Cap. 32.

An Act for vesting Parts of the Settled Estates of the Honourable Edward Mostyn Lloyd Mostyn of Mostyn in the County of Flint in Trustees, upon Trust to sell, mortgage, or exchange the same, and to lay out the Monies to arise therefrom in the Payment of Debts, Charges, and Mortgages upon or affecting the same, or other Estates settled to the same Uses, or in the Purchase of other Estates, to be settled to the same Uses; and for other Purposes.

[30th July 1842.]

THEREAS Sir Thomas Mostyn, late of Mostyn in the County of Flint, Baronet, in such Manner as by Law was T. Mostyn, then required for rendering valid Devises of Freehold July 1818. Estates, duly signed and published his last Will and Testament in Writing, bearing Date the Eighteenth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and eighteen, and thereby gave and devised all his Manors, Lands, and Hereditaments in the Counties of Merioneth and Caernarvon, or elsewhere, called the Corsygedol and Plas Hen-Estates, unto Sir Edward Pryce Lloyd of Pengwern in the said [Private.] County 10 *m*

Will of Sir Bart., 18th

County of Flint, Baronet, Richard Parry the younger, of Hereford Street in the County of Middlesex, Esquire, and Cynric Lloyd of Glodaeth in the County of Caernarvon, Esquire, their Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, for the Term of Five hundred Years from his Decease, without Impeachment of Waste, upon the Trusts herein-after mentioned; and the said Testator also gave and devised all and singular his Manors, Lands, and Tenements not therein-after by him otherwise expressly devised, of or to which he was seised in Fee Simple, or over which he had an absolute disposing Power, and which were not comprised in the said Term of Five hundred Years, and also all those which were comprised in the said Term, from and after the Determination and subject to the Trusts thereof, unto and to the Use of the Heirs of his own Body; and in default of such Issue to the Use of his Nephew Edward Mostyn Lloyd, eldest Son of the said Testator's Sister Dame Elizabeth Lloyd by the said Sir Edward Pryce Lloyd, and the Assigns of the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd, during his Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the said Sir Edward Pryce Lloyd, Richard Parry, and Cynric Lloyd, and their Heirs, during the Life of the said Testator's said Nephew, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of the First and every other Son of the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's Nephew Thomas Pryce Lloyd, Second and youngest Son of the said Sir Edward Pryce Lloyd and Dame Elizabeth his Wife, and his Assigns, during his Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the same Trustees and their Heirs during the natural Life of his the said Testator's said last-named Nephew, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of his First and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's Nephew Robert Williames Vaughan, only Child of the said Testator's Sister Dame Anna Maria Vaughan by Sir Robert, Williames Vaughan Baronet, and his Assigns, during his Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the same Trustees and their Heirs, during the Life of the said Testator's said Nephew Robert Williames Vaughan, in Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of his First and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's Sister Essex Mostyn, and her Assigns, during her Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the same Trustees and their Heirs during her Life, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of her First and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's Sister Charlotte Champneys, Wife of Thomas Swymmer Champneys of Orchardleigh in Somersetshire, Esquire, and her Assigns, during her Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the same Trustees and their Heirs during her Life, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of her First and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's said Sister Dame Elizabeth Lloyd, and her Assigns, during her Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the same Trustees and their

their Heirs during her Life, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of her Third and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's said Sister Dame Anna Maria Vaughan, and her Assigns, during her Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the same Trustees and their Heirs during her Life, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of her Second and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's Sister Catherine Mostyn, and her Assigns, during her Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the same Trustees and their Heirs during her Life, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of her First and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's Sister Mary Bridget Mostyn, and her Assigns, during her Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the same Trustees and their Heirs during her Life, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of her First and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's Niece Elizabeth Lloyd, eldest Daughter of the said Dame Elizabeth Lloyd, and her Assigns, during her Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the same Trustees and their Heirs during her Life, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders; with Remainder to the Use of her First and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the said Testator's Niece Essex Lloyd, youngest Daughter of the said Dame Elizabeth Lloyd, and her Assigns, during her Life, without Impeachment of Waste; with Remainder to the Use of the said Trustees and their Heirs during her Life, upon Trust to preserve contingent Remainders, with Remainder to the Use of her First and every other Son successively in Tail Male; with Remainder to the Use of the Testator's own right Heirs; and in case the said Testator's said Nephew Edward Mostyn Lloyd should become entitled in Possession to the said Testator's Estates thereby devised, the said Testator gave and bequeathed unto his Nephew the said Thomas Pryce Lloyd an Annuity or clear yearly Sum of Three thousand Pounds during his Life, to commence on his attaining the Age of Twenty-one Years, payable half-yearly, the first Payment thereof to be made at the End of Six Months after he should have attained Twenty-one Years, and a proportionate Part thereof to be paid down to the Time of his Death; and the said Testator thereby charged all his Real Estates generally in aid of his Personal Estate, and of his Estates called Corsygedol and Plas Hen, with the Payment of the said Annuity; and in case the said Testator's said Nephew Thomas Pryce Lloyd should come into Possession of the said Testator's said Estates, under the Limitation aforesaid, then the said Testator directed that his said Nephew Robert Williames Vaughan should be entitled to the said Annuity or yearly Rent-charge of Three thousand Pounds in the same Manner as the said Thomas Pryce Lloyd would have enjoyed the same; and the said Testator did thereby declare that the said Manors, Lands, and Hereditaments called the Corsygedol and Plas Hen Estates, therein-before limited to the said Sir Edward Pryce Lloyd, Richard Parry,

