JUSTICES OF THE PEACE

Protection and indemnification of justices and justices' clerks

34 Costs in legal proceedings **E+W**

- (1) A court may not order a justice of the peace to pay costs in any proceedings in respect of what he does or omits to do in the execution (or purported execution) of his duty as a justice of the peace.
- - (3) But [^{F2}subsection (1) does] not apply in relation to any proceedings in which a justice of the peace ^{F3}...—
 - (a) is being tried for an offence or is appealing against a conviction, or
 - (b) is proved to have acted in bad faith in respect of the matters giving rise to the proceedings.
 - (4) A court which is prevented by subsection (1) [^{F4}from ordering a justice of the peace] to pay costs in any proceedings may instead order the Lord Chancellor to make a payment in respect of the costs of a person in the proceedings.
 - (5) The Lord Chancellor may [^{F5}, after consulting the Lord Chief Justice,] make regulations specifying—
 - (a) circumstances in which a court must or must not exercise the power conferred on it by subsection (4), and
 - (b) how the amount of any payment ordered under subsection (4) is to be determined.
- [^{F6}(6) The Lord Chief Justice may nominate a judicial office holder (as defined in section 109(4) of the Constitutional Reform Act 2005) to exercise his functions under this section.]
