PART II

SUPPLY OF SERVICES

12 The contracts concerned.

- (1) In this Act a “[^{F1}relevant contract for the supply of a service]” means, subject to subsection (2) below, a contract under which a person (“the supplier”) agrees to carry out a service[^{F2}, other than a contract to which Chapter 4 of Part 1 of the Consumer Rights Act 2015 applies.]
- (2) For the purposes of this Act, a contract of service or apprenticeship is not a [^{F1}relevant contract for the supply of a service].
- (3) Subject to subsection (2) above, a contract is a [^{F1}relevant contract for the supply of a service] for the purposes of this Act whether or not goods are also—
 - (a) transferred or to be transferred, or
 - (b) bailed or to be bailed by way of hire,under the contract, and whatever is the nature of the consideration for which the service is to be carried out.
- (4) The Secretary of State may by order provide that one or more of sections 13 to 15 below shall not apply to services of a description specified in the order, and such an order may make different provision for different circumstances.
- (5) The power to make an order under subsection (4) above shall be exercisable by statutory instrument subject to annulment in pursuance of a resolution of either House of Parliament.
