An Act to continue until the First Day of *October*
One thousand eight hundred and forty-three
certain Turnpike Acts. [30th *July* 1842.]

WHEREAS an Act was passed in the Fourth Year of the
Reign of Her Majesty, intituled *An Act for removing* 4 & 5 Vict.
c. 9.
Doubts as to the Continuance of certain Local Turnpike
Acts, whereby all the Local Acts for regulating, making, amending,
or repairing Turnpike Roads in *Great Britain* (except as therein
excepted), which, unless continued by some Public General Act,
would have expired with the Session of Parliament in the Year One
thousand eight hundred and thirty-four, or at any Time since, and
at or before the End of the Session of the Year One thousand eight
hundred and forty-one, were further continued: And whereas the said
and also other like Acts will expire at the End of this Session of
Parliament: And whereas it is expedient that all the said Acts be
further continued; be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent
Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual
and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled,

and by the Authority of the same, That all the said Acts (except as excepted in the first-recited Act) shall continue in force until the First Day of *October* in the Year One thousand eight hundred and forty-three.

Act may be
amended

II. And be it enacted, That this Act may be amended or repealed by any Act to be passed in this Session of Parliament.
