METROPOLITAN AND CITY POLICE DISTRICTS**CABS****The London Cab Order, 1962**

Made - - - - 8th February, 1962
Coming into Operation 1st March, 1962

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869(a), and the London Cab and Stage Carriage Act, 1907(b), I hereby order as follows:—

1. In the London Cab Order, 1934(c), as amended by the London Cab Order, 1955(d)—

(a) in sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 19 (which relates to the revocation or suspension of a cab licence and requires the licensee within five days after notice thereof has been delivered to him personally or sent to him by registered post to send or deliver the licence to the Public Carriage Examiner); and

(b) in sub-paragraph (2) of paragraph 30 (which relates to the revocation or suspension of a cab-driver's licence and requires the licensee within five days after notice thereof has been delivered to him personally or sent to him by registered post to send or deliver the licence to the Assistant Commissioner of Police appointed to grant licences under sections six and eight of the Metropolitan Public Carriage Act, 1869),

after the words "by registered post" there shall be inserted the words "or by the recorded delivery service".

2. This Order may be cited as the London Cab Order, 1962, and shall come into operation on 1st March, 1962.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order, but is intended to indicate its general purport.)

The London Cab Order, 1934, requires that when notice of the revocation or suspension of a cab licence or a cab driver's licence is delivered personally or sent by registered post to the licensee, the licensee should within five days send the licence for cancellation, or retention during the period of suspension. Under the amendment made by this Order the licence, if not delivered personally to the licensee, may be sent to him either by registered post or by the recorded delivery service.
