

Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1859

1859 CHAPTER 19 22 and 23 Vict

I Repeal of Duty to take Oath. U.K.

So much of the herein-before recited Act of Parliament, and of all Charters, Letters Patent, Orders in Council, Obligations, Deeds, or Instruments, as imposes upon the said Mayor, Aldermen, and Citizens, or any of them, or any Municipal Officer of the City of Oxford, the Obligation of taking any Oath for the Conservation of the Liberties and Privileges of the University of Oxford, or any such Oath as is hereinbefore referred to, shall be and the same is hereby repealed and annulled and made void.

Modifications etc. (not altering text)

The "herein-before recited Act of Parliament" means Oxford and Cambridge Act 1571 (c. 29)
