2005 CHAPTER 12

Constitution of inquiry

1 Power to establish inquiry

- (1) A Minister may cause an inquiry to be held under this Act in relation to a case where it appears to him that—
 - (a) particular events have caused, or are capable of causing, public concern, or
 - (b) there is public concern that particular events may have occurred.
- (2) In this Act “Minister” means—
 - (a) a United Kingdom Minister;
 - (b) the Scottish Ministers;
 - (c) a Northern Ireland Minister;and references to a Minister also include references to the National Assembly for Wales.
- (3) References in this Act to an inquiry, except where the context requires otherwise, are to an inquiry under this Act.
