## C A P. LXIII.

An Act to continue until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and forty-three an Act for carrying into effect a Convention between Her Majesty and the King of the French relative to the Fisheries on the Coasts of the British Islands and of France. [30th July 1842.]

HEREAS an Act was passed in the Second and Third Years of the Reign of Her present Majesty, intituled An Act to authorize Her Majesty, until Six Months after 2& 3 Vict. the Commencement of the next Session of Parliament, to carry into c. 96. effect a Convention between Her Majesty and the King of the French relative to the Fisheries on the Coasts of the British Islands and of France: And whereas the said Act was further continued by an Act passed in the last Session of Parliament: And whereas it is expedient that the said Act should be further continued; be it therefore enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority

Recited Act rity of the same, That the said recited Act, and all the Powers, further con-further con-tinued. Provisions, Matters, and Things therein contained, shall continue in force until the First Day of August One thousand eight hundred and forty-three.
