## XI. GENERAL PROVISIONS

J<sup>F1</sup>Any member of the Board for the time being who is a Solicitor or other individual engaged in any profession or business shall be entitled to charge and be paid all usual professional or other charges for business done and time spent and services rendered by him or his firm in the execution of the trusts and powers hereof whether in the ordinary course of his profession or business or not and although not of a nature requiring the employment of a Solicitor or other professional person
