CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION AND SUPERVISION AND COMMON SERVICES

Functions of the Secretary of State

[32A] ^{F1}Grants for expenditure on safeguarding national security.

- (1) The Secretary of State may make grants in respect of expenditure incurred (or to be incurred) by a police authority or [^{F2}joint police board]] in connection with safeguarding national security.
- (2) Grants under this section may be made either unconditionally or subject to conditions.
- [^{F3}(3) Subject to subsection (4), the Secretary of State shall exercise his powers under this section only with the approval of the Treasury.
- (4) Where the powers under this section are exercised by the Scottish Ministers (by virtue of provision made under section 63 of the Scotland Act 1998), subsection (3) shall not apply.]