Parry, and Cynric Lloyd, their Executors, Administrators, and Assigns, for the Term of Five hundred Years, were so limited to them upon Trust by Sale or Mortgage of all or any Part of the Hereditaments comprised in the said Term, or by and out of the said Rents, Issues, and Profits thereof, to levy and raise all such Sum and Sums of Money as should be sufficient to discharge all his Debts, Funeral Expences, Legacies, and Annuities, and in aid of and as an auxiliary Fund to his Personal Estate not specifically bequeathed; and the said Testator did thereby give and bequeath a Legacy of Ten thousand Pounds to each of his said Three unmarried Sisters when and as they should respectively intermarry after his Decease, and in the meantime he directed that Interest should be paid to them thereon after the Rate of Five Pounds per Centum per Annum, to commence from his Death; but in case any or either of his said Sisters should die without having been married, then he directed that the Principal of the Legacy or Legacies of her or them so dying should not be raised; and in case any or either of his said unmarried Sisters should become Tenant for Life in Possession of the Estates. limited by the Will of the said Testator's late Father Sir Roger Mostyn Baronet, deceased, before the Legacy of Ten thousand Pounds should have been paid, then that the same or any Part thereof should not be raised, nor should Interest be paid thereon; and the said Testator gave to the said Sir Edward Pryce Lloyd the Sum of Ten thousand Pounds, and to the Reverend Gryffydd Lloyd of Christleton in the County of Chester the Sum of Ten thousand Pounds, and to the said Richard Parry a like Sum of Ten thousand Pounds, and to the said Cynric Lloyd the Sum of Fifteen thousand Pounds, and to Elizabeth Mostyn, therein described, the Sum of Twenty thousand Pounds, to be vested in and paid to her when she should attain the Age of Twenty-one Years, or marry; and the said Testator by his said Will declared, that it should be lawful for his said Nephew Edward Mostyn Lloyd, and every other Male Tenant for Life entitled in Possession to his said Manors, Lands, and Hereditaments before devised, by Deed or Writing to appoint a yearly Rent-charge to any Woman with whom he might intermarry, by way of Jointure, out of his said Manors, Lands, and Hereditaments, but so as that no more than an annual Sum of Two thousand Pounds in the whole should be so charged at one Time, and also in like Manner to charge his Manors, Lands, and Hereditaments with any Sum of Money for Portions for younger Children, but so as that no more than the Sum of Twenty thousand Pounds in the whole should be charged thereon for the Purposes last mentioned; and the said Testator did by his said Will empower the respective Tenants for Life, and the Guardian or Guardians of any Tenant for Life or in Tail, during his or her Minority, to grant Leases of the Lands and Hereditaments thereby devised, except the Mansion House and Grounds of Mostyn and Gloddaeth, for the Term of Twenty-one Years, at the best and most improved Rent, without taking any Fine, and also of any Mines, Quarries, and Collieries, for such Term of Years, and under such Rents, Reservations, and Agreements, as to such Tenant for Life, or Guardian or Guardians, should seem reasonable and proper, and to grant any Building or Repairing Leases for any Term. of Years not exceeding Ninety-nine Years in Possession, at the best yearly

