



# Anglo-Portuguese Commercial Treaty Act 1916

1916 CHAPTER 39 6 and 7 Geo 5

## 1 Further limitation of the use of the description “port.” **U.K.**

- (1) The description “port” applied to wine the produce of Portugal, imported into the United Kingdom after the commencement of this Act, shall be deemed to be a false trade description within the meaning of [<sup>F1</sup>the <sup>M1</sup>Trade Descriptions Act 1968], if the wine on importation into the United Kingdom was not accompanied by a certificate issued by the competent Portuguese authorities to the effect that it was a wine to which by the law of Portugal the description “port” may be applied, and that Act shall have effect accordingly:

- (2) This provision is in addition to and not in derogation of any of the provisions contained in the principal Act.
