

London Hackney Carriage Act 1831

1831 CHAPTER 22 1 and 2 Will 4

†Improperly standing with carriage, or feeding horses in the street; refusing to give way to or obstructing any other driver or depriving him of his fare; penalty 20s.

If any proprietor or driver of any hackney carriage . . . ^{F1} shall wrongfully, in a forcible or clandestine manner, take away the fare from any other such proprietor or driver who, in the judgment of any justice of the peace before whom any complaint of such offence shall be heard, shall appear to be fairly entitled to such fare; every such proprietor, driver, . . . ^{F2} so offending shall forfeit [^{F3}level 1 on the standard scale].
