# 1875 CHAPTER 86 38 and 39 Vict

An Act for amending the Law relating to Conspiracy, and to the Protection of Property, and for other purposes. [13th August 1875]

#### 1 Short title.

This Act may be cited as "The Conspiracy, and Protection of Property Act 1875."

# [F23 Amendment of law as to conspiracy in trade disputes.

An agreement or combination by two or more persons to do or procure to be done any act in contemplation or furtherance of [F3a trade dispute]... F4 shall not be indictable as a conspiracy if such act committed by one person would not be punishable as a crime.

Nothing in this section shall exempt from punishment any persons guilty of a conspiracy for which a punishment is awarded by any Act of Parliament.

Nothing in this section shall affect the law relating to riot, unlawful assembly, breach of the peace, or sedition, or any offence against the State or the Sovereign.

A crime for the purposes of this section means an offence punishable on indictment, or an offence which is punishable on summary conviction, and for the commission of which the offender is liable under the statute making the offence punishable to be imprisoned either absolutely or at the discretion of the court as an alternative for some other punishment.

Where a person is convicted of any such agreement or combination as aforesaid to do or procure to be done an act which is punishable only on summary conviction, and is sentenced to imprisonment, the imprisonment shall not exceed three months, or such longer time, if any, as may have been prescribed by the statute for the punishment of the said act when committed by one person.]

# 5 Breach of contract involving injury to persons or property.

Where any person wilfully and maliciously breaks a contract of service or of hiring, knowing or having reasonable cause to believe that the probable consequences of his so doing, either alone or in combination with others, will be to endanger human life, or cause serious bodily injury, or to expose valuable property whether real or personal to destruction or serious injury, he shall on conviction thereof by a court of summary jurisdiction, . . . <sup>F7</sup> be liable either to pay a penalty not exceeding [F8]evel 2 on the standard scale], or to be imprisoned for a term not exceeding three months, . . . <sup>F9</sup>

# 6 Penalty for neglect by master to provide food, clothing, &c., for servant or apprentice.

Where a master, being legally liable to provide for his servant or apprentice necessary food, clothing, medical aid, or lodging, wilfully and without lawful excuse refuses or neglects to provide the same, whereby the health of the servant or apprentice is or is likely to be seriously or permanently injured, he shall on summary conviction be liable either to pay a penalty not exceeding [F10] evel 2 on the standard scale], or to be imprisoned for a term not exceeding six months, . . . F11

# 7 Penalty for intimidation or annoyance by violence or otherwise.

Every person who, with a view to compel any other person to abstain from doing or to do any act which such other person has a legal right to do or abstain from doing, wrongfully and without legal authority,—

- (1) Uses violence to or intimidates such other person or his wife or children, or injures his property; or,
- (2) Persistently follows such other person about from place to place; or
- (3) Hides any tools, clothes, or other property owned or used by such other person, or deprives him of or hinders him in the use thereof; or
- (4) Watches or besets the house or other place where such other person resides, or works, or carries on business, or happens to be, or the approach to such house or place; or,
- (5) Follows such other person with two or more other persons in a disorderly manner in or through any street or road,
  - ... [F12 shall be liable on summary conviction to imprisonment for a term not exceeding 6 months or a fine not exceeding level 5 on the standard scale or both.]
  - [F13A constable may arrest without warrant anyone he reasonablysuspects is committing an offence under this section.]

# **8** Reduction of penalties

**Textual Amendments** 

Where in any Act relating to employers or workmen a pecuniary penalty is imposed in respect of any offence under such Act, and no power is given to reduce such penalty, the justices or court having jurisdiction in respect of such offence may, if they think it just so to do, impose by way of penalty in respect of such offence any sum not less than one-fourth of the penalty imposed by such Act.

The word "maliciously" used in reference to any offence under this Act shall be construed in the same manner as it is required by the fifty-eighth section of the MIMalicious Damage Act 1861, to be construed in reference to any offence committed under such last-mentioned Act.

# 21 Application to Ireland

This Act shall extend to Ireland, with the modifications following; that is to say,

The expression "municipal authority" shall be construed to mean the town council of any borough for the time being subject to the <sup>M4</sup>Municipal Corporations (Ireland) Act 1840, and any commissioners invested by any general or local Act of Parliament, with power of improving, cleansing, lighting, or paving any town or township.
