C A P. LIX.

An Act to continue until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and forty-three an Act for authorizing Her Majesty to carry into immediate Execution, by Orders in Council, any Treaties for the Suppression of the Slave Trade. [30th July 1842.]

THEREAS an Act was passed in the First and Second Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to revive and continue until Six Months after the 1 & 2 Vict. Commencement of the next Session of Parliament, and to amend, an c. 102. Act for authorizing Her Majesty to carry into immediate Execution, by Orders in Council, any Treaties made for the Suppression of the Slave Trade: And whereas the said Act was further continued by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament: And whereas it is expedient that the said Act should be further continued; be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Recited Act Authority of the same, That the said recited Act, and all the further con-Powers, tinued.

Powers, Provisions, Matters, and Things therein contained, shall continue in force until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and forty-three.
