**1967 No. 1944****CIVIL DEFENCE****The Civil Defence (Public Protection) (Warnings) (Revocation) Regulations 1967***Laid before Parliament in draft**Made - - - 20th December 1967**Coming into Operation 1st January 1968*

In exercise of the powers conferred on me by section 2 of the Civil Defence Act 1948(a), I hereby make the following Regulations, a draft of which has been laid before Parliament and approved by resolution of each House of Parliament:-

1. The Civil Defence (Public Protection) (Warnings) Regulations 1951(b) (which make it the function of the police authority in the metropolitan police district and of certain local authorities elsewhere to provide a system of warning the public by sirens of hostile attack) are hereby revoked.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the Civil Defence (Public Protection) (Warnings) (Revocation) Regulations 1967 and shall come into operation on 1st January 1968.
