## LEGAL AID

#### Legal aid complaints

### 40 Legal aid complaints: preliminary.

- (1) For the purposes of this Part of this Act a legal aid complaint is a complaint relating to the conduct of a barrister or solicitor in connection with [<sup>F1</sup>the provision for any person of services under the Legal Aid Act 1988 including, in the case of a solicitor, provision for any person of such services in the capacity of agent for that person's solicitor.]
- (2) In this Part—

"legally assisted person" means a person to whom aid is ordered to be given under section 28 of the <sup>MI</sup>Legal Aid Act 1974;

"the Senate" means the Senate of the Inns of Court and the Bar; and

"Senate Disciplinary Tribunal" means any committee of the Senate which in accordance with the regulations of the Senate is to be known as a Disciplinary Tribunal.

(3) In the Legal Aid Act 1974, sections 12(3) to (5) and 38(2) to (6) (which are superseded by this Part) shall cease to have effect.
