CHAPTER 3

GUARDIANSHIP OF MINORS ACT 1971

General principles

- Principle on which questions relating to custody, upbringing etc. of minors are to be decided. Appointment, removal and powers of guardians Rights of surviving parent as to guardianship. Power of father and mother to appoint testamentary guardians. Power of court to appoint guardian for minor having no parent etc. Power of High Court to remove or replace guardian. Disputes between joint guardians. Orders for custody and maintenance Orders for [legal custody] and maintenance on application of mother or
