

Chartered Associations (Protection of Names and Uniforms) Act 1926

1926 CHAPTER 26

3 Savings.

No Order in Council shall be made under this Act protecting any article (other than a badge or decoration) used by an association in connection with or as part of the uniform of its members in respect of which or any part of which any design shall have been registered under the Patents and Designs Act, 1907, or any amendment thereof, unless the owner of such registered design shall without fee or reward be ready and willing to permit and shall permit the use of such registered design by any person, firm, or corporation willing to supply such article to any member or members of such association.

Nothing in this Act shall prevent the continued use of any mark or device which has been bona fide used as a trade mark before the coming into force of this Act.
