## 1995 CHAPTER 18

### PART III

#### MISCELLANEOUS AND SUPPLEMENTAL

#### 31 Termination of awards.

- (1) Regulations may make provision allowing, in prescribed circumstances, an award of income support to be brought to an end by [<sup>F1</sup>the Secretary of State] where the person to whom it was made, or where he is a member of a married or unmarried couple his partner, will be entitled to a jobseeker's allowance if the award is brought to an end.
- (2) Regulations may make provision allowing, in prescribed circumstances, an award of a jobseeker's allowance to be brought to an end by [<sup>F1</sup>the Secretary of State] where the person to whom it was made, or where he is a member of a married or unmarried couple his partner, will be entitled to income support if the award is brought to an end.
- (3) In this section "partner" means the other member of the couple concerned.
