and immediately after such Enrolment, and thenceforth for ever, the said Trustees and their Successors shall by force of this Act be adjudged, deemed, and taken to be in the actual Possession of the Right so by the said Trustees purchased (subject to any existing Lease or Leases), and shall exercise and enjoy the same peaceably and quietly.

XLIII. And be it further enacted, That all and every Sums and Sum of Money which shall be paid into the Bank of *England* under or by virtue of this Act on account of the Duchy of *Cornwall* shall from Time to Time be laid out, by Order of the special Commissioners for managing the Affairs of the said Duchy for the Time being, in the Purchase of Three Pounds *per Centum* Consolidated Bank Annuities in the Name of the Duke of *Cornwall*, in which Name the Governor and Company of the Bank of *England* are hereby required to permit Transfers to be made of the Annuities so to be purchased, and they are also required to permit such Transfers to be accepted by the Receiver General for the Time being of the Duchy of *Cornwall* or his Deputy for or in the Name of the Duke of *Cornwall*, and such Receiver General or his Deputy is hereby required to accept the same accordingly; and all and singular the Annuities so to be purchased and accepted shall remain vested in the Name of the Duke of *Cornwall*, and shall not be transferred or transferrable to any Person or Persons whomsoever; and all the Dividends thereof shall from Time to Time be paid by the said Governor and Company of the Bank of *England* into the Hands of the said Receiver General for the Time being of the Duchy of *Cornwall* or his Deputy, and shall by force and virtue of this Act be deemed and taken by Law to be Part of the Revenues of the said Duchy of *Cornwall*, and shall be from Time to Time answered, accounted for, applied, and appropriated to such and the same Uses and Purposes as the other Revenues of the said Duchy of *Cornwall*.

Application of the Monies to be paid into the Bank to the Account of the Duchy of Cornwall.

XLIV. And be it further enacted, That nothing in this Act contained shall extend or be construed to extend to the Alienation of any Soil or Mineral, or to prejudice or derogate from the Estate, Right, Title, Interests, Privileges, or Authority of the King's most Excellent Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in right or in respect of His Duchy of *Cornwall*, or of the Duke of *Cornwall* for the Time being, or of the Tenants of His said Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, or of the Duke of *Cornwall* for the Time being, of any Part or Parcel of the Tenements of the said Duchy, nor at any Time or Times be admitted in any Court of Law or Equity, or otherwise considered as Evidence upon any Occasion to be admitted against or to affect in any Manner such Rights of His Majesty, His Heirs and Successors, in right or in respect of His said Duchy of *Cornwall*, or the Duke of *Cornwall* for the Time being, other than the said Right to make the said several Diversions and new Lines of Road herein-before mentioned.

General Saving of Duchy Rights.

XLV. And be it further enacted, That all Penalties and Forfeitures imposed by this Act shall and may be recovered, levied, and applied

in such and the same Manner as any Penalty or Forfeiture for any Offence on any Turnpike Road may by any Law or Statute relating to Turnpike Roads be recovered, levied, and applied.

Rule for Construction of certain Expressions in the Act.

XLVI. And be it further enacted, That wherever in this Act any Word or Words is or are used importing the Singular Number or the Masculine Gender only, such Word or Words shall extend to and shall be construed to include several Persons as well as One Person, and Females as well as Males, and a Body or Bodies Politic, Corporate, or Collegiate, Corporation or Corporations Aggregate or Sole, as well as Individuals, unless it be otherwise specially directed or provided for.

Public Act.

XLVII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be deemed and taken to be a Public Act, and shall be judicially taken notice of as such by all Judges, Justices, and others.

Term of Act.

XLVIII. And be it further enacted, That this Act shall commence and take effect upon the passing thereof, and shall thenceforth continue and be in force and be executed for and during the Term of Thirty-one Years, and from thence to the End of the then next Session of Parliament.
