The Commonwealth Countries and Republic of Ireland (Immunities) (Amendment) Order 1966

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 11th day of November 1966

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 1(2) of the Diplomatic Immunities (Commonwealth Countries and Republic of Ireland) Act 1952(a) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

- 1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Commonwealth Countries and Republic of Ireland (Immunities) (Amendment) Order 1966.
 - (2) This Order shall come into operation on 18th November 1966.
- (3) The Interpretation Act 1889(b), shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2. In Part I of the Schedule to the Commonwealth Countries and Republic of Ireland (Immunities) Order 1961(c), after the sub-heading "Pakistan", there is hereby inserted the entry "The Pakistan Government Representative, Leeds.".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order.)

The purpose of this Order is to amend the Commonwealth Countries and Republic of Ireland (Immunities) Order 1961 by adding to Part I of the Schedule the description of another Office of the Government of Pakistan. It confers on persons holding that Office the like immunity from suit and legal process and the like inviolability of official archives as are accorded to consular officers of a foreign sovereign Power, and restricts powers of entry into the official premises of such persons.
