In section 233(2) of the ^{M1}Road Traffic Act 1960, . . . ^{F3} and section 65(3) of the ^{M2}Public Passenger Vehicles Act 1981, for the words “ “forges” means forges within the meaning of the Forgery Act, 1913.” there shall be substituted the words “ “forges” means makes a false document or other thing in order that it may be used as genuine.”
