The House to House Collections Regulations 1963

Made - - - - -	27th March 1963
Laid before Parliament	3rd April 1963
Coming into Operation	10th April 1963

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by section 4 of the House to House Collections Act 1939(a), I hereby make the following Regulations:—

1. For Regulation 8 of the House to House Collections Regulations 1947(b) (which provides that no person in the metropolitan police district or the City of London under the age of 18 years, or elsewhere under the age of 16 years, shall act or be authorised to act as a collector of money) there shall be substituted the following Regulation, that is to say:—

“8. No person under the age of 16 years shall act or be authorised to act as a collector of money.”

2. These Regulations may be cited as the House to House Collections Regulations 1963 and shall come into operation on 10th April 1963.

 EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Regulations, but is intended to indicate their general purport.)

Under Regulation 8 of the House to House Collections Regulations 1947 the minimum permissible age for persons acting as collectors from house to house is 18 years in the metropolitan police district and the City of London, and 16 years elsewhere in England and Wales. Under the amendment effected by these Regulations the minimum age will be 16 years throughout England and Wales.