yearly Rent, without taking any Fine; and the said Testator declared, that his said Manors, Lands, and Hereditaments therein-before by him devised and limited were so devised and limited upon the express Condition that the several Persons in the Limitations thereinbefore contained, when in the actual Possession or entitled to the Rents and Profits of the said Hereditaments and Premises by virtue of that his Will, should take upon themselves and use on all Occasions as the principal Surname the Name of Mostyn, and in case any of the Persons so entitled should neglect or refuse to comply with that Condition, then the Estate thereby limited to any such Person should be forfeited, and the Person next in Remainder should immediately take; and the said Testator gave to Stephen Goodhall an Annuity of Seventy Pounds during his Life, to Hannah Strickland an Annuity of Eighty Pounds during her Life, to Thomas Jones an Annuity of Fifty Pounds during his Life, and to Edward Carter an Annuity of Fifty Pounds during his Life; and the said Testator appointed the said Sir Edward Pryce Lloyd, Richard Parry, and Cynric Lloyd, Executors of his said Will: And whereas the said Testator Sir Thomas Mostyn, in such Manner as by Law was then required for rendering valid Devises of Freehold Estates, duly re-signed and re-published his said Will on the Second Day of June One thousand eight hundred and twenty-six, but did not in any way alter or revoke the Devises and Bequests in his said Will contained: And whereas the said Essex Mostyn departed this Life on or about the Second Day of June One thousand eight hundred and twenty-nine, in the Lifetime of the said Testator, without having been married, and the said Cynric Lloyd departed this Life on the Twenty-eighth Day of December One thousand eight hundred and twenty-two, in the Lifetime of the said Testator: And whereas the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd, on or about the Twentieth Day of June One thousand eight hundred and twenty-seven, intermarried with the Right Honourable Lady Harriet Margaret Scott: And whereas the said Testator Sir Thomas Mostyn departed this Life on or about the Seventeenth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, without having revoked or altered his said Will, or any of the Devises or Bequests therein contained, without having been married, and without Issue, leaving Dame Charlotte Margaret Champneys, in the said Will called Charlotte Champneys, the said Dame Elizabeth Lloyd, the said Dame Anna Maria Vaughan, the said Catherine Mostyn, and the said Mary Bridget Mostyn, his Five Sisters and Co-heiresses at Law, and also the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd, and the said Sir Edward Pryce Lloyd and Richard Parry, him surviving: And whereas the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd, immediately upon the Death of the said Testator, took possession of the Manors, Lands, and Hereditaments devised to him by the said Will, and by virtue of the Licence of His late Majesty King William the Fourth, in the Month of May One thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, assumed the Surname of Mostyn in addition to his own Family Name: And whereas the said Sir Edward Pryce Lloyd, by Letters Patent bearing Date the Eighth Day of September One thousand eight hundred and thirty-one, was created Baron Mostyn of Mostyn in the County of Flint: And whereas the said Richard Parry departed this Life on or about the Twenty-fifth Day of April One thousand eight hundred and thirty-[Private.] four: 10 n

four: And whereas the said Catherine Mostyn departed this Life, without having been married, on the Twenty-first Day of August One thousand eight hundred and forty-one, intestate as to her Real Estate: And whereas the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd Mostyn has Issue Male by his said Wife Five Sons only; namely, Thomas Edward Mostyn Lloyd Mostyn, Roger Mostyn, Savage Mostyn, Evan Lloyd Vaughan Mostyn, and Hugh Wynne Mostyn, who are all Infants, and the eldest of whom is only of the Age of Twelve Years: And whereas the Honourable Thomas Pryce Lloyd, in the said Will called Thomas Pryce Lloyd, the said Robert Williams Vaughan, the said Dame Charlotte Margaret Champneys, the Widow of Sir Thomas Swymmer Champneys, now the said Right Honourable Edward Pryce Lord Mostyn and Elizabeth Lady Mostyn, in right of the said Elizabeth Lady Mostyn, the said Sir Robert Williames Vaughan Baronet and Dame Anna Maria Vaughan his Wife, in right of the said Anna Maria Vaughan, the said Mary Bridget Mostyn, the Honourable Elizabeth Lloyd, in the said Will called Elizabeth Lloyd, and the Honourable Essex Lloyd, in the said Will called EssexLloyd, are the only Persons now living who under the Limitations in the said Will of the said Testator are respectively entitled to the said Estates devised by the said Will in Remainder after Failure of the Limitations to the Use of the First and every other Son of the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd Mostyn successively in Tail Male, and the said Dame Charlotte Margaret Champneys, Elizabeth Lady Mostyn, Dame Anna Maria Vaughan, and Mary Bridget Mostyn, are the only surviving Co-heiresses at Law of the said Testator: And whereas the said Testator was at the Time of his Death indebted to a large Amount in Mortgage, Bond, Specialty, and Simple Contract Debts, and the said Corsygedol and Plas Hen Estates, charged by the said Testator's Will with the Payment of his said Debts, Expences, Legacies, and Annuities, were mortgaged to a large Amount in the Testator's Lifetime, and several other Estates of the said Testator devised by his said Will were subject to Mortgage Debts of the said Testator to a large Amount, and the said Edward Pryce Lord Mostyn hath out of his own Monies paid several Debts of the said Testator, and several Expences attending the carrying into execution the Trusts of his said Will, which have not been repaid, and the Personal Estate of the said Testator was wholly insufficient to pay his Mortgage, Bond, Specialty, and Simple Contract Debts, and the said Corsygedol and Plas Hen Estates devised for the Term of Five hundred Years, upon Trust to be sold or mortgaged in aid of his Personal Estate, if further mortgaged or sold for the Term of Five hundred Years, would not raise a sufficient Sum to pay the said Mortgage, Bond, Specialty, and Simple Contract Debts, and the Fee Simple of the said Estates comprised in the said Term of Five hundred Years, and also the other Estates devised and settled by the said Will of the said Testator, are subject to the Payment of his said Mortgage, Bond, and Specialty Debts: And whereas it would be greatly prejudicial to the said EdwardMostyn Lloyd Mostyn and his infant Sons, and the other Persons entitled in Remainder under the said Will, if the said Corsygedol and Plas Hen Estates should be sold for the Term of Five hundred Years only; and it is desirable, and would be for the Benefit of the said EdwardMostyn Lloyd Mostyn and his infant Sons, and the Persons entitled

