



Anglo-Portuguese Commercial Treaty Act 1914

1914 CHAPTER 15 and 6 Geo 5

1 Meaning of “port” and “madeira” as applied to wine.

The description “port” or “madeira” applied to any wine or other liquor, other than wine the produce of Portugal and the island of Madeira respectively, shall be deemed to be a false trade description within the meaning of [^{F1}the ^{M1}Trade Descriptions Act 1968], and that Act shall have effect accordingly:
