



CHAPTER 33.

An Act to remove doubts as to the applicability of the Church Building Acts and New Parishes Acts to the Isle of Man. A.D. 1897.
[6th August 1897.]

WHEREAS doubts have been entertained as to whether and how far the Church Building Acts and the New Parishes Acts extend to the Isle of Man, and it is expedient to remove such doubts :

Be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows :

1. The Church Building Acts, 1818 to 1884, and the New Parishes Acts, 1843 to 1884, shall be construed as not extending to the Isle of Man.

Removal of doubts as to applicability of Church Building Acts and New Parishes Acts to Isle of Man.

Provided that any order made for the Isle of Man under any of those Acts before the passing of this Act shall, unless it has before that date been declared invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, be valid, but may be revoked or altered by or in pursuance of an Act of Tynwald.

2. This Act may be cited as the Isle of Man (Church Building and New Parishes) Act, 1897. Short title.