in Remainder under the said Will, that the Bulk of the said Corsygedol and Plas Hen Estates should not be sold if the Sale thereof can be avoided, and that Provision should be made for Payment of the said Debts, Expences, Legacies, and Annuities by the said Will charged upon the said Term of Five hundred Years created in the said Corysgedol and Plas Hen Estates, so far and to such Extent only as the said Debts, Expences, Legacies, and Annuities so charged upon the said Term ought to be paid according to the Trusts of the said Will, and also that Provision should be made for Payment of the said Mortgage, Bond, and Specialty Debts of the said Testator, and that such Provision should be made by the Sale or Mortgage of detached Parts of the said Corsygedol and Plus Hen Estates, and of detached Parts of other unconnected and distant Estates devised by the said Will, and also of other Estates devised by the said Will which are detached and lying at a Distance from the principal Mansion House and Demesne Lands of Mostyn (being the Estates comprised in the First Schedule to this Act), and, if the Monies to arise from such Sales shall not be sufficient for the Purposes aforesaid, that then such Provision should be made by the Sale or Mortgage of the Mansion Houses and Bulks of the said Corsygedol and Plas Hen Estates (being the Estates comprised in the Second Schedule to this Act), or so much thereof as shall be necessary for the Purposes aforesaid, and that the Monies which shall arise from such Sales shall be applied, under the Direction of the Court of Chancery, in paying the said Debts, Expences, Legacies, and Annuities so charged upon the said Term, so far and to such Extent as the same ought to be paid as aforesaid, and in paying the said Mortgage, Bond, and Specialty Debts of the said Testator; and it is also desirable, and would be for the Benefit of the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd Mostyn and his infant Sons, and the other Persons entitled in Remainder under the said Will, that other Estates devised by the said Testator, which are detached from or inconveniently held with the Mansion and Demesne of Mostyn, or which may be conveniently exchanged for other Lands and Hereditaments, (being the Estates comprised in the Third Schedule to this Act,) should be sold or exchanged for other Lands and Hereditaments, and also that the Lands and Hereditaments which shall be purchased or taken in exchange, or certain Parts thereof, should be again sold or exchanged in like Manner as the Estates devised by the said Testator, in case it shall be expedient to sell or exchange the same or any Part thereof, and that the Monies to arise from such Sales and Exchanges should, under the Direction of the Court of Chancery, either be laid out in paying and discharging the said Mortgage, Bond, and Specialty Debts of the said Testator, or should be laid out and invested in the Purchase of other Freehold Lands and Hereditaments, and that the Lands and Hereditaments purchased or taken in exchange should be conveyed and settled to the same Uses, upon the same Trusts, and with, under, and subject to the same Powers and Provisoes, as in and by the said recited Will of the said Testator are expressed and declared of and concerning the Freehold Lands and Hereditaments thereby devised, or such and so many of the same Uses, Trusts, Powers, and Provisoes as shall be then subsisting and capable of taking effect; but by reason of the Limitations in the said Will of the

Estates described in the Schedules, and devised by the Will, vested in Trustees.

