## SOCIAL SECURITY

**The National Insurance (Mariners) Amendment (No. 2)  
Regulations 1967**

<i>Made</i> - - - -	25th October 1967
<i>Laid before Parliament</i>	27th October 1967
<i>Coming into Operation</i>	30th October 1967

The Minister of Social Security, in conjunction with the Treasury, in exercise of powers conferred by section 100 of the National Insurance Act 1965(a) and of all other powers enabling her in that behalf, hereby makes, in consequence of the National Insurance Act 1967(b), the following regulations:—

*Citation, interpretation and commencement*

1. These Regulations, which may be cited as the National Insurance (Mariners) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations 1967, shall be read as one with the National Insurance (Mariners) Regulations 1967(c) as amended(d) (hereinafter referred to as “the principal regulations”) and shall come into operation on 30th October 1967.

*Amendment of regulation 5 of the principal regulations*

2. The amounts by which the weekly rates of employer’s contributions payable in respect of mariners employed as masters or members of the crews of any foreign-going ships are reduced, shall be increased, and accordingly in regulation 5(1) of the principal regulations there shall be substituted—

- (a) in sub-paragraph (a) (persons over the age of 18) for the words “one shilling and a penny” the words “one shilling and five pence”; and
- (b) in sub-paragraph (b) (persons under the age of 18) for the words “sevenpence-halfpenny” the words “ninepence-halfpenny”.

**EXPLANATORY NOTE**

*(This Note is not part of the Regulations)*

These Regulations are made in consequence of the National Insurance Act 1967 and accordingly, by virtue of Schedule 7 paragraph 7, no reference of them has been made to the National Insurance Advisory Committee nor has a draft of the Regulations been laid before Parliament for approval by resolution of each House.

The National Insurance Act 1967 increased the rates of flat-rate national insurance contributions. These Regulations make consequential amendments to certain provisions of the National Insurance (Mariners) Regulations 1967 relating to employers' contributions in respect of mariners employed on foreign-going ships.
