# The Motor Vehicles (Variation of Speed Limit) (Amendment) Regulations 1966

Made	19th July 1966
Laid before Parliament	21st July 1966
Coming into Operation	14th August 1966

The Minister of Transport, in exercise of her powers under section 24(2) of the Road Traffic Act 1960(a) and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with representative organisations in accordance with the provisions of section 260(2) of that Act, hereby makes the following Regulations:—

- 1.—(1) These Regulations shall come into operation on the 10th day following the day they are approved by Parliament and may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Variation of Speed Limit) (Amendment) Regulations 1966.
- (2) The Interpretation Act 1889(b) shall apply for the interpretation of these Regulations as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 2. The Motor Vehicles (Variation of Speed Limit) Regulations 1962(c) shall have effect as if:—
  - (a) for paragraph 1 of the Schedule there were substituted the following paragraph:—
    - "1. Passenger vehicles, that is to say, vehicles constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects, and dual purpose vehicles:—

#### **EXPLANATORY NOTE**

(This Note is not part of the Regulations.)

Schedule 1 to the Road Traffic Act 1960, as varied by the Motor Vehicles (Variation of Speed Limit) Regulations 1962, prescribes speed limits, subject to conditions, for specified classes and descriptions of vehicles.

These Regulations have the effect of varying the provisions of the said Schedule 1 and make the following changes:—

- 1. The speed limit for public service vehicles is increased from 40 m.p.h. to 50 m.p.h. (Regulation 2(a));
- 2. The speed limit for vehicles drawing a glider trailer, subject to certain conditions, is increased from 30 m.p.h. to 40 m.p.h. (Regulation 2(a) and (b));
- 3. The speed limit for a public service vehicle drawing a trailer is increased from 30 m.p.h. to 40 m.p.h. (Regulation 2(a)).
