CHAPTER 49

JEWS RELIEF ACT 1858

- I Power to either House of Parliament to modify the Form of Oath to be taken instead of the Oaths of Allegiance, &c. by a Person professing the Jewish Religion, to entitle him to sit and vote in such House.
- II As to the Form of Oath in other Cases.
- III Act not to enable Persons professing the Jewish Religion to hold certain Offices.
- IV Rights of Presentation to any Ecclesiastical Benefice possessed by Persons professing the Jewish Religion to devolve upon the Archbishop of Canterbury for the Time being.
