1982 CHAPTER 3

An Act to replace section 1(1) of the Decimal Currency Act 1967 so as to sanction references to the new penny as the penny. [2nd February 1982]

1 Denominations of money.

- (1) The denominations of money in the currency of the United Kingdom shall be the pound sterling and the penny or new penny, being one hundredth part of a pound sterling.
- (2) Section 1(1) of the ^{M1}Decimal Currency Act 1967 (which is superseded by subsection (1) above) is hereby repealed.