the said Testator Sir Thomas Mostyn, and the Infancy of all the Sons of the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd Mostyn, and there being no Powers of Sale and Exchange or other Provisions for such Purposes in the said Will, the desirable Purposes aforesaid cannot be effected without the Aid and Authority of Parliament: Therefore Your Majesty's most dutiful and loyal Subject, the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd Mostyn, on behalf of himself and his said infant Children, dothmost humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted; and be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the Advice and Consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the Authority of the same, That all and singular the Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and other Hereditaments mentioned or described in the Schedules to this Act annexed, together with all and singular the Rights, Members, and Appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining, and the Reversion and Reversions, Remainder and Remainders, yearly and other Rents, Issues, and Profits of the same Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and other Hereditaments, shall, from and after the passing of this Act, be freed and discharged and be absolutely acquitted and exonerated of and from all and every the Uses, Trusts, Estates, Limitations, Conditions, Powers, Provisoes, and Declarations which in and by the said recited Will of the said Sir Thomas Mostyn were limited, created, declared, or contained of and concerning the same, and, so freed, discharged, acquitted, and exonerated, shall, but subject nevertheless to the several Mortgage Debts, Charges, and Incumbrances, and the Estates, Terms, and Interests created for securing the same, which now affect the said Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and other Hereditaments, or any of them, so far as the said Manors, Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and other Hereditaments, or any of them, are respectively affected thereby, be and are hereby vested in the Honourable Thomas Pryce Lloyd of Pengwern in the County of Flint, Cynric Lloyd of Pontriffith Hall in the County of Flint, Esquire, herein after called Cynric Lloyd the younger, and John Hancock Hall of the Middle Temple, Esquire, their Heirs and Assigns for ever, but nevertheless upon the Trusts and for the Intents and Purposes herein-after expressed and declared concerning the same.

Trust for Sale of Estates in First Schedule.

II. And be it enacted, That the said Thomas Pryce Lloyd, Cynric Lloyd the younger, and John Hancock Hall shall stand seised of such of the said Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments hereby vested in them as are comprised in the First Schedule hereto, and their Appurtenances, upon Trust that they the said Thomas Pryce Lloyd, Cynric Lloyd the younger, and John Hancock Hall, or the Survivors or Survivor of them, or the Heirs of such Survivor, or their or his Assigns, as soon as conveniently may be, with the Approbation of the said Edward Mostyn Lloyd Mostyn during his Life, to be signified by Writing under his Hand and Seal, and after his Death with the Approbation of the Person who for the Time being shall be entitled to the Rents and Profits of the Lands and Hereditaments devised and settled by the said Will of the said Sir Thomus Mostyn, or if such Person shall be an Infant, then with the Approbation of the Guardian or Guardians of such Infant, to be signified

signified in like Manner, do and shall either convey by way of Mortgage all or any of the said Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments comprised in the said First Schedule hereto, or any Parts thereof, and the Inheritance thereof in Fee Simple, for any Sum or Sums of Money which they or he shall think it right or expedient to raise, or do and shall sell or absolutely dispose of all' or any of the said Messuages, Lands, Tenements, and Hereditaments comprised in the said First Schedule hereto, and the Inheritance thereof in Fee Simple, either together or in Parcels, and either by public Auction or by private Contract, at the best Price or Prices in Money that can be reasonably obtained, with Liberty to make such Conditions of Sale as they or he shall think fit, and to rescind or vary any Contract for Sale, and to buy in any Hereditaments which may be offered for Sale at any Auction, and to resell the same, either by Auction or private Contract, without being answerable for any Loss which may happen by such Re-sale, and upon Payment into the Bank in manner herein-after mentioned of the Purchase Monies for which the said Hereditaments and Premises comprised in the said First Schedule, or any Part thereof, shall be sold, and which shall not be applied in discharge of any Money secured by way of Mortgage on the Premises which shall have been sold or mortgaged, do and shall convey and assure the same Hereditaments and Premises unto and to the Use of the Purchaser or Purchasers thereof, and his, her, and their Heirs and Assigns, or as he, she, or they shall direct or appoint.

Provided always, and be it further enacted, That no Mortgage No Interest shall be made under the Powers of this Act of the Messuages, Lands, on any Mort-Tenements, and Hereditaments comprised in the said First Schedule, gage of Lands in except there shall be contained in every such Mortgage a Proviso First Schethat in case any Interest which shall be due in respect of such Mort-dule in gage shall be in arrear beyond the Space of Twelve Months, such arrear be-Arrear of Interest beyond such Period of Twelve Months shall not yound 12 be a Charge upon the Hereditaments which shall be mortgaged as be a Charge. aforesaid.

And be it further enacted, That this Act shall be printed by the several Printers to the Queen's most Excellent Majesty duly authorized to print the Statutes of the United Kingdom, and a Copy thereof so printed by any of them shall be admitted as Evidence thereof by all Judges, Justices, and others whomsoever.
