TELEGRAPHS

The Telephone (Channel Islands) Amendment (No. 3) Regulations 1966

Made - - - - 15th July 1966
Laid before Parliament 28th July 1966
Coming into Operation 1st January 1967

I, The Right Honourable Edward Watson Short, M.P., Her Majesty's Postmaster General, by virtue of the powers vested in me by section 1 of the Telephone Act 1951(a), as extended to the Channel Islands by the Telephone (Channel Islands) Order 1952(b) and as amended by sections 16 and 28 of the Post Office Act 1961(c), and of every other power enabling me in this behalf, do hereby make the following regulations:

Interpretation

- 1.—(1) These regulations shall be read as one with the Telephone (Channel Islands) Regulations 1963(d) as amended(e).
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(f) applies for the interpretation of these regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

Personal calls

2. In regulation 9(5), for "9d." there shall be substituted "1s.".

Transferred charge calls—British Islands

3. In paragraphs (2) and (4) of regulation 10 (which provide for a transfer fee on certain transferred charge calls to call offices), for "3d." in each place where it occurs there shall be substituted "6d.".

Citation and Commencement

4. These regulations may be cited as "The Telephone (Channel Islands) Amendment (No. 3) Regulations 1966", and shall come into operation on the 1st January 1967.

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the regulations.)

These regulations amend the Telephone (Channel Islands) Regulations 1963. Their effect is to increase by 3d. personal call charges to the mainland during cheap rate periods; and to increase by 3d. the transferred charge fee where a transferred charge call is made to a coin box telephone or a call office on the mainland. These amendments follow similar amendments which are being made to the Telephone Regulations 1965.
