Consequences of issue of gender recognition certificate etc.

[^{F1}11D Continuity of civil partnership: Scotland

The continuity of a protected Scottish civil partnership is not affected by the issuing of [^{F2}a full gender recognition certificate to either (or both) of the civil partners.]
