



# Metropolitan Police Act 1899

1899 CHAPTER 26 62 and 63 Vict

[<sup>F1</sup>1 **Amendment of law as to remuneration of commissioner, &c. of metropolitan police.**

- (1) There shall be paid to the commissioner of police of the metropolis and to the receiver of the metropolitan police district, out of money provided by Parliament, such salaries as the Secretary of State with the approval of the Treasury may appoint.
- (2) There shall be paid to the assistant commissioners of police of the metropolis such salaries as the Secretary of State may appoint, and those salaries shall be paid . . . <sup>F2</sup> out of the Metropolitan Police Fund, . . . <sup>F2</sup>.
- (3) . . . . . <sup>F3</sup>]
