PART IV

CONTROL OF CERTAIN FORMS OF AIR POLLUTION

33 Cable burning.

- (1) A person who burns insulation from a cable with a view to recovering metal from the cable shall be guilty of an offence unless the burning is part of a process subject to Part I of the ^{M1}Environmental Protection Act 1990 [^{F1}or an activity subject to regulations under section 2 of the Pollution Prevention and Control Act 1999][^{F2}or section 18 of the Regulatory Reform (Scotland) Act 2014].
- (2) A person guilty of an offence under this section shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale.
