**1964 No. 1755**

**The Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction (Discipline) Rules 1964**

*Fixing day of trial*

**14.**—(1) As soon as possible after he has received a copy of the articles, the judge of the consistory court shall fix a time and place for the trial, and the time shall not be less than 28 days after the lodging of the articles<sup>(1)</sup>.

(2) Either the promoter or the accused may apply to the registrar for a postponement of the time fixed for the trial and, if the application is granted, the trial shall be at such later time as the judge may fix<sup>(2)</sup>.

(3) The judge may at any time of his own motion postpone the time fixed for the trial.
