

Inclosure Act 1845

1845 CHAPTER 118

XXIX Consent of the Lord of the Manor.

Provided always, and be it enacted, That when the Land to which such Application shall relate shall be the Waste of any Manor, or Land within any Manor to the Soil of which the Lord of such Manor shall be entitled in right of his Manor, then, unless there shall be more than One Person interested in such Manor, according to the Definition of this Act, the Commissioners shall not proceed to an Inclosure on such Application, or certify in their annual General Report the Expediency thereof, unless the Person interested in the Land subject to be inclosed as aforesaid in right of such Manor, or his Substitute under this Act, shall consent to such Inclosure ; and where there shall be more than One Person interested in such Manor the Commissioner shall not proceed to an Inclosure, or certify as aforesaid the Expediency thereof, in case such Persons, or the Majority of such Persons in respect of Interest, shall signify their Dissent within the Time limited by the Commissioners.
